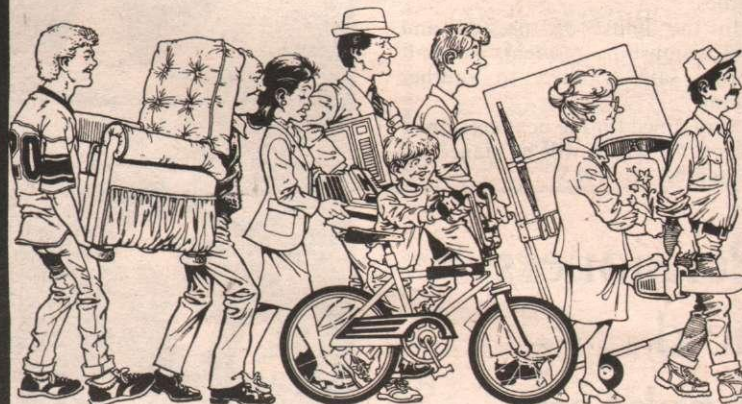

Curtis to be at Ganges October 5 to hear submissions on taxation

Finance Minister Hugh Curtis will be in Ganges on October 5 as part of a tour of the province to listen to people talk about taxes.

The 10-week tour of 27 centres in the province forms part of a review of how taxes affect economic development. Curtis announced in his budget address in February that the series of public meetings would be part of that process.

The Ganges meeting is in the board room of the school district office and will begin at 9 am.

The finance ministry has produced a booklet entitled *Taxation and Economic Development: Background Information for a Consultative Process*.

The paper offers information on business taxation in B.C. and is intended to help those who will be presenting their views on the impact of taxes on economic development at the public meetings.

Copies of the paper are available in the government office in Ganges or from the Queen's Printer Bookstore on Government Street in Victoria.

The paper compares the level of taxation in Canada with that of selected countries as well as taxes in B.C. with the national average. Also

part of the paper are the findings of a taxation study which looked at tax levels on various types of businesses in several jurisdictions.

For instance, a comparison of the tax levels of the 10 provinces shows that B.C. taxes personal income at a relatively low rate but corporate income taxes are on the high side.

Consumption taxes such as sales, fuel and tobacco taxes in B.C. are also at the low end of the national scale.

In the preface to the background paper, Curtis notes: "No specific taxation proposals are contained in this background material. Indeed, it would be inappropriate for the government to make specific proposals before receiving the input of those interested in, and affected by, taxation."

He issues an invitation to "concerned British Columbians" to submit either a written or verbal brief at one of the meetings.

He also noted: "It must be stressed, however, that the government's fundamental concern is with further development of the economy."

"Those advocating tax reductions

should be prepared to show what economic advantages tax reductions would convey, particularly in terms of creation of new permanent employment opportunities for British Columbia."

The submissions will be reviewed as part of the government's intention to develop and introduce a limited number of reforms to the tax system in the province over the next couple of years.

The reforms will be aimed at simplifying the tax system in order to encourage job creation in the private sector.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty years ago

Two new buses would cost the Gulf Islands School Board \$13,000 each. The buses would be equipped with extra equipment to make them suitable for island roads and would carry 67 children each. The buses were slated for service on Salt Spring and would be delivered within 90 days.

The three hunters went after deer but shot a cougar on their first day out. Jim Spencer shot the big cat in the Cranberry area of Salt Spring. He had been hunting deer with Howard Byron and Peter Stevens. The killing of the cougar ended fears held by sheep farmers on the island. The cat had been killing sheep and other livestock for several weeks.

The Lady Minto Hospital Auxiliary raised more than \$900 which would be spent on a wide range of items for use at the hospital. The event was held in Mahon Hall and the usual large crowd showed up. Mrs. W. E. Dipple was convener and was assisted by Mrs. M. Atkins and Mrs. D. Wilson. There were 35 volunteer salesladies.

The 10-ton truck had been parked on Scott Road on Salt Spring while the driver retrieved a glove which had fallen to the roadside. When he climbed back into the cab and started to leave, the truck ran over a Volkswagen. The driver of the small car had pulled up behind the truck and the truck driver did not see it as he backed up. Damage was estimated at \$450.

The Fulford Belles gained vengeance on the ladies from Ganges. The score of the softball game was so one-sided that it was not released. The Fulford nine won the Rose Bowl donated to the game by Bob Akerman.

The Legion scholarship was worth \$300 to Gail Slingsby of Fulford. The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. D. L. Slingsby was attending the University of Victoria with plans to become an English teacher.

