As shown in the chart above, the Gulf Islands went overwhelmingly for the incumbent, the Social Credit candidate, the Hon. Earle C. Westwood. However, at press time, Mr. Westwood is leading Colin Cameron, the C.C.F. candidate, by a slim margin of 112 votes, and the outcome is still in doubt until the absentee ballots are counted. DRIFTWOOD was informed that the estimated number of absentee ballots is around 500 and that the final count might not be known for two weeks. Mr. Cameron has not conceded the election and has intimated that he will demand a re-count after the absentee ballots are opened. The total vote for Nanaimo and the Islands as of now is: Westwood 4475; Cameron 4363; Heath 982; Strongitharm 584; and Mortenson 72.

(CONT'D FROM P. 1) ELECTION....the DRIFTWOOD phone was kept busy by many unhappy people who claimed that their voting rights were denied to them. Several claimed that the voter's list was incorrect in leaving their names off, that some dead people were listed, that people no longer residents were listed, and that some people were listed twice. Other irregularities were reported. Among these, was the unfortunate comedy of errors, mostly the fault of Nanaimo, that prevented the hospital patients from voting. About 30 people, in the Lady Minto Hospital and the two rest homes on Salt Spring, did not get to vote.

(CONT'D FROM P. 1) VANDALISM....doing everything possible to stamp out this sort of destruction. Many acts of destruction, here-to-fore unreported, have been reported. They range from robbing people's gardens to setting up nails in such a manner in a driveway, that a motorist got all four tires punctured; to the removal and stealing of the H. M. S. Ganges name plate from the I. O. D. E. bench at the cenotaph. This name plate, from the ship, is of little monetary value, but it can not be replaced.

A fire at Fulford brought out the Fire engines from local and Ganges districts last week, when a bailer caught fire during thrashing operations in G. A. Moulton's grain field in Burgoyne Valley. The grain had been thrashed out and the bailer was in action bailing the straw, when a spark of unknown origin started a blaze in the machine and in a matter of seconds, the fire had caught the dry straw and surrounded the bailer and tractor to which it was attached. The call to the Fulford fire brigade went out and while this was being done, the owner of the tractor, Don Reynolds, got busy. He got the neighbours present to

douse him thoroughly with water and he ran through the fire and drove his tractor out of the heart of the blaze, where it was somewhat easier to control - the bailer was still attached and burning fiercely. The Fulford fire truck arrived, driven by Fred Hollings, with Teddy Akerman, one of the Fire crew, and other men present, they manned the fire hose.
