Adequate pensions must be public

Many Canadians have retired on the Gulf Islands and on Vancouver Island because of the warmth and beauty of our area. As a result all the people of Cowichan-Malahat-The Islands should take a particular interest in the problems of our senior citizens.

Consider some of the facts.

More than half of older Canadians are on welfare.

That means they are so poor they qualify for the supplement to the old age pension, even though the supplements don't bring them up to the "poverty line".

Two out of every three elderly women in Canada live below that line...that is, they exist on less than \$5,200 a year.

Growing old in Canada now comes with an almost sure-fire guarantee you'll live a depression-style existence.

NOTHING SAVED

But don't ignore these statistics because you're hale, hearty and under 65. Keep in mind that half of the Canadians now working have not a penny set aside for their old age. They'll have only the Canada Pension to rely on, with its subsistence-level income. And they'll be living in an era when one out of three Canadians are over 65.

That's what they're calling the pension crisis in Canada. Inflation devastates the incomes of the elderly. There are rumours everywhere that the Canada Pension fund is going bankrupt. Private pension companies are being blamed for a system that has failed to keep up with the times and manages to cover less than 50% of Canadians.

The situation for women has gone from crisis to catastrophe. Usually widows get 50% pension benefits while widowers get 100%.

Housewives aren't covered at all under the Canada Pension and in

for a widening of CPP and an immediate increase in old age security payments to get the majority of our two million seniors out of the poverty ghetto.

It can't be done by private plans in which Canadians lose out if they change jobs or if their employers have no plan. The desirable features of a pension plan: accessibility, portability, and indexation, can only be found in the public system.

WE CAN PAY

We can afford to pay decent pensions, but society must make the decision that it wants to apportion the wealth that it produces to provide old people with a comfortable future.

"Guaranteeing that everyone on retirement will have a standard of living at least equivalent to their pre-retirement living standard now has to be a matter of public policy and can't be decided by private industry," says Mr. Knowles.

We will be pushing the government in exactly that direction, for the sake of both young and old.

Historians name Marjorie Ratzlaff

Former islander recalls early days of Nelson

The election of officers was conducted by Walter Ratzlaff of Saturna.

Taking office were president: Mrs. Marjorie Ratzlaff, re-elected; vice-president: Mrs. Lorraine Campbell, re-elected; secretary, Elsie Brown; treasurer, Evelyn

Saunders. Counsellors will be appointed by the president.

The president gave a report on the year's activities, with the list of speakers. Due to the ferry situation most of the meetings were held on Saturna, with one held on Galiano last June.

The Gulf Islands Branch has continued to sponsor an Essay Contest for Outer Islands school students. Last year the students requested that they write an essay on a field trip to a museum or other historic site.

Sue Wagner, former Mayne

Island teacher, judged the essays and had high praise for the entries. It was disappointing that only Saturna School participated. The sum of \$50 was awarded to the school.

REPRINTING

A discussion on the feasibility of another re-printing of "Gulf Islands Patchwork", since the number of copies are limited, resulted in a decision to inquire into the cost by the former publisher. Jesse Brown was put in charge of this item.

Walter Ratzlaff offered to do

research into the history of the Gulf Islands Branch, which met with the approval of the members.

The treasurers report showed a healthy bank balance. Revenue is from dues which were increased at the last annual meeting of B.C.H.A. and sale of "Gulf Island Patchwork".

Following the meeting, the guest speaker, Mrs. Clare McAllister, formerly of Galiano Island, and now of Victoria was introduced by the president.

Her subject was "Transportation in the Kootenays", prior to the

turn of the century.

It was interesting to hear the speaker's early recollection of life around the area of Nelson. Before the railway came into existence travel was on foot, horse-back or horse drawn sleighs and cutters. With stables and blacksmith shops in close proximity to homes many housewives were plagued with flies and other undesirable insects in summer as well as the much feared "summer complaint" by mothers of small children.

The speaker gave an account of

many humorous incidents preceding the arrival of the Kettle Valley Railway which was a necessary addition to relieve the problems of transportation as the mining industry grew.

A tri-weekly service was maintained between the city of Nelson and Trout Lake. Another mode of travel was by steamer to the upper end of Kootenay Lake.

In those days the train was "a very gritty vehicle," the grit in winter consisted of small raspy coal cinders, seemingly on everything. The cinders were apparently produced by the stove at the end of

each passenger car, which provided the heat. Fumes from the clouds of coal smoke during refueling was one of the ordeals suffered by the passengers as well as the smell of the oil lamps swaying from the ceiling.

Mrs. McAllister was well known on the Gulf Islands as a member of the school board and active member of the Gulf Island Branch of the B.C. Historical Association and has kept active in various capacities since her move to Victoria.

Unfortunately Don and Nan New were unable to be present at

the meeting and they will be the only representatives at the Annual Conference of the B.C.H.A. held in Cranbrook this year, May 28-31.

Refreshments were served by the Saturna members and more questions were asked the guest-speaker of the early days in the Kootenays.

No date has been set for the next meeting but it will be publicized in *Driftwood*.

Park and local planning

Two meetings on Galiano of wide concern

AMBULANCE

By Sunday the ambulance had been called out four times. Once was to stand-by at the fire. A fall on the wharf resulted in a broken wrist for a young girl. Attendants splinted the arm so that the patient could board the ferry to return home before receiving further help.

On Saturday two cars collided head-on on Bluff Road, as a result of which several passengers received multiple cuts from broken glass and cases of concussion. Dr. MacLure and ambulance attendants gave first aid. The injured were able to board the *Queen of Sidney* to return to the mainland.

