

Is \$15 billion really so much?

Last week I estimated that if countries spent half as much on cleaning and distributing water as they do on munitions, everyone would have clean water within easy reach.

Well, once again I was wrong! We need not spend nearly that much!

"The World Bank estimates that to take significant action toward ending hunger, the leading industrial nations would need to increase development aid from \$13 billion a year to about \$28 billion a year, an increase of only \$15 billion."

Only \$15 billion! But surely that is a staggering amount! That would more than double the huge sums being poured into the Third World now. We cannot possibly afford such sums.

You agree? Then think on this: The nations of this planet spend over \$400 billion per year on defence and armaments. More than \$100 billion per year on alcoholic beverages.

Fifteen billion dollars doesn't seem so much now, does it?

I've been reading "A Shift in the Wind", published by The Hunger Project of San Francisco.

The Hunger Project aims to change attitudes, atmospheres, climates. To educate the peoples of the world, developed and undeveloped alike, to know and understand the causes of hunger; the fact that there is no necessity for anyone to go hungry, and then to determine that hunger shall come to an end.

LACK SOLUTIONS

Werner Erhard said: "Most of us think that the only reason 20 million of us are going to die of starvation this year is that we lack solutions to the problem. It's important for us to understand that there is no absence of solutions to the problem of starvation. People don't die of hunger because there is no solution to the problem of hunger. People die of hunger because of the way the world works - that is to say, the forces in the world. Hunger is a function of the forces in the world, not a function of scarcity, or a function of an absence of solutions....." (Anne Bishop said scarcities are created

for profit.) "The Hunger Project is about creating a context - creating the end of hunger as an idea whose time has come....."

Buckminster Fuller says we are entering into our most critical moment, that of imminent, technically feasible economic success for all humanity...."Humanity is acquiring the right technology for all the wrong reasons. Humanity could acquire the technology for the right reason: that is, to accomplish the total success and

enduring peace of all humanity."

An obvious example: we are using automation to increase profits. (Certainly not to increase efficiency, as the post office, ICBC and the Motor Vehicle Branch will testify!) The fact that we are also throwing people out of work is "incidental". If we were using automation properly, to ensure that people would be able to enjoy life more without having to work so hard, then we would be achieving Buckminster Fuller's goals - and our own!

WIND SHIFTS

Dick Gregory said: "When people ask me, 'well, what do you think's going to happen with hungry folks? Is the world going to

make it?' I give them the kind of answer the fire marshal gives to the TV reporter when a forest fire is burning out of control: "It's out of our hands now. If we don't get a shift in the wind, we can't save it." For a while, it looked like we weren't going to make it....but I left leeway for that which controls all winds to step in....Our hunger project is that shift in the wind."

There is a shift in the wind. Louis Harris, the poll expert, reports that 60 per cent of the American people now regard combatting world hunger as a top national priority. While 58 per cent favour foreign economic aid, that number would jump to 79 percent "if guarantees could be given that economic aid would actually reach the people it is meant to help."

I'll be accused of prejudice if I reiterate that the churches are still the best way to get aid where it's most needed. But the fact is that less is spent on administration by the churches, and that aid is given at the grass roots level, where government aid is all too often siphoned off at the top.

Remember: December 2 Sister Bede comes to teach us about bread. Bread for us and for the world.

Down Through The Years With Driftwood

15 YEARS AGO

Sale of property on Salt Spring Island has maintained a constant and gradual growth over the past 5 years, says C.R. Horel, Salt Spring Lands. Direct ferry service to the mainland did not cause a boom in real estate, although sales for 1963 are up appreciably over last year.

Careful development has been the long term policy of local real estate firms. The steady but stable expansion of the Island had shown that their policy is a good one.

1963 has shown the best net volume of real estate sales since 1959, and is expected to exceed 1959 sales by a small margin.

Work has commenced on a building to house dial telephone equipment. Footings are being put in on the B.C. Telephone Co. property above Harbour House. Contractors are Hodgson, King and Marble.

An addition is planned for the existing telephone building on Mayne Island for the Gulf exchange.

The telephone company hopes to start installation of dial equipment near the end of February, aiming for changeover in the service sometime in late summer, 1964.

Operators will be stationed in Victoria. Permanent operators at the Ganges and Gulf offices will have the opportunity to transfer to Victoria when the new system is completed.

Winds and stormy seas delayed the Queen of the Islands about an hour Tuesday morning. She had battled her way half across to Tsawwassen from Sturdies Bay when she had to turn back because the main ferry was unable to get away from the dock due to high winds. The Queen laid over at Sturdies Bay until the Tsawwassen dock was free. The battering of the sea damaged the bow doors during the crossing. The afternoon trip ran on schedule.

