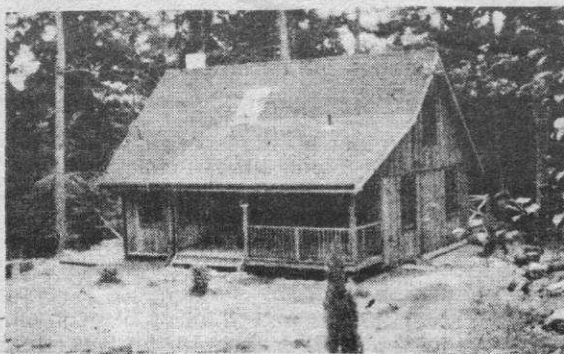

Here's a moist Zucchini Fruit Bar to get you in the mood!

Cream: ¼ cup margarine, ½ cup brown sugar, ½ cup white sugar or honey, 2 eggs. Add: 1¼ cups unbleached or ww flour, 1½ tsp. baking powder, ½ tsp. salt. Stir in: ¾ cup each of raisins, chopped dates and coconut, 2 cups grated zucchini, 1 tsp. vanilla.

Bake at 350° for 30 to 40 min. in 9x12 pan.

These are good the way they are, or can be glazed with an icing made

from skim milk powder creamed with a little butter or marg. and milk.

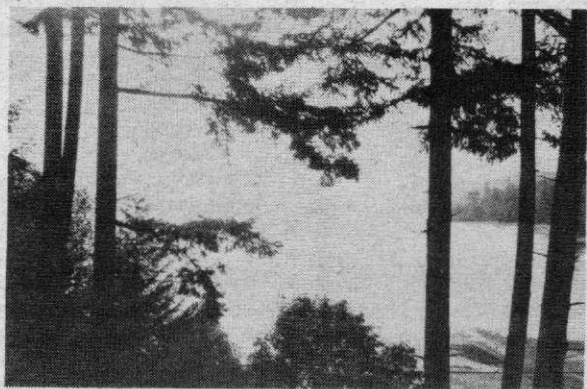

Each and every home must show its number

What's your number?

On Salt Spring Island your house has a number and it's supposed to be used.

Fire Hall in Ganges is the source of information. That's where the records are kept.

Every property on Salt Spring Island is numbered. Each resident or property owner can call at the Fire Hall in Ganges and ascertain that number.

Fire Chief Bob Leask has asked callers to supply the legal description of the property concerned to facilitate tracing it. The Fire Hall has a listing under the owner's name, or under the name of a former owner, where the property has changed hands recently.

When the number is known, the person is required to place the number in four-inch numerals where it can be seen from the road. In some cases the number has to be placed near the road to indicate that the house is in that vicinity and also on the house to completely identify it.

The numbering system has been adopted by the fire district for only one reason: to enable emergency crews to get to the home or property in as short a time as possible. Every resident or owner who puts up the number of the building is ensuring a prompt response in case of emergency.

The householder who is careless about using the number is the householder whose home may, one day, be untraceable by an emergency vehicle, warned a spokesman for the fire department this week.

The fire office is open weekdays throughout the working day.

While fishermen taking part in the derby were on the water, lots of events were taking place for land-lubbers: the treasure hunt, scavenger hunt, log walk, rock toss, nail hammering, tug-o-war and rock skipping.

The annual meeting of the association was held outdoors at the home of Mr. and Mrs. T. Kravik. Seven directors were elected: Warren Lane, Gordon Harrison, Webb Hughes and Mrs. Florabelle Peters, all island residents. Off-island directors elected were Ray Young, T. Kravik and Frank Phippen. This past year saw

the completion of the new road into the area and last November the B.C. Hydro electric power turned on.

At 4 pm the mother's dinghy race was held and Wendy McIntyre was the winner. It was followed by the raft race across the inlet. At 5.30 everyone gathered for cocktails served by Mrs. Barbara Phippen and Chip Barrett gave out the prizes for the various sporting events.

One hundred and fifty-eight pounds of salmon were caught and the largest fish weighed 9 lbs., 12 oz.

