



## Federation of Canadian Artists end two successful weeks of seminars here

The paint is dry and the painters have left for home.

Fifth annual seminar has closed after two successful weeks on Salt Spring Island. Every segment of the island has been committed to paper or canvas and some 200 students have returned home to their own studies.

Some painted in oils and others settled for water colours, but the program was the same. For six and a half days the artists lived their work from nine in the morning until nine at night. It was no idle holiday.

The Federation of Canadian Artists' annual summer school of art was launched on Salt Spring Island five years ago by Allan Edwards, who has spent his life with painting and interior decoration. It was Edwards who spoke for a summer school site on Salt Spring Island a year or more ago. The project was not successful at the time, but the retired artist has no intention of abandoning his dreams for a permanent home for the arts here. He is still committed to the plan.

### BIG ENROLMENT

Five years ago his initial project of an annual seminar attracted students from many parts of Western Canada. This year the lists were full when 88 enrolled for each of the two seminars. Students who wanted to take part were unable to enroll after the classes were filled.

The courses have been so successful that Edwards announced last week that plans are already in hand for the summer school next

year to run for three weeks.

In addition to the nearly 90 students taking part there were also a dozen or so instructors. When the two banquets were held in Harbour House Hotel they were attended by more than 100 diners.

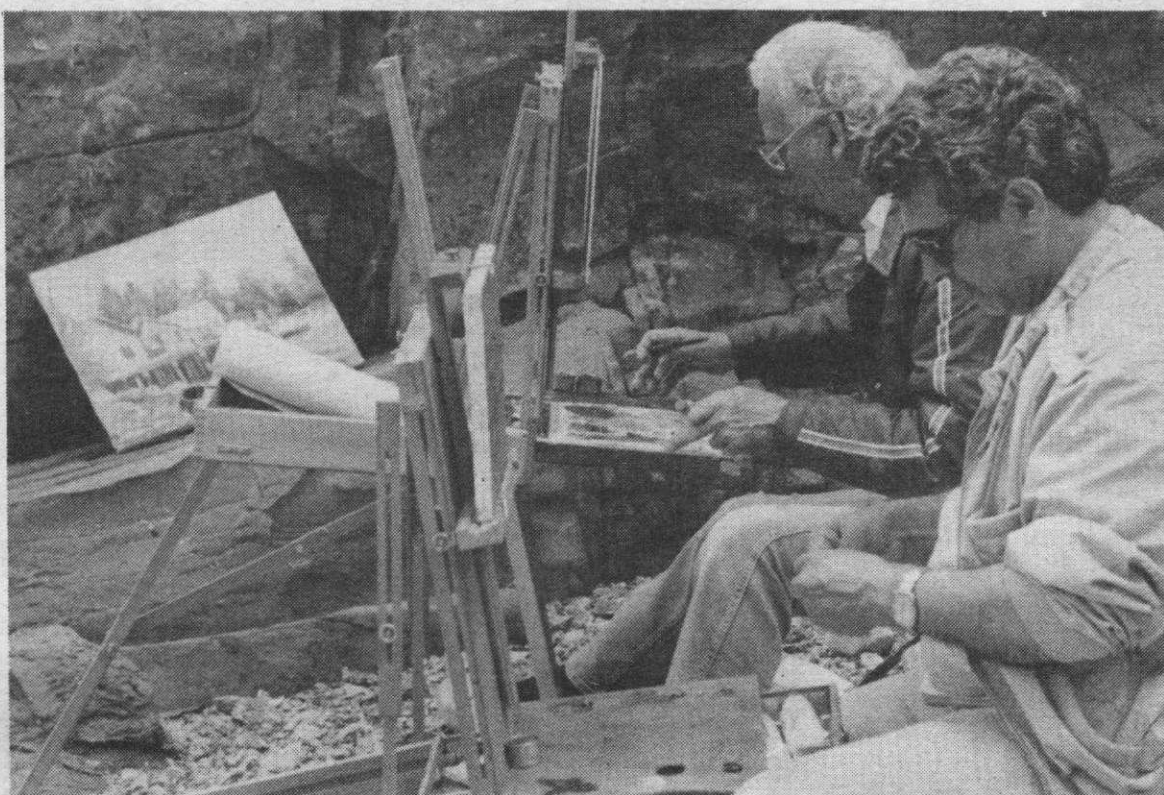
The successful island seminars are recorded in statistics, but to the students who attend they are more alive than any list of accomplishments. There are students who have attended the courses faithfully for all five years. There are others who enroll for both seminars each year. The summer school at Salt Spring Island is an opportunity to meet old friends and to continue this addiction to committing to paint what the eye sees of the world around.

