HOSPITAL MEETINGS THIS WEEK THROUGH ISLANDS

Annual General Meeting of the Lady Minto Gulf Islands Hospital is being held this week. The second annual meeting of the Gulf Islands Intermediate and Personal Care Society is also being held, following the annual meeting of the hospital.

Meeting was held at Mayne and Galiano Islands on Wednesday and on Thursday will bring the same meeting to Pender and Saturna Islands. On Salt Spring Island the meeting is to take place on Friday evening at Mahon Hall.

Five members are to be elected to the hospital board of management; three from Salt Spring Island, one from Galiano and one from Saturna and Samuel Islands.

Retiring members on Salt Spring are P.D. Lee, W.G. Henderson and Mrs. W.J. Stepaniuk. Both Mr. Henderson and Mrs. Stepaniuk are eligible for re-election while Mr. Lee is not, having served three consecutive three-year terms. The terms of Mrs. M. Whillans, of Galiano Island, and Mrs. J. Campbell, of Saturna, have also expired. They are both eligible for re-election.

Three members are to be elected to the board of trustees of the Gulf Islands Intermediate and Personal Care Society, two from Salt Spring and one from

P.D. Lee, Mrs. W. Stepaniuk and Mrs. M. Whillans have all served their one-year term as trustees. This year, three members will be elected to serve three-year terms.

Building permits still trailing 1976 as first totals are listed

A total of 20 building permits was issued in the Gulf Islands during the month of April. The figure is the same as that for March and is down by six from last year.

On Salt Spring Island, ten permits for single family dwellings and one for a duplex were issued, at a value of \$468,409. In April, 1976, 19 permits were issued at a value of \$704,968.

On Pender Island there were two permits issued, value was \$81,000; Mayne Island, three permits, \$96,059; and Piers Island, one permit, \$17,000. Biggest increase was on Galiano Island where three permits were issued at a value of \$214,525. All of the above were for single family dwellings. No permits were issued for Saturna Island.


In April, 1976, there were five permits issued on Pender Island at a value of \$196,066; Mayne, two permits at \$42,700. There were no building permits issued on Galiano and Saturna Islands during that month.

Figures for January to April, 1977, are Salt Spring, 36 permits at \$1,409,244; Pender, 19 permits at \$521,069; Galiano, seven permits at \$352,745; Mayne, nine permits at \$279,261; Saturna, one permit at \$46,480; and Piers Island, one permit at

For the first four months of 1976, 66 permits were issued on Salt Spring Island, at a value of \$2,282,197; on Pender, 21 permits at \$626,733; Galiano, five permits at \$388,884; Mayne, 14 permits at \$389,074; and Saturna, one permit valued at \$18,950.

The lens that comes with the camera will probably handle most of your average subjects. It

needs a lenshood.

Collapsible lenshoods are available for less than \$3 and improve image contrast and color saturation by minimizing the effects of off-angle light. LENSHOOD

Buy a lenshood when you buy the camera. Keep it on the camera at all times, indoors or outdoors, when your camera is at work.

A polarizing filter should come next on your shopping list. The polarizer dramatically improves outdoor color shots by darkening the sky and reducing glare and reflections. These degrade the colour and detail in your pictures. Cost is usually under \$15.

A tripod and a cable release come next on the list. They are a must for night photography. available light indoors and whenever long exposures are

Now that you have your tripod, you are ready for your zoom lens. A zoom with a range of approximately 85-210mm is ideal for many situations, ranging from portraits to nature studies and distant scenics, Buy a good quality zoom. Some of the cheaper zooms can be disappointing, if not completely disas-

.... Wide-angle, tele or zoom?

A wide-angle lens enables you to work in close quarters. The 28mm wide-angle covers twice the width of your normal lens and gets top priority on most lists, with the 35mm wideangle a close second.

If nature photography is your prime interest, a mirror-optic in the 500mm, 800mm or 1200mm brings you closer to your subject. With the 1200mm lens you can see the muscle structure of an eagle's eye at 30 feet. It will also make a sizeable dint in your camera budget, averaging out at \$1 per mm. Don't forget camera

Weird effects? Try a fisheye. Close-ups? A set of No. 1, 2 and 3 close-up adapters will fit in front of your regular lens and bring you in close for copying and photographing flowers.

An extension bellows or a set of extension tubes brings you even closer, for 1-to-1 or samesize images. Great for the science fair series and similar projects!

The close-up camera accessories are relatively inexpensive and open up a broad new



For the Girls the rewards may be even greater as they have been invited to participate in an exchange trip with a girls team from Washington State in August.







Second teacher in sight?

Alternate Class and future considered by Board

Alternate class is accomplishing everything that it was hoped to achieve, trustees of Gulf Islands School Board were told last week.

On Thursday afternoon a delegation of parents of students in the alternate class outlined their problems and asked the board for a second teacher for the special group.

Marg Simons introduced the subject with the assurance that the alternate class is "a very pleasant place to be"

Enrolment is 22 and there is a waiting list which could augment that figure to about 32, she told trustees

"It is a large number for only one teacher," she noted, "cross-ing grades and trying to accomplish all we want to do.

She tried to project into the

'Are we going to be a very selective group and be very choosy?" she asked, "but how about space? Not now, but in the future. What about space in the future?"

Chairman Charles Baltzer reminded the delegates that the alternate class is a part of the elementary school and is inte-grated with the population of the

elementary school. ALL THE SCHOOLS

The board must look at the staffing needs of the elementary schools throughout the islands, commented Superintendent Bob Huestis.

"It's all one package."

In a quick review of the class, it was suggested that the application of grades does not apply to a class which avoids grading and in which the students all join together, irrespective of age differences.

The classroom population is preponderantly young and the top level in English is better than grade 12, while the top level in math is probably between nine and 10.

These remarks were exchanged in an informal discuss-

In reply to a question from the chairman, Principal Reid Collins said that about 17 families are involved in the class of 22 students.

TWO OTHERS

Two other special classes are under consideration, reported Ann Foerster. The board is investigating a special class for gifted children and another as a remedial program.

'We must consider the best

we can for every child and his needs," she told the meeting. She also noted that a new principal has been hired for the elementary school.

He will be extremely helpful, she suggested.

Ralph Miller introduced himself as a professional psychologist and told the board he was impressed with the class.

"I am impressed with the manner in which students relate to each other," he commented.

One parent referred to the possibility of a class for gifted children in which the ratio might be one teacher to 15 students.

Each special class is sized according to the need, replied the superintendent.

"If a class needs a limit of 15 students, we do that.'

NO CLASS! NO SCHOOL!

Another parent expressed the view that if the alternate class is available, her children will attend, but if the class is not available, they will not go to school at all.

Basic allocation of teachers approved by the ministry of education is 30 students per teacher, observed Chairman Baltzer, but in special circumstances they will ease that stand to 20 students per teacher.

Mary Williamson observed that the present setting in the suite of the Mahon Hall makes the alternate class more like a family. This aspect is emphasized by the variation in ages, she

When Chairman Baltzer asked the principal of his reaction to moving into the elementary school, should space become available, Collins wanted to consider the question before offering a firm reply.

LESS STRUCTURED

The alternate class provides for a less structured instruction than is normal and it encourages a student to continue at his own pace rather than following a

The class relies considerably on the resource centre of the school, he told trustees, particu-

larly the school library. Social Worker Nick Gilbert concluded the discussion with the observation that the alternate class is invaluable to him in his work when a child has failed to adapt to the conventional

The request was referred to the education committees.