FIVE YEARS AGO

Veterinarian is planning to establish an office on Salt Spring Island. Dr. J. Scott is making plans to come here and is searching for suitable premises.

All dogs in the islands must be licensed. All dogs must be on a leash and no dog may be permitted to stray. Penalty is death. Any dog failing to conform to the new regulations may be shot. Unfortunately the new Domestic Animal Protection Act is not yet in print and the fine print cannot be examined.

Bill Cottrell, of Galiano, is top 80-and-over golfer in British Columbia. Played off at Richmond last week, the championship ended up with the Clyde Davis Rose Bowl in the possession of the island golfer. In addition to the rose bowl for one year, he also won a \$50 pair of golf shoes.

A six-foot, snarling, spitting cougar, was shot at the back door of Dale Codd's house in the Burgoyne Valley. Ted Akerman shot the cat which was blamed for at least 35 sheep losses over the past week or so. Sheep farmers were aware that the cougar was on the island before any had seen him. He left his mark. Ted Akerman was assisted by his father, Bob Akerman, as well as Merv Walde and Ben Greenhough. Dead animal was a male. He has never known a female on Salt Spring Island, commented Bob Akerman.

When a disturbance broke out in Ruckle Park on Saturday it was the girls in a gathering of young people who egged on their male companions to defy an RCMP constable. The girls were screaming obscenities and defiance, reported the police afterwards.

Jim Talman was on his way to Victoria to start a new job on Monday morning. He headed for the 6.30 am ferry from Fulford on his motorcycle. He never reached the ferry: he hit a deer. The deer was killed; the motorcycle was wrecked and the rider ended up in Lady Minto Hospital.

TEN YEARS AGO

Second day of the hunting season saw a Vancouver hunter shot on Galiano Island. Mike Maurhsailis was riddled with SSG pellets when he was hunting with two mainland companions. His companions helped the victim out of the bush and flagged down Earl Young, who drove him to the south end. He was taken to a mainland hospital. Rifles have been banned on the island since the shooting death, last year, of Peter Arnell, Salt Spring Island land surveyor who was killed while working in the woods on Galiano.

When the manager of Mouat's Store in Ganges was notified early Sunday morning that there was a man in the store, a search revealed the burglar in possession of various articles. Spencer Marr called the police and met them at the store. Young man was in possession of a television set, watches, a flashlight and other items. He was arrested.

French technicians who have been in the islands for the laying of the new submarine cable bringing hydro power to Vancouver Island from the mainland, have returned to their homes in France.

Naval officers with crossed swords formed a guard of honour on the steps of St. Mark's Church at Ganges for Lieut. Robert Montagu Scott and his bride, the former

Miss Josephine Overend, chief operator for the B.C. Telephone Co. at the Ganges Exchange since 1958, has retired. She left the company's service when the Ganges exchange went automatic this month. Miss Overend took over as chief operator from Miss Effie Turner, after working as operator since 1943. She and her sister, Miss Mary Overend, came to Salt Spring Island in 1939.

Over 600 people attended Mayne Island Fall Fair on Saturday when it was officially opened by Dave

Stupich, MLA. Mr. Stupich also assisted Walter Hunt-Sowrey in the distribution of prizes. There were 122 people competing in the 560 classes. Miss Sylvia Aldridge captured four of the nine trophies offered and won the Foster Cup, the McGill Trophy, the Matthews Trophy and the Williams Trophy. Mrs. G. Jennens, of South Pender, won the McGrath Trophy for sheep classes. Colleen Piggott, of Mayne, won the Dodds Cup for most children's points. Floral trophy was won by Mrs. M. McAmmond. Miss M. McConnell and Michael McConnell tied for the photographic trophy.

Shares gain stature as library enjoys smaller share than hoped

BCRIC shares have taken their place among the more prestigious stocks in the province's money markets.

the shares in the bathroom are now eagerly opening a safety deposit box to house the valuable bearer bonds.

The reception afforded BCRIC shares has had a depressing influence on the allocation of the issue to the Salt Spring Island Library.

Several weeks ago Mrs. Mary Gatley of Fulford launched her one-woman campaign to donate the shares to the island library.