### COMMUNITY PARTICIPATES

Two island galleries take part in the seminars. Ewart Gallery and Pegasus Gallery on Salt Spring Island both offer awards to students and Bill and Beth McDonald, of the Ewart Gallery, also provided a wine and cheese party during the seminars.

Instructors came from British Columbia, with some from further afield, including California and Hawaii.

It was for Allan Edwards to summarize the success and the popularity of the programs. Go to California or New York and in the world of art and painting they have already heard of the summer school of painting here on Salt Spring Island, he said.

## Unit answers 13 calls in nine days

The Ganges coast guard unit answered 13 calls during the first nine days of July to bring the number for the year to 87.

A distress call took the crew to the Secretary Islands in Trincomali Channel to aid a small child. The seven-week-old baby was on a sailboat when the boat broke down.

The emergency call went out and the crew took the child to the Fernwood dock on Salt Spring where an ambulance waited to take it to Lady Minto Hospital.

In the same vicinity, a 27-foot cruiser broke from its mooring and drifted down Trincomali Channel to the entrance of Navy Channel. At that point the wind and the tide

reversed and the boat drifted back up Trincomali.

The coast guard caught up with the wandering cruiser near Wallace Island.

A May Day from a sinking vessel in Sansum Narrows on the west side of Salt Spring attracted unexpected help for the coast guard. The rubber vessel, *Ganges I*, went to answer the call, as did the tug *Papco I* and the log sorting vessel *Charger*. Both were sent out by Salt Spring Log Sorting in Burgoyne Bay.

The vessel in distress was almost awash and drifting towards Booth Bay when it was finally reached. The rescue vessels pushed it ashore and salvage operation got under way.

The coast guard was assured that

S.S. Log Sorting would render assistance for calls on the west coast of Salt Spring if needed.

Last Saturday night, three flares were sighted and rescue operations put into motion. But when the coast guard and a craft from B.C. Lifeboat Society tracked down the source of the flares, it turned out to be visitors from south of the line celebrating July 4 a bit late.

In addition to the rubber craft *Ganges I*, which is equipped with two 50-horsepower engines and is capable of 35 knots, the coast guard rescue station uses the vessel *Moorehen*. The regular vessel, the 122, is in drydock being refitted for increased speed and more stability during winter weather.

## BOOK REVIEW

# New islands history followed study for master's degree at UVic

*Mayne Island and the Outer Gulf Islands, A History* by Marie Elliott.

Pioneer heritage, says Marie Elliott, a descendant of two early Mayne Island families, combines a sense of pride with a measure of accountability.

To prove her own accountability, she has written a book about the history of Mayne Island. The book, *Mayne Island and the Outer Gulf Islands, A History*, covers the story of more than 100 years of living on Mayne.

"Repeat once too often the anecdotes handed down from generation to generation and you become suspected of telling less than the truth," she writes in the preface to the book. The book was written to verify old stories "and to save a few reputations", she wrote.

It began while she was studying for her master's degree at the University of Victoria. She gathered material about life on early Mayne for her master's thesis which won her a Leon J. Ladner Scholarship in Local History in 1983.

Since that time, she has produced more research and talked to many people to write the book.

Elliott traces her heritage through to the families of Thomas Bennett and William Collinson who were pioneers of the island.

The text of the book is broken into five sections to cover various periods of the history of settlement on Mayne and the other Outer Islands. It begins with the miners who sought shelter on Mayne on their way to the Cariboo gold rush in 1858.

Special attention is paid to the

decade between 1950 and 1960 which Elliott labels *A Decade of Disruption*. It was during that period that many problems of ferry service and subsequent development of the islands sprouted and grew.

But, she notes, "Future years would prove that this seemingly difficult period was actually the lull before the storm..."

And the storm occurred between 1960 and 1980 when pressure from the urban areas surrounding the Gulf Islands became greater than ever.

Elliott weaves an interesting story about Mayne Island from the time when many miners, disappointed in the Cariboo, filed pre-emptions on land on Mayne through to the time of the fledgling Islands Trust as it attempted to deal with its mandate.

Elliott sets up the past as a prologue for serious questions about the future of the Gulf Islands.

In the conclusion she asks a question.

"In a moral context, the islands can be seen as pieces of a larger puzzle: what rights do rural areas have in the face of urban demands for recreation and housing?"

