Poppy campaign successful reports island Legionnaire

Gulf Islands Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion, has just concluded its 50th Poppy Campaign, and is quite happy with the results, which are given below. This year saw the 60th anniversary of the 1918 Armistice, from which the poppy began, and which so few of our nation can personally remember.

We presume that most people have read why the poppy was chosen for this purpose. It is the one flower that those of us who served in the trenches vividly remember. It would even grow in the shell-torn No Man's Land, amid the barbed wire.

Today we use an artificial flower, made by disabled veterans. The total proceeds, less the cost of the poppies, is placed in a trust fund, and the sole use a branch can make of this fund is to help the veteran in immediate need, be he a member of the Legion or not.

So many cases occur where no coverage is provided under Veteran's acts, or where the need is immediate, but cutting red tape is a lengthy process. These are the things the Poppy fund looks after.

We wish to thank all who donated, and particularly those who gave time and effort to make the collection, and those stores and business places who gave us facilities for collecting. Our total collection this year was \$284.00 as compared with \$271.00 in our campaign last year. In the past

year we had to use, for one purpose or another, rather more than half our gross takings for 1977.

The Bellingham Junior Chamber of Commerce is planning their 13th annual International Christmas Ship Cruise for Dec. 21-22 weekend. The ship (traditionally the Pacific American fisheries cannery-tender "Kar-luk") cruises American and Canadian islands in the San Juan and Gulf archipelagoes, bringing Santa Claus with treats and the sights and sounds of Christmas to the children of more than a dozen islands on both sides of the border.

This year the project takes an international step forward with the inauguration of a companion Christmas Ship activity sponsored by the Victoria Jaycee Club. The Victoria ship will visit several U.S. and Canadian Islands not being visited by the Bellingham ship. The two groups have planned to rendezvous in Canadian waters Dec. 21.

10 YEARS AGO

Sir Philip was director of medicine for the Royal Air Force before his retirement.

During his residence at Fulford Sir Philip continued his practice.

The couple are now living close to where the young Livingston lived before settling out to study medicine a half century ago.

FIVE YEARS AGO

On February 1 the Bowen Queen will be brought in to the Gulf Islands service. She will take over the Fulford-Swartz Bay run from the Salt Spring Queen.

Announcement was made following a meeting on Wednesday morning last week of the transportation committee of the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce and staff members of the B.C. Ferries.

Not even a heavy fall of snow could deter the blood donors of Salt Spring Island on Friday.

The preliminary report is a summary of the community expressions with some observations by the surveyors, explained Johnson. The final report will consist of a summary of community desires with firm recommendations.

Ron McQuiggan commented that he had been informed that the report does not take a close look at the library. He is taking a closer look, said Johnson.

A 6,000 square foot recreation facility on the island would cost about \$200,000, commented Hank Schubart.

A one-shot 2 1/2 mill levy could take care of the community's share of such a cost, \$70,000. Remainder would be met by government recreation grants.

Henry Elder suggested that the influence of such a recommendation would have a sharp effect on the island. He urged that Johnson keep in close touch with the Islands Trust.

Mahon Hall would not be in conflict with a recreation centre, observed Schubart. It could be an important heritage building.

DON'T DO THAT!
"Don't fall into the trap of finding alternatives," he added.

There are two agencies maintaining grass on the island, observed Johnson, to be met with laughter.

School Board and the Recreation Commission both have grass cutters travelling the island. He could not see the logic of it.

He was aware of the school equalization tax, said the recreationalist. The money going off-island each year to the ministry of education could pay for a swimming pool here in one year, he observed.

Robert E. Tuffs, from Greater Vancouver, successfully defended himself in Ganges Provincial Court last week on a charge of using insulting language in Mouat Park.

Nigel Desbottes gave evidence that he was park ranger on duty on August 26. He patrolled the park and saw Tuffs drinking with a group of younger people around a campfire. He asked for identity cards and ascertained that some of the party were under-age. He then called the police, who confiscated the beer and spirits there. The police officer took Tuffs to the police office, but no charge was laid.

Tuffs and Desbottes both told the court that he walked back to Mouat Park.

In his evidence, Udo Burger, also engaged at that time as a ranger, recalled Tuffs coming back

in a patrol car.

Both rangers referred to the same obscene expressions by Tuffs.

Tuffs referred to an exchange of obscenities with Burger. He stated that an offensive remark about moustaches was made by Burger. Burger insisted that Tuffs had said it.

In his evidence, Desbottes recalled that the accused camper had complained that while his gear was being removed from the campsite a propane bottle and stove had disappeared. Desbottes had driven into Ganges to recover it from the baggage of the young students who had also been required to leave the park. The confusion was not intended, he explained.

The altercation between Tuffs and Burger started in his absence. Judge McAdam, dismissing the

charge, cited discrepancies in the evidence and noted that he could not accept that any offence had been committed under the Criminal Code.

Board to press Curtis on Kanaka Road closure

The Gulf Islands School Board has voted in favour of writing to Municipal Affairs Minister Hugh Curtis to inform him that the district wants Kanaka Road closed.

The controversial thoroughfare, which bisects playing fields at the elementary and secondary schools in Ganges, has been a safety concern in the district for several years.

A letter from Salt Spring Elementary principal Tom Watson presented to the board Thursday suggested that a committee of trustees and teachers be struck to solicit response from Kanaka Road residents regarding their feelings on the matter.

Watson suggested that if the residents were in favour of the closure the district could ask the Ministry of Highways to turn the road over to the school district,

which would restrict traffic use.