10 YEARS AGO

Animals may no longer stray on to the road between Ganges and Fulford.

Pound district has been established to embrace the land alongside the highway.

It was reported last week that the original plans to form a pound district of all of South Salt Spring Island had been challenged. The government then required a petition bearing majority of the signatures of property owners affected.

Supporters of the plan went ahead with the petition on a smaller scale. New applications covered only those areas near the highway.

Pound district has been formed and those farmers will be required to control their herds and flocks in that area.

Two veteran farmers of Salt Spring Island were honored by Salt Spring Island Farmer's Institute at a special banquet on Friday evening.

Life membership in the Institute was awarded to Bill Palmer and Frank Stevens who have farmed the island for more than half a century.

"I only wish," said chairman George Heinekey, "that Bill Evans were here to be the third."

Mr. Heinekey expressed a special welcome to W.M. Mouat, who was mentioned in the institute minutes for 1906 and who was active in the institute's first fair on the island in 1896, or thereabouts.

Frank Stevens was a member of the institute for a mere 43 years, having joined in 1926. Bill Palmer admitted to having been a member "considerably longer."

Presentation was made by L.W. Johnson, superintendent of farmers institutes.

The Fulford W.I. meeting was held at the home of Mrs. Low. Sr. last Thursday with a dozen members present. The executive welcomed the members and a short but busy meeting followed the roll call.

Men at Fulford have been climbing up and down the power poles and doing things with wires the last few days. Powerful machinery with flashing lights have been prowling along the road so things must be getting a professional grooming before Christmas.

FIVE YEARS AGO

End of the 10-acre freeze is in sight.

Capital Regional District is preparing the community plans of Salt Spring, Galiano and South Pender Islands for final submission to the provincial government and the minister of municipal affairs has promised approval by the Lieutenant Governor in Council.

Only delay in the legalization of the three community plans is occasioned by the necessity for bringing them into line with the agricultural land designations of the Land Commission Act. A local bylaw or plan must conform to provincial laws.

Islands travel, already chaotic this season, was completely cut off Monday evening when a sudden storm forced ferries to remain in port.

Travellers were stranded at both ends of every ferry service. After five o'clock the ships, both small and large, were held at bay.

It was the climax of a worsening service progressively closing in this year on island ferry users.

Veteran vote-getter of Salt Spring Island, George Heinekey, romped home to easy victory on Saturday in the Capital Regional District election. Heinekey led the race from the first count until his election was sure even before the last polls had been counted. Only two candidates contested the seat, Heinekey, and Jim Wilkinson.





A weekend of snow, freezing temperatures and a biting wind almost put a complete clamp on the Salt Spring Island Youth Soccer Association program.

What the weather did do was close down the Victoria league schedule as most fields were covered in snow. But what the weather could not do was stop the

Whitecaps from coming to our island.

Yes, Buzz Parsons and Bob Bolitho of the NASL Vancouver Whitecaps professional soccer team made a winged landing in Ganges Harbour on Saturday morning against a treacherous wind and rough swell.

With their arrival, the soccer association and its 150 players plus assorted coaches, managers and referees were assured that the Whitecaps clinic would begin. It became a weekend of frozen fingers, rosy cheeks, bundled bodies and abysmal weather conditions. However, it also was a weekend

which created a great learning experience for players, created enthusiasm among Salt Springs soccer youth, a lot of fun and most of all, a tremendous respect for the two Whitecaps players.

WEREN'T DISCOURAGED

The Whitecaps held four clinics of two hours each for four different age groups and in all were able to assist approximately 100 children.

Not bad, when considering the weather. They also found time to show an excellent film of the Vancouver Whitecaps 1978 season and answer many questions on Saturday evening.

In between, the two pros participated in a very successful exhibition match. The Whitecaps combined with several players chosen from each of the off-island teams to form the Selects. Their opponents were the highly-touted Soccer Association Executives, undefeated in three years.

PROS HELPED

This time around the Selects shone brightly, led by their "ringers", Buzz and Bob and some super efforts from the Selects they hammered the Executives 8-1. John Cottrell, the Selects coach, felt his club was really keyed up, especially when they noted one of the Executives wearing a Seattle Sounders shirt.

John's counterpart Audrey Cottrell, the Executives coach, felt the loss of players due to injury and sickness had weakened their club and she questioned the juvenile status of Buzz and Bob.

Rumours circulated that Tony Waiters, the Whitecaps coach, had bought out the referee, Strick Aust, to ensure a Whitecap win. Strick denied this and said that he felt the better club won and that the season tickets offered him had no bearing on the outcome.

All-in-all the weekend was a success, mostly due to the efforts of Buzz and Bob. Their advice and demonstrations were well absorbed by players and coaches alike, their poise and professional attitude was respected and their enthusiasm and fun was enjoyed by all.