Throughout the book, Elliott uses the same technique of prodding the reader into asking such questions. She offers no solutions but leaves it to that questioning reader to reach for answers.

"The next 20 years," she concludes, "will be a time of serious probing and compromise as the solutions to these problems are sought by residents of the Gulf Islands, members of the Islands Trust, and related provincial and federal ministries."

*Mayne Island and the Outer Gulf Islands, A History* was published by Gulf Islands Press and comes complete with chapter notes and an index. The book is available in softcover.

## Island Savings plans new Victoria branch

Duncan-based Island Savings Credit Union has announced plans to open a new branch in Victoria in October.

The new branch, to be located in the extension of the Mayfair Shopping Centre, will offer full banking services and insurance through its subsidiary, Island Savings Insurance Services. The

branch will also have three Exchange automated teller machines (ATM's), two of which will be lobby units, offering in-branch account access for deposits and withdrawals.

Meanwhile, construction has begun at Ganges on a new building for the credit union's Salt Spring branch, where provision is being made for installation of ATM's at a later date.

Island Savings general manager Ray Bush told *Driftwood* on Monday that there are no immediate plans to install the machines at the Ganges branch. The credit union plans to wait and see how the system goes in the higher traffic branches. The machines have been installed at Duncan and Mill Bay.

Bush said response to the ATM's has been "better than anticipated." He also noted that "a tremendous number" of Exchange cards have been activated by Salt Spring Island residents.

Island Savings and five other B.C. credit unions are affiliated with the Exchange ATM network, which offers cardholders international, interbank access to their accounts from more than 5,000 locations.

There are currently 40 automated teller machines in B.C., all of which are located on the Lower Mainland and on southern Vancouver Island.

## Former NDP leader is recovering

Tommy Douglas is getting better. In fair condition in an Ontario hospital, the former leader of the New Democratic Party is recovering from injuries sustained several weeks ago when he was hit by a bus in Ottawa.

Douglas is 79.

Premier of Saskatchewan for many years, he turned to national affairs and was the member of parliament for Nanaimo, Cowichan and the Islands for several terms.

Douglas is widely known among the islands, where he has many friends and admirers.

