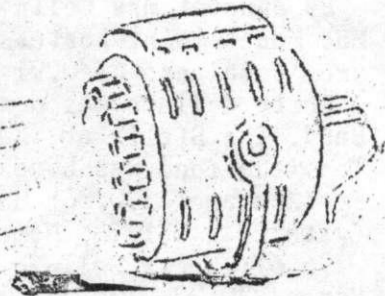

So far as the election locally is concerned, we congratulate the new MLA and condole with the defeated Candidates; but when one looks at the results of the election as a whole, one rather wonders what is going to happen next. A lot of chaps seem to take the point of view that the electorate is completely undecided, but your editor reads the results as meaning that people really do not want a strong Government today. They do not want to be governed by Orders in Council, by the Civil Service, or by groups of men, no matter how able or sincere, who think they know best. They want to do the governing themselves; they want to have a Member who will find out what they want and represent them properly in the House; and above all, they want to impress on the Government that it rules by the will of the people and not by any Divine Right and that it can be thrown out on its ear and replaced by another one any time it misbehaves! And probably the best way to impress this on a Government is to have the extraordinary situation we find in the House today.

We don't think there will be another Provincial election soon, but if there is we feel it will lead to the same result!