From the opening day of the campaign until the present time, the shares have gained prestige and many who were indifferent to the shares are now hoarding them.

Salt Spring Islanders are still invited to donate their shares to the Salt Spring Island Library to help towards the cost of building renovations. Bank of Montreal, in Ganges, will make the necessary arrangements.

Charge dismissed

A charge laid under the Liquor Control Act against Glen Carroll was dismissed in provincial court last week.

Judge D.K. McAdam told Carroll he was "free to go" when Const. Darrel Simmonds, called as the first witness for the Crown, didn't show up.

Two face charges here

Two Salt Spring Islanders appeared in provincial court Wednesday to face drinking-driving charges.

Paulyne Beauvais, 31, pleaded guilty to two charges which were laid following a single-car accident July 14 near Ganges.

She was charged with impaired driving and refusing to comply with a breath test demand. Judge D.K. McAdam fined her \$200 on the first charge and \$150 on the second and in addition, ordered probation for six months, during which time she has to perform 75 hours of community work service.

What's a dollar worth? And, worse, what is a Yankee dollar worth?

Visitors to Salt Spring Island who were spending American dollars

here last year found a wide variation in the exchange rate charged against the alien dollar bills. Some charged a very small premium and others imposed a

heavy penalty for changing American money.

The Chamber of Commerce instituted its Fair Exchange Program at the beginning of the year. With the co-operation of the Bank of Montreal, the Chamber undertook to establish each week the exchange rate for United States currency. The rate is published each week in *Driftwood* and Salt Spring businesses are invited to use that figure as a guideline.

It has worked perfectly, reports Terry Elford, Chairman of the Chamber's tourist committee. Most island businesses have adopted the published rate and visitors with foreign money are meeting with a generally standard rate of exchange.

The problem presented by too great a variance in the rate of exchange was fear of being ripped off. The American visitor who exchanged his own currency at one place for a 15-cent premium felt he was being taken when he only received a 10-cent premium at the next store.

Island cartoonist Adrian Raeside has prepared a plaque for participating merchants' counters.

Despite the success of the scheme, most merchants will be happy to see the two currencies at par again.

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Recreation Commission treasurer

Marr announces resignation

Treasurer of the Salt Spring Parks and Recreation Commission is resigning.

Spencer Marr announced his intention in a letter to the commission this week. He said he had to resign as soon as possible, mainly because his business was taking up more of this time.

Glenn Woodley told the commission meeting Monday that the position required some under-

standing of accounting procedures and that someone to replace Marr would need some accounting background.

"The work (of the treasurer) has tripled in the last two years," he observed.

Regional director Mike Clement felt that someone should be hired to handle the accounts. He said a person was needed to keep a check on the money the commission was

spending and suggested that an employee in Spencer Marr's accounting office might be engaged.

Woodley felt otherwise, and said the procedure envisioned by Clement was no different than what was being followed.

MORE REPRESENTATIVE

With a member of the commission doing the job, he said, it would be more representative than with "some bureaucrat".

Earlier in the meeting, the regional director had objected to the method used by the commission in awarding contracts for various projects being undertaken on the island.

He urged that standard forms for contract agreements be used and that on any contract, 15% of the money owing a contractor be held back for 41 days. It was a standard procedure, the meeting was told.

It could be difficult for local contractors, observed Glenn Woodley.

"For a small operator, it could be somewhat of a hardship," he said.

"There's no choice," replied Clement. "It's a statutory requirement."

Bev Unger felt that because the commission was in charge of public funds, "we should act in a responsible manner".

Warning to hunters

With hunting season opening next week, the B.C. Forest Service is reminding hunters that the woods are still dry and dangerous. In the Vancouver Forest Region last year, 20 forest fires were attributed to carelessness on the part of hunters. And this year, says the Forest Service, conditions are even dryer.

The season for game birds opens September 1 and for deer, September 8.

GALIANO ISLAND

Dr. Harvey Armitage plans to retire this fall. Dr. Hugh Maclure, a general practitioner with twenty years experience in Canada, will be coming to Galiano Island in mid-September.