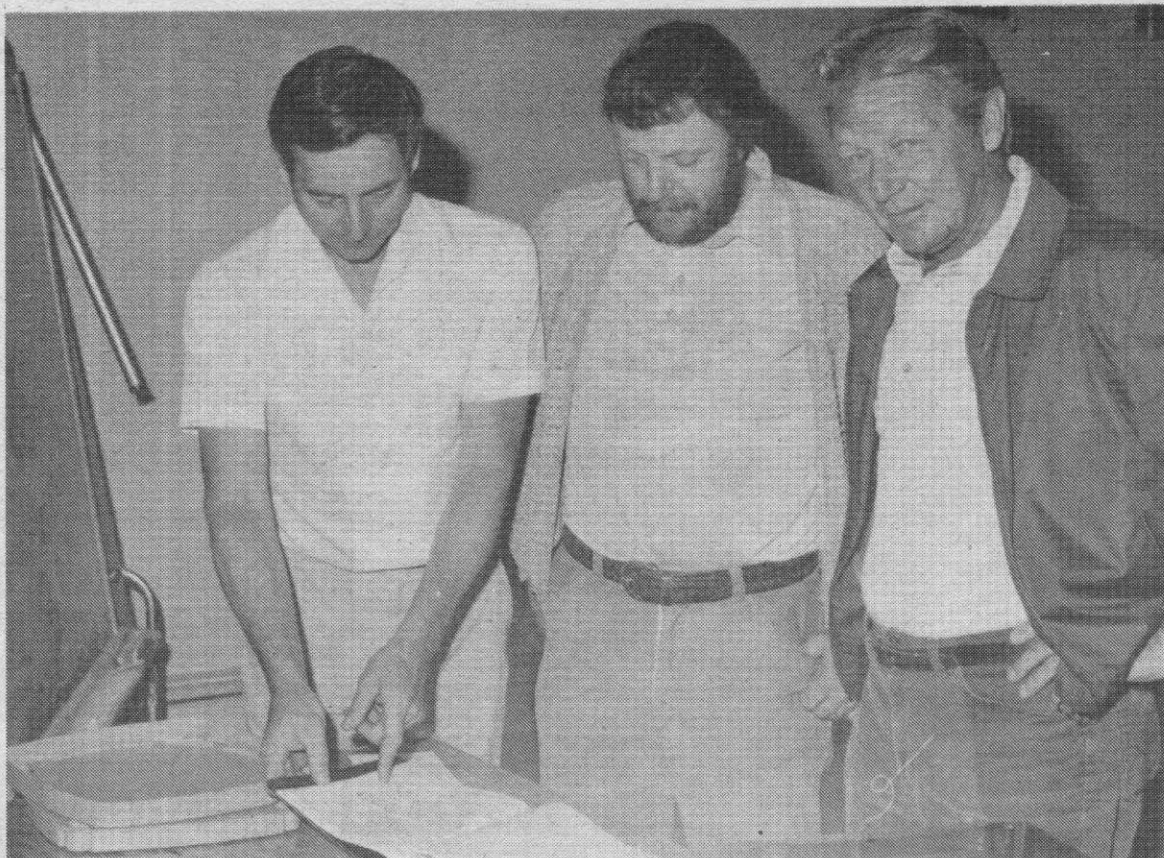

## Channel change felt here, says Phillips

If the proposed change of channels for television station CKVU is allowed, reception on Salt Spring Island will be "dead in the water," says Grace Byrne.

The Salt Spring resident went to the hearing of the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) recently to add her voice to the protest over the proposed channel.

CKVU was applying to move from UHF channel 21 to VHF channel 10. The television company said the move would help to increase

its potential viewing audience by 183,000 people.

But opponents of the scheme said the move would eliminate the popular Public Broadcasting Service, channel 9, from Seattle. A petition containing 23,000 names had been forwarded to the CRTC in support of maintaining reception of PBS in this area.

Jeff Phillips of Salt Spring Cablevision told *Driftwood* that the proposed change, with an antenna on Mount Bruce, would interfere with reception in Fulford and

eliminate channel 9, PBS, for Ganges cable subscribers.

Engineers testifying at the CRTC hearing in support of the channel change said cable companies could avoid losing channel 9 by adding low-cost filters, quad antennae and modern electronics to their reception facilities.

But that costs, said Phillips. "You can't pass everything on to the subscribers".

Phillips said a possible solution, but also costly, would be to skip the signal from PBS channel 9 through Orcas Island. But each "hop" would cost \$50,000, he said.

The hearing ended with no decision yet from the CRTC.

# Stonecutter's Ridge artifacts on display at museum

Artifacts found at Stonecutter's Ridge on Salt Spring Island are displayed at the Bittancourt Heritage House Museum for the summer.

The artifacts were recovered by Simon Henson who conducted a dig at the north-end site in an effort to learn more about the men who quarried sandstone for shipment from the island in the 1860's.

But that is just one of the displays at the Salt Spring museum, located on the Farmers' Institute property on Rainbow Road. It is open each weekend and on holidays from 11 am until 4 pm.

Another display features a series of photographs of the homes of early settlers on Salt Spring. Each photo is connected to a map to pinpoint the location of the homes. A booklet, *Times Past*, describes the houses which were built before the turn of the century, many of which still stand.