The district's executive committee has also been asked to check up on an agreement that trustee Spencer Marr recalled had been

struck several years back.

Marr told the meeting he thought that about 11 years ago the school district had agreed to deed 15 feet of its property to the highways department in order to allow for the widening of Rainbow Road on the condition that Kanaka would be closed.

"If that was the deal, why didn't we get the second half of it?" Marr wondered aloud.

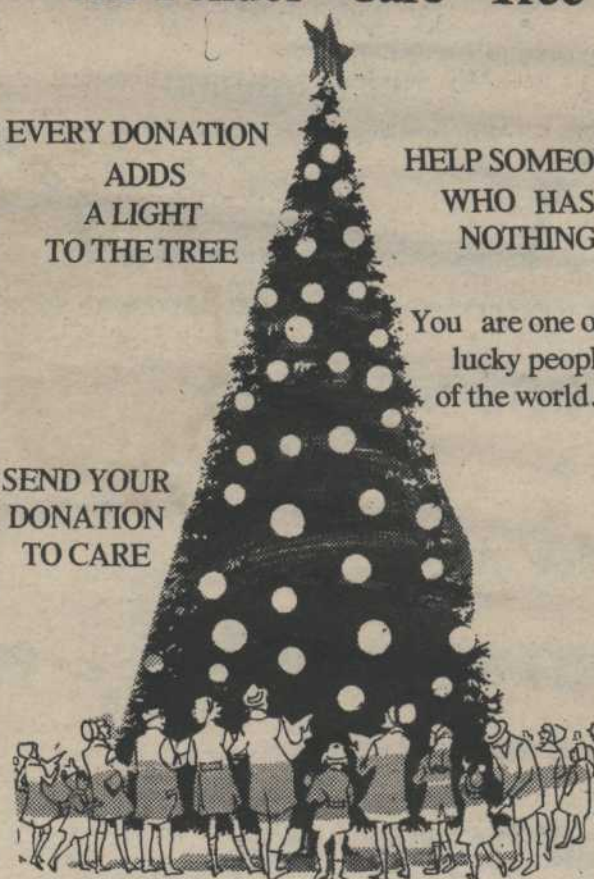

Small ferries to service Fulford run in spring

Salt Spring Island residents heading for Victoria next spring will be faced with travelling on the Salt Spring Queen and the Pender Queen for at least a month, according to a B.C. Ferries spokesman.

Bill Bouchard has told Driftwood that the two small ferries will service the run between Fulford and Swartz Bay between April 2 and May 3, 1979.

Use of the two small ferries is necessitated by a chain reaction of substitutions due to annual re-fits and ferry stretching programs.

Bouchard explained that the Powell River Queen will go into re-fit January 8 - March 30. The Bowen Queen, which normally runs between Fulford and Swartz Bay, will be shuttled to the Sunshine Coast to relieve the

regular vessel, and the Mayne Queen, a sister ship to the Bowen Queen, will take on the Salt Spring - Victoria run.

However, both of those vessels are scheduled for re-fit and stretching at the same time, with the alterations allotted for April 2 to June 15.

Bouchard says all three of the large vessels must be stretched in a six-month period prior to the onslaught of summer travellers, which is why both the Bowen Queen and the Mayne Queen will be out of the water at the same time.

Although the decision to stretch the vessels was made several weeks ago Bouchard says work on them couldn't begin immediately because tenders had to be called and specifications had to be drawn up.

Fairweather to study Pender routes

Pender school trustee Don Fairweather has been appointed by the Gulf Islands school board to look into the feasibility of changes in the school bus routes on North and South Pender Islands.

Fairweather was appointed following receipt of a letter from the Pender parents' group requesting that the morning bus to South

Galiano to get covered play area

The Gulf Islands school board has approved a motion to provide a covered play area and proper learning assistance space for the Galiano school.

At its regular meeting Thursday the board was told by secretary-treasurer Wilf Peck that officers from the Ministry of Education were strongly in favour of funding for the two facilities.

The school currently is without a covered play area or a gymnasium, and learning assistance sessions are conducted in the furnace room at the school.

TO ASSIST ASSISTANCE

Peck told the board that the ministry officials had indicated they would approve the addition of about 200 square feet of space for learning assistance at the school.

"Well, if there's a way to go," Salt Spring trustee Ann Foerster told the meeting, "I think the board should move in this direction."

The plan for the covered play area, Peck said, would be to construct a base and roof structure that could eventually be enclosed for use as a small gymnasium.

Pender be discontinued, with the afternoon run continuing.

The parents also suggested eliminating the run to South Pender altogether and reimbursing parents from that area who will have to provide transportation of their children. There was also a request in the letter for extension of bussing services on North Pender.

Turned down

The Gulf Islands school board has turned down a request from teacher Mike Hayes for assistance with moving expenses.

Hayes recently moved from Saturna Island to Ganges after requesting a transfer to a teaching post on Salt Spring.

The board refused the request on the grounds that it was the teacher and not the district that had initiated the transfer.

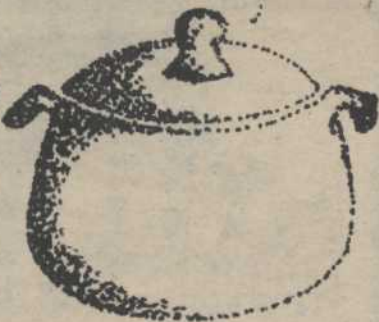
