

Two present concert

Creative tension might be the closest phrase to describe the music of Louise Escallier and Caroline

The two Salt Spring musicians presented an evening of original music May 26 at St. George's Hall. This was one concert of a three island tour sponsored by the Inter-Island Performing Arts Cooperation Society (I-IPACS).

Escallier is well known as a lounge singer throughout Vancouver Island. Rine is a relative

Both accomplished performers, the two bring totally different styles together, lock them up in often glittering harmonies and make the audience pay attention. It's not what you'd call relaxing music, but it's

decidedly interesting.
Escallier's warm and intimate alto voice balances a clear soprano from Rine. The two have obviously put much work into their fancy harmonic footwork. To a degree that saves some of their material from being too cerebral.

Escallier writes protest songs on such issues as the arms race and the Texada Island Genstar garbage battle. She throws in some uptempo blues and a few love songs.

Rine is a poet. Her lyrics are sometimes difficult and often haunting. If you don't mind the image avalanche, her original melody lines and modal guitar tunings make Rine's material fascinating.

Galiano and Saturna were the other two stops for Rine and Escallier, part of a music circuit I-IPACS hopes to make more active.



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Labour Minister Hon. Bob McClelland introduces

Labour Code Amendments:

To Assist B.C. in the New Economic Reality.

In British Columbia today, working people are facing up to the new economic reality. They want to keep working, without disruptions caused by actions beyond their control.

To help achieve this goal, the Provincial Government has introduced amendments to the Labour Code of British Columbia. They represent a fair, practical approach to the province's economic needs, and are an urgent element of the government's ongoing plan to lay a solid foundation for economic recovery.

 It is now clear that a politicallymotivated work stoppage is a strike under the Labour Code.

 Unions are now required to set fair and reasonable conditions for membership and a member is no longer subject to union discipline for refusing to participate in an illegal act.

 Communication between an employer and employees is now permitted, but adequate protection against coercion by employer or union is maintained.

• A representation vote is now mandatory and binding for all applications for a union to be granted long term certification. This ensures all employees of the right to decide by secret ballot whether or not they want to be represented by a union.

• The same mandatory and binding voting procedure is also required for

employees wishing to have a union decertified.

• Automatic certification is allowed with 55 per cent membership support on construction projects for the duration of the project.

• Prior approval is now required from the Labour Relations Board for all secondary picketing. And, secondary picketing is now limited to places where the employer tries to carry on his struck activities either at a second site, or at the site of an ally.

• The Cabinet can now designate important development projects so that employment opportunities are open to both union and non-union workers. This provision is being applied at Expo 86.

In total, these amendments to the Labour Code are designed to enhance job creation and job preservation for all British Columbians. As a result, they are a signal to B.C.'s emerging and current export trade partners, that the labour-management climate in our province is both maturing and stabilizing.

Practical and even-handed, these changes will realize the potential of the worker, because that is where we will find the knowledge, experience and energy to meet and challenge the new economic reality. They represent new conditions which will forge a new partnership between worker and employer.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

In a front-page editorial, Driftwood urged ratepayers of the Gulf Islands to support the upcoming school building referendum. The newspaper would be running regular features and photographs showing the need for the new facilities.

It was a dry May, reported Ganges weather watcher Howard Carlin. There had been only .58 inches of rain compared to the 2.38 inches of the previous year. Temperatures were lower as well. The high had been registered at 80 degrees and the low at 33 degrees. The previous May, the temperature range had been from 35 to 86 degrees.

Community planning would be the subject of a public meeting being called by the Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce. Don South, the director of planning for the municipal affairs department, would explain what planning could mean to the community. The advantages, and disadvantages, of planning would be talked about.

Pirate Days would entertain islanders and visitors for three days in August. Plans were being formed by a committee headed by C.R. Horel. The street dance would be the feature of Friday evening under the direction of Joe Nickerson. On Saturday, the events would shift to Fulford for a barbecue and another dance.

The Fathom Phantoms went to Nanaimo for a competition. Steve Lafortune took second place in the event. Lyle Brown and Don Irwin accompanied him. The events were being staged to come up with representatives for a diving competition to be held in the U.S.

Children of St. Mark's Sunday School had sent \$10 to the World Missions for Children. The money was used to help children in an orphanage in Austria. A letter of thanks came back to the Sunday school from the mission.

OAPO members went on a bus tour of Salt Spring. The tours would be conducted on a regular basis throughout the summer by Harvey Reynolds, owner of Bill's Taxi in Ganges. For this tour, 30 members of the seniors group toured the north end of the island.

Fifteen Years Ago

The board of management of Lady Minto Hospital met to choose new officers for the year. Doug Cavaye of Salt Spring was chosen to repeat his term as chairman. The vice-chairman would be Joan Purchase of Pender Island. Cavaye would also head the building committee which was planning new construction for the health facility.

Papajohn reported from Saturna on the efforts of the children from the school in the Outer Islands interschool competitions. Several of the children were III, he noted, which made things difficult for the Saturna group. John Davidson won the



spelling bee for Grade 4 and came second in the Grade 5 competition. Dave Jack took the group to Pender on his boat for the events.

A two-vehicle collision on a road at the north end of Galiano sent Mary Backlund to Lady Minto Hospital where she recovered from numerous bruises. The driver of the other vehicle, Bill Perritt, was taken to a Vancouver hospital.

St. Paul's Catholic Church in Fulford was the scene of a presentation to Father Kevin Wiseman. The congregation of the parish gave him a gift of appreciation because he was leaving the island for new duties in Saanich. His replacement on Salt Spring would be Father Frank Sutherland.

The Community Hall on Mayne Island was transformed by a volunteer work party. The crew, 10 ladies and eight men, painted, hung paper and cleaned to fix up the hall for the coming year's events.

The Delta Community Band was coming to Salt Spring for a concert. The band had become a favorite with islanders and would be sponsored by the Lions Club. The 100 members of the band intended to bring families and have a picnic after the concert

The truck was being used to help string high-voltage cables across Salt Spring. When it moved on to the beach at Quebec Drive, it found a soft spot in the sand and began to sink. Three bulldozers and a crane were required to pull the truck out.

Ten Years Ago

Parents of Outer Island students attending school on Salt Spring were concerned about the cost of boarding their children on the island. The cost of boarding was set at \$75 per month and parents had to cover \$37.50 of that. A mother from Galiano, with three students at high school, was required to pay \$112.50 per month. The school board would check to see if the province would pay a larger share of the cost.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that plans and activities for the Saturna barbecue were being put in motion. The annual July I event, with Jim Campbell as chairman, would welcome many visitors for a feast.

The Gulf Islands Branch of the B.C. Historial Association elected Lorraine Campbell, of Saturna, as president. She would head the eightman executive. The group discussed reprinting the popular Gulf Islands Patchwork but costs from various publishers were too high and the project was put on hold for the time

The Salt Spring Singers planned an afternoon concert for residents of the extended care wing of Lady Minto Hospital. The 12 singers would be under the direction of Ruth Barker.

The Outer Islands Sports Day was held at the Saturna School grounds. More than 150 children from the four schools of the Outer Islands competed in various events. Children from the Pender Island School won the trophies. Arthur Ralph, 89, welcomed the visitors in his capacity as unofficial mayor of Saturna.

Space at the Pender Island School would be at a premium in September. The Gulf Islands School Board was looking at ways to build new classrooms quickly. The school trustees were calling for proposals from contractors to fill the need.

The bean supper at Beaver Point attracted 380 people who consumed 86 lbs. of beans and many pies and buns. A lineup stretched from the door at the 6 pm deadline with the result that some people were turned away. The evening ended with a