On loan from the provincial

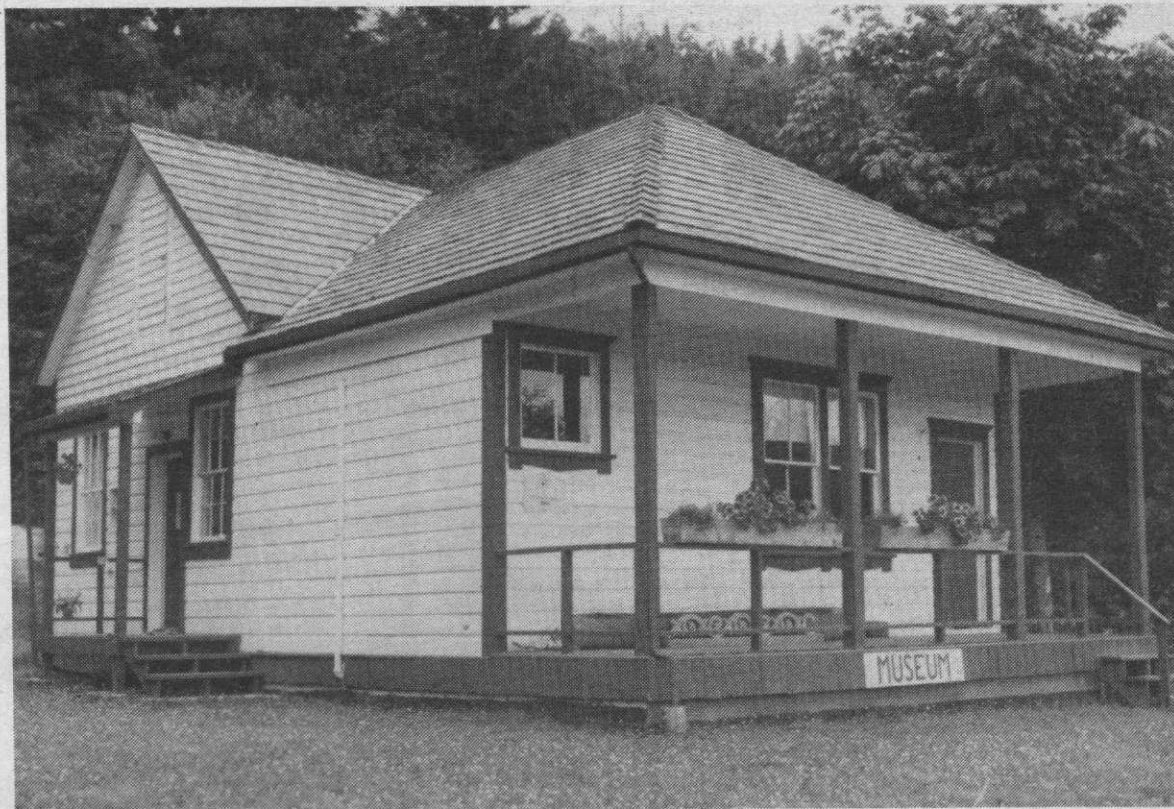

museum is a display of early locks and lock-up devices. Another photo depicts Henry Sampson, Salt Spring's first policeman. Included are the handcuffs which Sampson used in his duties.

The Salt Spring Museum Society is organizing the displays in the museum and seeks support from island residents who are interested in collecting and preserving articles, photographs and other items which help tell the story of settlement on Salt Spring.

Many of the photos on display were developed by Larry Scarfe and Hank Lantinga. The photos were mounted by Graham Cartwright with help from Salt Spring Elementary School.

The museum is staffed by volunteers who have information available to help visitors enjoy the displays. Admission to the museum is free but donations are always welcome.



The Bittancourt Heritage House is home to the Salt Spring Museum. The building was transferred to its

current location from Vesuvius where it had been built prior to 1900 by the Bittancourt family. The

museum sits on the Farmers' Institute property on Rainbow Road.

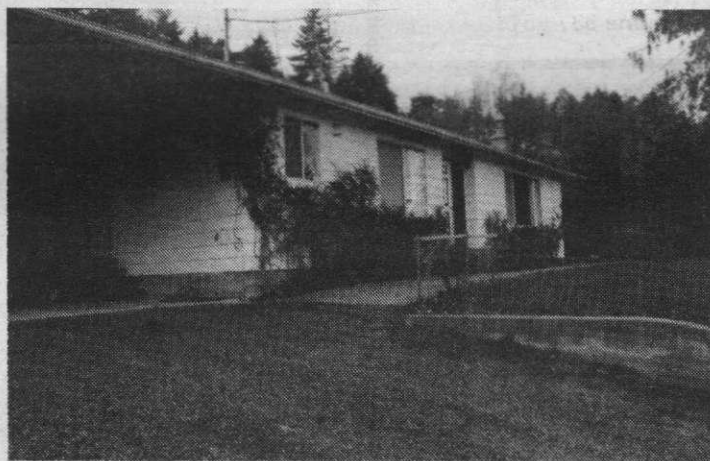


Tools used by pioneers of Salt Spring to clear the land and create farms and homes are on display at the museum.

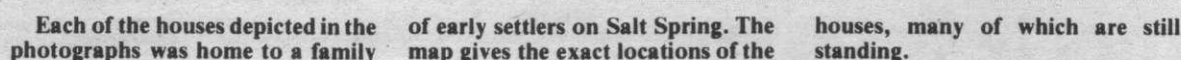

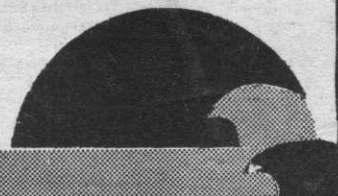

## Lingcod tagging continues

The second year of a three-year lingcod tagging study has just been completed by the department of fisheries and oceans.

The tagging is being undertaken by fisheries research staff at the Pacific Biological Station in Nanaimo to determine migration habits and abundance of lingcod in Georgia Strait.

A total of 6,600 lingcod have been tagged with a small yellow plastic tube implanted on the left side just below the first dorsal fin. Following tagging, the fish were released in the Campbell River, Stuart Channel and Pender Harbour areas.