The most serious accident occurred early on Sunday morning when a camper-truck descending Montague Hill overturned in a ditch. The lone occupant was injured and trapped in the vehicle.

Seventeen-year-old Ken Robertson reported the accident to his hosts, the Mozleys. Bert, with the aid of Louis Kadla, was able to pry open the door and free the victim, who had suffered a broken jaw and other injuries. The patient was sent to Royal Jubilee Hospital in Victoria.

GALIANO TRUST COMMITTEE

Local Trustees Ron Thompson and Jim Robertson have prepared and distributed to Galiano residents a white paper giving background information for the public hearing and Trust Committee Meeting to be held on Friday, April 24 at 1 pm in the Community Hall. The agenda is listed and explanations of the items to be considered provided.

The proposal of the new owners of Galiano Lodge to expand and develop the Lodge was discussed in last week's *Driftwood*. Another application to be dealt with at the public hearing is by Mr. and Mrs. Ososo to develop a resort on their property at the junction of Cook Road with Porlier Pass Road at the north end of Galiano. Ten housekeeping cabins are proposed together with facilities for stabling horses.

The Manager of the Island Trust

is to introduce the proposed Regional Plan and residents' comments are invited. The Island Trust representatives will explain the Development Permit Area to the by-law and describe how it will affect the Village I area and subsequently all Commercial and Industrial lots.

BLUFF PARK

General meeting of the Galiano Club will be held on Tuesday, April 28 at 8 pm in the Community Hall to deal with the reports submitted by the committee appointed last fall to investigate what changes should be made with regard to the administration of Bluff Park Trust. The recommendations of the Board of Directors of the Galiano Club with regard to the future administration of Bluff Park will also be considered.

The Galiano Club-Bluff Park Committee issued two reports, a majority report by Frank Hillier and Oli Garner and a minority report by Ken Hardy. Despite lengthy arguments over points of difference there is a considerable area of agreement, especially as to how the park should be managed. Both reports recommend development of a long-range master plan, strict definition of the term selective logging and limited application, development of a minimal nature only with public approval and in compliance with the plan. The spending of money on improvements and the hiring of experts to give advice are advocated in both reports and both address the problem of fire hazard.

The major differences are in the interpretation of questionnaire results and resolving the problem of who should administer the park. That there is disagreement about the questionnaire is not surprising, as it was not constructed by experts in that field. There were ambiguities, overlapping questions and plenty of scope for confusion. Furthermore, both sides carried out mathematically unacceptable operations such as adding or subtracting percentages derived from different bases. The results were a sound guide to action if a straight-forward question such as "Would you

approve of the development of campsites in the park?" received a 96% "No" answer. The results indicating who respondents thought should administer the park are of more dubious value and probably opinion on this matter is still fluid.

The Hillier report advocates that the Galiano Club divorce itself of the Bluff Trust, assuming that this is possible. It recommends a Parks Board but does not go into detail of the mechanics of how such a Board would be elected, by whom, and under what constitution or set of regulations it would operate.

Much more information will have to be made available before this step could be decided upon. The Hardy report recommends a separate group of 'Park Directors', within the Galiano Club, be formed by changing the constitution. It is debatable whether, under the terms of the Trust, such a body could assume responsibility for administering the Park since that task is specifically assigned to the Directors Meeting of the Club. As to be expected, legal advice on these two possibilities is conflicting.

The argument that possible future conflicts over Bluff Park might destroy the Galiano Club have been advanced. A democratic organization such as the Galiano Club is more likely to perish through apathy than controversy. During past crises interest and membership in the Club has increased. Every time directors have had to be replaced as a result of a Park 'blow-up', able, fresh talent has been found. The latest Bluff Park controversy is an illustration; the interim Directors elected in the fall and the present Board elected in January include several outstanding people with extensive administrative experience in business, industry and government.

Both reports are otherwise helpful and deserve careful study by islanders before the meeting. The Directors of the Galiano Club have already done their homework in this respect. Their conclusions have been set out in a letter from Bill Duncan, President of the

Galiano Club, in the form of nine policy recommendations which a majority of the Board support. Essentially they advocate that the Directors of the Galiano Club continue to be responsible for the administration of the Bluff Trust Agreement, as is explicitly stated in paragraphs 1 and 2 of the Deed of Trust, to be their duty. He contends that the development of a clear and simple policy statement will relieve the Board of conflict of interest problems with regard to their duties to the Club and the Trust and that "the key to successful administration lies in the election of a strong Board of Directors, the responsibility for which rests with the members of the Club."

There should be no need to point out that the General Meeting is an extremely important one and that those planning to attend should bring with them the 'Pink', 'Yellow' and 'Green' papers which have been prepared and distributed by the Committee and the Directors. Membership dues for 1981 must have been paid if members wish to vote on any resolutions put to the Meeting.

COMING EVENTS

In addition to the two public

meetings to be held in the Community Hall on the 24th and 28th of April and discussed elsewhere in this column, islanders have a choice of several other activities scheduled to take place in the next few days.

On Saturday, April 25, the North End Community Club invites members to a 'Mattock Bee' beginning at about 1 pm. This rejuvenated organization is very active and it is wonderful to see the old community hall and community spirit coming to life again. The purpose of the work bee is to further extend the parking lot by grubbing out the stumps of the small trees which had invaded the area during its period of disuse. The Club's Contemporary Antiques Sale on Easter Saturday was well attended and raised about \$600. Bring your own mattock!

The Senior Citizens are planning an outing to Victoria to visit the Provincial Museum and dine out, on Monday, May 4, leaving on the 11:05 am ferry. Non-members of the Association are invited to join the group and anyone planning to attend should contact Les Woodbridge.