No other professional sport provides this kind of program and the Whitecaps community soccer program can only create great fan support for them in the future.

SUCCESS CREDITED

The weekend's success was also due to many of the soccer executive, notably Dave Chase, who organized the high school gym for showing the film. Strick Aust, who handled all the financial arrangements, and all the coaches and managers who assisted the Whitecaps. A very special thanks must go to Jackie Hagan for the excellent smorgasbord she put on at her home for the Whitecaps and the Salt Spring soccer executives.

Hopefully next week the weather will warm up and the league schedules will be resumed.

Coaching opportunities for Island tennis buffs

The Canadian Lawn Tennis Association, in co-operation with the O'keefe Sports Foundation and the Coaching Association of Canada are introducing a five-level national certification program to meet the increasing need in tennis for more and better trained instructors and coaches. The purpose of the programme is to create in Canada a uniform system of teaching tennis and to provide volunteer, part-time instructors and professional coaches with an opportunity to receive formal training in the art and science of coaching tennis, and to obtain specific knowledge and expertise relating to coaching tennis and to obtain recognition through accredited certification.

The five grades of certification are as follows: level 1 instructor, level 2 advanced instructor, level 3 provincial instructor, level 4 professional, level 5 master professional.

The Canadian Lawn Tennis Association program also ties in closely with the National Coaching Development program which has been created as a framework for all sports. It was developed by the Coaching Association of Canada to meet the increasing need for more and better trained coaches.

The general theory section of the program contains fundamentals of coaching common to all sports. Many experienced coaches are finding that attendance at level 1 theory section is an ideal refresher course and a means of keeping abreast of recent developments in coaching theory.

This coaching program is sponsored by the Leisure Services Branch of the provincial government. There are no prerequisites required and no age limit. This coaching program is described along with the tennis program because attendance at a National Coaching Development Level 1 Theory course is a requisite for obtaining either Level 1 or Level 2 CLTA certification.

The executive of the Salt Spring Tennis Association resolved that every effort would be made to obtain instructors for the coming season with a minimum of at least Level 1 or Level 2 of the CLTA.

The technical information is the same for level 1 and 2. The Provincial Tennis Association is

offering this program which involves attendance on three successive weekends in Vancouver. It starts on December 15 for three days, then continues one week later and with a playing and written test to follow in January. If you are an instructor with very extensive experience it is possible to write this test without taking the course for a fee.

Since the coaching program is a requisite, the Salt Spring Tennis Association will attempt to arrange to have this level 1 theory course on the National Coaching development program given here on the Island.

To ensure a good program of instruction here on Salt Spring it is hoped that those interested in instructing in tennis will avail themselves of this opportunity to upgrade their coaching and instruction abilities.

Certainly most volunteer instructors are not offering their services prompted by financial gain but rather as a contributed service to their community. Nevertheless there is some inducement or compensation for volunteered time provided by an instructors fee. Accordingly, in line with the desire to upgrade the level of instruction, recognition will be given in terms of pay scale to the various levels of certification.



Sidney Island still seen as good proposition for public marine park

The Sidney Island Committee is a sub-committee of the South Vancouver Island Outdoor Recreation Committee. It was formed to promote the acquisition, for public use as a park, of Sidney Island, which is now up for sale.

The previous and present provincial governments have known for some time of its availability for purchase.

The Committee believes that only a large-scale public campaign will preserve Sidney Island as part of the park system.

To date the Sidney Island Committee is made up of the following organizations: Saanich

Greenbelt Association, Outdoor Club of Victoria, Victoria Natural History Society, Sierra Club (Victoria Group), and the Trails Information Society.

The committee has a program of speaking to various groups and organizations in the community as part of its public campaign.

The committee does not want Sidney Island to go the way of speculation and development in the real estate business.

There are various opinions within the committee on the present asking price of \$3.75 million for the 1,783 acres of the 2,000-acre island which are up for sale.

"As a committee," said a spokesman, "we take no position on the asking price, but believe that in these matters prices are negotiable."

The Minister of Recreation and Conservation, Sam Bawlf, has publicly stated that the price is too high.

In a recent article which appeared in The Martlet from the University of Victoria, R.H. Ahrens, Deputy Minister of Recreation and Conservation, was reported as saying that if public funds could be raised to cut the provincial bill towards purchasing the island, the government would look into the deal more closely.

Pensioner with housing grant has only \$168 left after basic living costs

Things are even worse than they initially looked.

When Driftwood outlined on November 8 the finances of an island pensioner who had just received housing assistance funding, it was estimated that he had \$250 a month to cover food and other expenses after paying for basics such as housing, heat and light. To set the record straight, the sum left for food and clothing only tallies up to \$168 after all else is paid for.