Anyone finding a tagged lingcod is asked to keep the tag, make a note

of the date, location and method of capture and contact Al Cass or Sandy McFarlane at the Pacific Biological Station.

A small reward is offered for the return of tags and tag recovery information. In addition, to encourage the reporting of lingcod tag recoveries, rewards of \$100 are being awarded each year for a number of randomly selected tags.

## Weight restriction

# Down Through the Years with Driftwood

## Twenty Years Ago

The **Saturna lamb barbecue** attracted more than 1,000 people to feed and have fun. Breezy Bay contained about 100 vessels of various sizes and shapes and the hungry people waited patiently for a share of the two dozen lambs.

**Pirate Days** on Salt Spring had been cancelled due to lack of support and interest. Chuck Horel told *Driftwood* that interest in organizing the event had dropped off and the committee felt it best to allow the celebration to lapse for a year or so.

**Cold and cloudy** described the weather for June, said Ganges weatherwatcher Howard Carlin. The high and low for the month stood at 76 and 46 degrees compared with the range of 85 to 46 degrees for the previous year. Rainfall fell to a depth of 1.87 inches. The year before there had been 1.76 inches. Only 10 days of the month saw sunshine, he reported.

The **Salt Spring golf team** led the field for the inter-island Bambrick's Memorial Trophy. The team, under captain Walter Carlson, had 21 points followed by the Pender team with 16 and Galiano with 11. With two games of the series played, the final set of matches would be held at the Galiano Golf Club.

A **donation** of \$61 to the library fund came from the Catholic Women's League on Salt Spring. Mrs. G. St. Denis, president of the CWL, presented the cheque to Mrs. F.H. Hawkins who represented the library board. The CWL raised the money on a draw for a lawn chair.

The **Rod and Gun Club** fishing derby continued. Laurie Mouat caught the big one for the week with a 13 pounder. Vic Jackson's 15½-pound salmon still led with Nels Deggen in second place.

The **annual meeting** of Salt Spring Recreational Holdings Ltd. saw the elections of officers. President-elect would be B. Markham with H. Giegerich as vice-president, M.F. Peiler as secretary and D. Cavaye as treasurer. They decided to turn the application for a tennis court over to the executive of the Golf and Country Club.

## Fifteen Years Ago

The **four young adventurers** sailed their raft around Salt Spring Island. They had set sail from Cranberry Outlet on June 28 and returned the following Saturday. At Fernwood, the four—Peter Ramsey, Jay McManus and Doug and Steve Anderson—slept in a tent on shore only to find that their raft

had drifted away during the night. It was recovered at Walker Hook and the journey continued without mishap around Southey Point to their destination.

**Ferry service** for large trucks between Vancouver Island and Vesuvius was cut short by a load restriction of 20,000 pounds. Ministry of transportation officials imposed the limit when they discovered that such things as loaded cement trucks were using the wharf and ferry. The wharf, they explained, had been designed for a load limit of 250 pounds per square foot which worked out to 10 tons gross vehicle weight. The big trucks would have to go through Swartz Bay in order to get to Salt Spring.

**Papajohn** reported from Saturna that he kept a pencil and a scrap of paper in his shirt pocket to note any newsworthy items. He apologized for the shortness of his report: Granmarie washed his shirt without looking in the pockets.

**Hot.** That was June, said Ganges weatherwatcher Howard Carlin. High temperature reached 86 degrees on two days and dipped to a low of 48 degrees. Rain measured 0.9 inches. The previous year recorded a high and low of 72 and 43 degrees with 1.88 inches of rain.

The **Mayne School** held a year-end picnic with 30 people in attendance. David Bradley hosted the Campbell Bay event. Laurie Beveridge supplied the cake. Top students were Arnold Aitken and Laurie Beveridge. Every pupil passed.

## Ten Years Ago

The **federal election** was over and results showed Tommy Douglas, New Democrat, had taken the Nanaimo-Cowichan-The Islands seat. Votes in the islands were counted in favour of Progressive Conservative Don Taylor by 300 ballots. Douglas managed to outpoll the second-place Tory by 2,000 votes across the riding and was one of two New Democrats elected in B.C.

**Road repairs** would happen on both Pender and Mayne Islands, said highways minister Graham Lea. Gravel would be trucked to the island for the program which would begin in the spring.

The **plan** was to clear stream beds on Salt Spring and Gavin Reynolds didn't stop until he had the funds to do it. With a Local Initiatives Program grant, Reynolds hired 12 people to clear fallen trees and brush from the streams. For six months, from January to June, the crew cleaned 50,000 feet of stream beds.

