"That wasn't a bowline," retorted a passenger, "that was two half-hitches."

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Lille d'Easum speaks at Ganges

Canadian nuclear industry is topic

In Canada, they are described as "significant events", and in the United States, "abnormal occurrences". "They" are accidents in nuclear reactors, and that lesson in modern phraseology was given by a speaker at a meeting in Ganges Monday evening.

Former teacher, and now a member of the Voice of Women and the Canadian Coalition for Nuclear Responsibility, Lille d'Ea-

sum came to Salt Spring Island this week to talk about nuclear power.

After giving a brief history of the nuclear industry in Canada, she recalled some of the problems that have been encountered and some of the accidents that have taken place during the past couple of decades.

The first major accident took place on "Black Friday" in December, 1952, when a series of human and technical errors resulted in an explosion in a Candu reactor. The explosion was powerful enough to lift a four-ton dome into the air and the reactor was destroyed, the meeting learned. The reactor was also flooded with radioactive water, which was subsequently pumped out to a distance of about one mile from the plant. What happened to the water after that was a question she could not answer, said Ms. d'Easum.

LEAKS

She recalled there had been a number of "significant events" in Ontario's Pickering nuclear plant. At one time, one of the reactor's units was shut down for over 200 days because of leaks of radioactive material and another unit was out for over a year due to similar problems.

The federal government's nuclear promoting agency, Atomic Energy of Canada Ltd., is close to bankruptcy, said the speaker, and will have to be bailed out by the government. And the only way they can make the nuclear industry viable is to sell four Candu reactors every year.

"So they're trying to sell the reactors to the Third World countries," explained Ms. d'Easum. And to do so, the government is providing those countries with low-interest loans and, in some cases, giving them away.

"It's not very profitable," she remarked.

LEFT AT MINE SITE

Speaking of uranium, nuclear reactor fuel, she noted that 85% of the radiation in that substance is

left at the mine site in the form of tailings. The speaker observed that there are areas where houses and schools are being built on abandoned uranium mine sites.

Disposal of nuclear wastes is one of the biggest problems in the industry, and one of the products of nuclear fission, plutonium, is the most poisonous substance in the world, said Ms. d'Easum.

Burial at sea has been tried, but the casks holding the waste have decayed. Salt mines have been tried, but again, unsuccessfully. There have been suggestions such as rocketing it to the sun (former U.S. Energy Secretary James Schlesinger), and burying it in granite.

The speaker told of a town in northern Ontario, chosen as a site for nuclear waste disposal. A meeting was held in the town, which had a population of 1,200, to explain to the residents what was being planned.

The meeting saw 1,600 people turn up to say no to the proposal, said Ms. d'Easum. And now another place, near Thunder Bay, has been chosen. This time, she said, no meetings are planned.

One of the last things Monday's meeting learned was that the Canadian nuclear industry has never conducted a safety study, that Canada has relied on the U.S. for such information. And much of that has proven to be false.

Trust to meet in Victoria

Next meeting of the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee will be held in Victoria. The committee will meet in the Islands Trust office at 848 Courtney St. in Victoria on Wednesday afternoon, August 1.

It is a routine business meeting to which members of the public are invited. It is not a public hearing, the sponsors note.

A meeting is the function at which the committee attends to the routine business of processing applications. A public hearing is a mandatory preliminary to any by-law intended to change zoning or land use.

Work of two local artists in new book

The work of two Salt Spring Island artists can be found in a book published recently by Gray's Publishing of Sidney.

The Protected Place, by Cortez Island writer Gilean Douglas, contains pen and ink illustrations by Suzanne Gagnon and a water-colour painting on the cover by Art Simons.

The 189-page paperback is described as an account of the year, month by month, of the author's isolated home on the west coast of Canada.