Info-Health

"He is a nice old fellow but his mind has gone." "She is no trouble but she is pretty confused at times."

When people lose their memory fail to recognize friends or familiar objects, become disoriented, and are no longer able to learn, they are said to have dementia. If they are older the term senile dementia may be applied, sometimes unfairly.

There are at least 50 diseases that can cause symptoms that fit our definition of dementia. While it is true that about one half of older

patients with the problem will have a specific disorder known as Alzheimer type dementia, which is not reversible, the remainder may be suffering from a variety of other diseases.

As many as 20 per cent of cases of dementia may be due to diseases that can be readily and effectively treated. Over one half of the 50 conditions that are associated with mental function deterioration can be treated.

Surgical, medical and psychiatric illnesses are possible causes of poor mental function. Blood clots or tumors in or near the brain may respond to surgery. An underactive thyroid gland and pernicious anemia are among causes of dementia that are easily treated medically. Depression, delirium, and psychotic behavior are psychiatric problems that can mimic dementia.

Until recently it was felt that 'hardening of the arteries' of the brain caused dementia. This seems less likely now as it is known that there is little correlation between the amount of blood vessel narrowing and loss of brain function.

Complete blockage of blood vessels in the brain is a different matter, and 'small strokes' (as well as large ones), cause the death of brain tissue and lead to some degree of dementia.

The purpose of this column is to point out that not all people thought to be 'senile' or 'demented' need be so permanently. Sometimes the nice old fellow's mind can be revitalized, and Grandma's confusion can be cured. A few tests may diagnose a treatable condition, and a 'demented' patient should not be denied them.

Common assault charge leads to \$75 fine

By Saturday, every island was suffering the effects of the storm.


John Thomson, Islands manager for the Hydro, reported that the line crews went out on the job at 8 am on Saturday. By Sunday evening they had to have a rest and they got to bed for the first time all week end.

On Monday morning they were back on the job, facing outages on Salt Spring, Galiano, Mayne, Penders and Saturna.

"As fast as we put the lines up, they fall down again," said Thompson on Monday morning.

SNOWFALL

While the addition of up to an inch of snow on Saturday morning on Salt Spring didn't appear to cause any traffic problems, it did catch many residents by surprise.

B.C. Tel crews, while not as hard-hit as Hydro, had their share of cleaning up and repairing to do during the weekend as well.

"We were very lucky in comparison to Hydro, a B.C. Tel spokesman told Driftwood. "We had a number of minor problems with lines down in various areas, but there were no widespread troubles."

Travellers making use of B.C. Ferries services also ran into their share of problems and delays during the weekend.

FERRY DELAYS

Ferries running from Long Harbour to the mainland didn't dock at Sturdies Bay on Galiano at all between Friday and Sunday because of high winds. The stop at Pender on the last run Sunday night was also cancelled when wind and tide conditions made safe docking impossible.

Adding to the delays, which ranged from 45 minutes to 1½ hours during the weekend, were problems with power supply.

Ferries spokesman Bob Anderson told Driftwood that power outages at Long Harbour, Mayne and Pender caused problems with operation of the ramps at the ferry terminals.

"We had to hook up our ship-to-shore power cables in order to get the ramps operating," Anderson pointed out, "and that meant that we lost anywhere from 10 to 15 minutes every time we had to do it."

Trust served with writ

of property values.

Petitioner asserts that the by-law is, thus, illegal.

Writ leaves the matter open, explained Mrs. Valcourt, this week. The petitioner has given due warning of intent and may take the necessary action in Supreme Court if she so desires, should the by-law gain final approval.

OBJECTION

Mrs. Valcourt expressed strong objection to the new Community Plan at the recent public hearing in Ganges. She protested the consideration of the north end of the village of Ganges as a low density commercial area.

The Islands Trust committee, meeting in the Legion Hall on Wednesday last week heard the writ read out by Jack Fisher, but no comment was made.

Trustees went on to consider changes in the Community Plan and the zoning by-law which had been introduced as a result of the public hearing.

Large number of changes were made to meet the objections expressed in certain areas.

Trustees declined to comment on the petition or its likely result.

It was agreed to await comment from the Trust solicitors.

It is the third petition in the Supreme Court to be offered since the unveiling of the Salt Spring Island Community Plan.

TWO OTHERS


Unsuccessful action was taken by Mrs. Valcourt and two other island residents earlier in the year when they called for an interlocutory injunction against the Capital Regional District. They asked that the Court prohibit the Capital Region from proceeding with preparations for the installation of a sewer system in Ganges.

Still undecided is the petition calling for a ruling against the installation itself.