The **Mayne Island Lions** held their third annual salmon derby and 23 fish were weighed in. H. Hiltz caught a salmon weighing 21 lbs., 8 oz. for first prize. Event chairman Bob Sauerberg awarded the hidden weight prize to C. Hamlin who took a 14 lb., 6 oz. fish to come close to the weight of 14 lbs., 2 oz.

**Papajohn** reported from Saturna that life on the island was returning to normal following the annual lamb barbecue. The work crews headed by the Campbells and the Moneys fed close to 1,200 people. Along with the barrels of tea and coffee, the refreshment garden sold out.

**Cusheon Lake** on Salt Spring was for drinking, not for swimming, complained a resident near the lake. The unnamed protester claimed that many swimmers needed a bath before they entered the lake and as such, were health hazards.

The **Pender golf team** won the inter-island trophy with a score of 901 for the three games. Salt Spring, with 879, came second and the Galiano crew scored 812 for third spot.

## Five Years Ago

The **choice** was either build a new school on Galiano Island or renovate the school in place. The Gulf Islands School Board heard that the electrical system was inadequate, and both the plumbing and the structure were doubtful. While the trustees studied the problem, the exterior of the school would be painted.

**Dog licences** were available on Saturna Island, said animal control officer Bill Leach. But residents wondered at the need when there was no pound and no dog catcher on the island. A dog with a licence can be as annoying as a dog without, noted one resident.

The **garbage cans** in Ganges would be crow-proof. The Rotary Club paid for the containers which were made by students of the high school under the supervision of Laurie Neish. Dr. Claus Andress had headed the committee responsible for the cans and helped Neish install the first one.

The **disaster** looked real with three cars apparently in collision on Salt Spring. The session was an exercise to test the response of the emergency services on the island.

The **salmon derby** held by the Salt Spring Rod and Gun Club was won by Mike Spencer with a 19 lb., 6 oz. fish. Largest cod was landed by Don Geistlinger at 28 lbs., 8 oz. Phil Tamboline won the two gold bars.

## Energy Data

### Energy Efficient Swimming Pools

If you have an outdoor swimming pool, your summer energy requirements may be triple those of a household without a pool. With such a sizeable amount of energy being consumed, conservation can add up to big savings.

Here are some tips for operating your pool more efficiently. Heating makes up most of a pool's energy use, but much of that heat may be wasted if the pool is kept uncovered. The solution? A floating swimming pool cover, available from pool suppliers. A pool cover saves energy by maintaining the temperature of the water when the pool is not in use. But the cover must fit well to work effectively. Be sure it comes to within a couple of inches of the pool edge.

The money you'll save by using your pool cover depends on a number of factors: how long you keep it in place; the temperature you maintain; the size and shape of your pool; and whether it is shaded or sheltered. Suppose yours is a typical pool, 5 metres by 10 metres with an average depth of 1.8 metres (16 by 32 by 6 ft.). If you maintain a temperature of 26°C (79°F) in your pool over June, July and August, and if you keep a pool cover on for 16 hours a day, you can expect to save about 60% on typical pool heating costs. Over a longer swimming season (May to September), your heating costs will be cut in half. Savings will be reduced if you cover your pool for less than the 16 hours mentioned; at 12 hours a day, the savings above will be reduced by about 25%.

Lowering the temperature of the pool is another way to save money. For typical pool activity, a temperature of 26°C (79°F) is recommended. For vigorous swimming, 22°C (72°F) may be adequate, and the lowered temperature will save you 65% on heating costs. If the pool is used mainly for relaxing, a temperature of 30°C (86°F) may be preferred, but this would use 75% more energy than having the pool at 26°C.

If the pool is in a windy location, you could be losing a significant amount of heat when the pool is uncovered. The wind will chill both water and swimmers, and you will need more energy for heating. Nearby trees or a high fence are the best ways to block the prevailing wind, but make sure the water is not shaded from the warmth of the sun. Having the pool located close to a building or within a fenced or treed yard will also help, but here the shelter is further away and thus less effective.

Solar energy offers another way to save on pool heating. It also cuts down on the use of non-renewable energy resources.

Your swimming pool absorbs heat from the sun and acts as a passive storage tank. Take advantage of the solar energy available: leave the pool uncovered on sunny days, and be sure it isn't shaded. At night, or on cloudy days when the pool isn't being used, remember to cover it up.

