

Change in Islands service sought by West Coast Air

Plans of West Coast Air to initiate a downtown Victoria to downtown Vancouver air service will not prejudice island air services, according to the company's general manager Russ Minaker.

The service to the islands will be maintained with a guarantee of two flights a day, he noted.

This summer the company has flown four services a day to the islands, stated Minaker.

The direct flights between Victoria and Vancouver are seen as additions to the present schedules.

Present services are maintained with de Havilland Beavers and Cessnas. The direct inter-city flight would be undertaken with twin-engined Otters.

New Otter service will be instituted in October and will go ahead even if the Transport Commission rules that stops must be made at the islands.