With an active solar system, solar collecting panels are installed to absorb the sun's heat. Water from the pool is circulated through the panels, and the heat is transferred to the water. This kind of system can provide up to 100% of needed heat during good summer weather. Over a period of years, a solar collector will pay for itself.

Above-ground pools present a special problem because of the increased heat loss through the metal sides of the pool. You may need 30% more energy for heating than you would with an in-ground pool. If you install an RSI 1.2 (R7) layer of insulation on the outside of the pool structure, you can cut the additional heating requirement in half. A 50 mm (2") layer of foam insulation will do the job admirably.

In addition to the costs for pool heating, the energy consumption of the pump contributes significantly to operating costs. Many pools are equipped with a 3/4 horsepower pump which runs 24 hours a day, circulating water through a filter unit and a pool heater. You can save energy and save money by reducing the operating cycle to 12 hours or less a day, which should be adequate. For convenience, just attach a timer to the pool pump.

The preceding hints should help you have your pool and heat it too—and you'll do it as economically as possible. More detailed information on floating swimming pool covers, energy efficient operation of residential outdoor swimming pools, and various aspects of solar heating is available in B.C. Hydro data sheets.

*Dorrie and the Haunted House*  
by Patricia Coombs.

This book is about a young witch named Dorrie who rescues the source of the witch's power from robbers and generally saves the day.

There's a lot to be discovered.

The pictures in this book are so cute and the characters so adorable that I think most kids would enjoy it. Also it has a quality with which most people can relate—not having any friends.

Also the poem on the last page provides a good moral that both kids and adults should follow.

*Little Chief* by Syd Hoff.

*Little Chief* is about an Indian boy by that name who undergoes an adventure quite typical in children's books. While playing hunter, Little Chief makes friends with a friendly buffalo.

But human friends are what he really wants so he sets off to find some. He meets some settlers' children and they have lots of fun playing games.

Eventually, though, he disappoints his new friends when his raundance doesn't work. He saves face, though, when he saves the children from a buffalo herd, led by Little Chief's buffalo friend.

This book is not terribly original but I think kids would enjoy it because of the happy ending and the ideas that kids can relate to. Although the wording in the book is quite repetitive, I take it kids don't mind much because of the popularity of Dr. Seuss books.

*I Can Lick 30 Tigers Today* by Doctor Seuss.

This book is about a boy who,

when feeling great, claims he could "lick" 30 tigers that day.

As he is faced with 30 real tigers he quickly makes up a dozen excuses about he can't beat up a certain amount of tigers and eventually ends up with only one. This tiger he deals with by saying he has to go for lunch.

This book is really funny because the hero's bravery is whittled away very easily when he's actually confronted with these huge, angry tigers. Also the excuses he makes up to get rid of the tigers are utterly ridiculous and quite clever on his part.

Such as; "You're fingernails aren't clean!", "You're too small" and "It's mean beating up so many tigers!"

I think this book is really enjoyable for young children and I know that I really liked it when I was younger.

## Not enough interest for French program expansion

The French immersion program will not expand to Fernwood and Fulford Elementary Schools, the Gulf Islands School Board heard recently.

When parents of pupils to be enrolled in the school schools as of September expressed interest in the program, the school trustees decided to find out how many would be there.

Mike Marshall, superintendent of schools, contacted the parents and found that only about a dozen pupils from both schools would be part of the proposed program. The

school board had decided at an earlier meeting that the minimum registration for French immersion would be 15 pupils in each school.

Marshall noted that there were "insufficient numbers" and to extend the program would be "premature".

Parents interested in having their children in the French immersion program will have to send them to Salt Spring Elementary School.

Marshall also announced that the ministry of education had assigned a French monitor to the school district. The French program in Gulf Islands schools is considered to be one of the better such programs in the province, he said.

The monitor would be bilingual with emphasis on French and would check regularly on the progress of pupils. Funding for the monitor comes mostly from the federal government with the province paying part of the cost.

Discussions continue with parents on the Outer Islands for French immersion there. The same 15-pupil criteria has been set.

## Biffy may cost \$500 to move

The biffy is partially on the property line and will have to be moved.

The Salt Spring Parks and Recreation Commission was told recently that the men's toilet in Drummond Park in Fulford will have to be moved. Phil Hume told the meeting that the move could cost as much as \$500.

The toilet is solidly constructed and will be difficult to relocate, he said.

"It's quite a hassle," Hume explained of the moving job, "and we've thought about burning it down."

The commission decided to have an island contractor look at the problem and to suggest how the toilet can be moved.