Fifteen years ago

Ferry service to the mainland from the Gulf Islands returned to the winter schedule of two trips per day. The *Queen of the Islands* would take over the task of transporting cars and people to the mainland. The *Sechelt Queen* returned to her run on the Sunshine Coast but terminal agent Bob Anderson said the larger boat could be back for the Thanksgiving weekend.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that the old Newall place had fallen into ruin. John Bentum dismantled the house and all that was left standing was a chimney with a chair balanced on top. On the chair sat a beer bottle but Papajohn reassured everyone that the bottle was empty.

The Canadian Women's Press Club, under president Bea Hamilton of Fulford, would be hosting a luncheon to honour Charlotte Whitton of Ottawa. Mary Backlund of Galiano reported that the luncheon would be held in

Victoria in October.

Montague Harbour Park on Galiano would be home to 500 Boy Scouts and 100 leaders for a weekend. The youths would be participating in a weekend camporee. Donald New of Galiano was named honorary assistant camp chief. The boys would come from the lower mainland and Washington State.

The Centennial Committee for Salt Spring had been named and a chairman chosen. Rev. Fred Anderson would chair the committee and Robert Akerman would be vice-chairman. Directors would be Capt. E. Anderson, Art Simons, T.E. Marcus and Frank Richards. The group was seeking a suitable project to celebrate B. C.'s 100 years as a province of Canada.

Ten years ago

When the school bus drove by the tree house on Walker Hook Road on Salt Spring, Dean Cornwall spotted the fire. He called for the bus driver to stop and Robbie Cannon ran to Laurie Neish's home to call the volunteers of the fire department. Fire was blamed on students who had taken a last puff on cigarettes before catching a school bus.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that the roof had been installed on the new addition to the community hall. Jim Money brought a tar machine and called for volunteers to coat the roof. Harvey Jensen, Peter Wheeler, Ben Hendy and JoAnn House did the job.

The Mayne Island school children were going to classes in shifts. There were 60 pupils occupying two rooms with three teachers in charge. The system would continue until a new classroom was built. The same situation occurred at the Pender school but the additional classroom there was almost complete.

Salt Spring Singers were looking forward to their second year of singing. President of the choral group was Iris Hall and Ruth Barker would be director-conductor again. The group extended an invitation to any and all who wished to take part to get in touch.

The load limit imposed on the use of the Crofton ferry wharf came under fire from Salt Spring businessman Phil Valcourt. He noted that the 20-ton limit caused problems when his trucks weighed in at 23 tons. He asked the Chamber of Commerce to talk to the ferry company to ease the limit so that his trucks could use the Vesuvius ferry.

The Ganges laundry closed down. Gil Humphreys had been ordered by the Pollution Control Board to overhaul the sewage system of the business but he said the laundry was financially marginal and he would have to close down.

Clanton Road on Galiano would not be opened. Bob Knowles told the Galiano Chamber of Commerce. Officials of the highways department did not think it feasible to join North End and Montague Harbour Roads because the hill was too steep.

Five years ago

The pollution control branch approved a second permit for discharge of effluent into Ganges Harbour. The first permit had been protested by SPEC which claimed that partial treatment of the sewage and the short outfall would damage the harbour. The branch upheld the appeal. The current permit was for greater treatment and a longer outfall.

The tourist booth in Ganges registered close to 5,800 visitors' names in the guest book during the summer. Co-ordinator Mabel MacPherson pointed out that the visitors who signed the book, up from 4,000 from the previous year, came from other parts of Canada and 19 other countries.

The use of Mouat Park for the proposed recreation complex was frowned upon by the Islands Trust. David Lott and Bud Kreissl of the Trust were "alarmed" at the proposed use of the park. Recreation commission chairman Glenn Woodley said the Islands Trust should have been involved in the development of the proposal from the beginning.

The wreck of the Queen of Alberni was an error in judgment on the part of ship's master Capt. Al Bahry, said the chairman of B. C. Ferries, Charles Gallagher. Bahry had commanded the *Alberni* for only four trips and he attempted to pass the *Queen of Tsawwassen* with too wide a swing in Georgeson Bay in Active Pass. The wide swing put the ship on the reef. There was no negligence involved, said Gallagher, and Bahry would not have to face disciplinary action.

The Fall Fair on Salt Spring attracted 3,500 people to the school grounds in Ganges. Mike Hayes and David Reid tossed eggs at each other to win that particular event. Kerry Akerman split shakes better than anyone else. The visitors to the fair ate 300 lbs. of beef and an equal number of hamburgers. The fair closed with a dance at the high school in the evening.

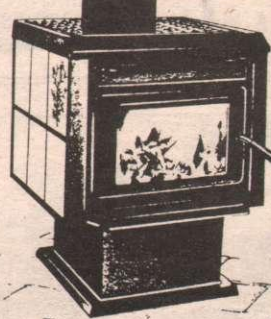

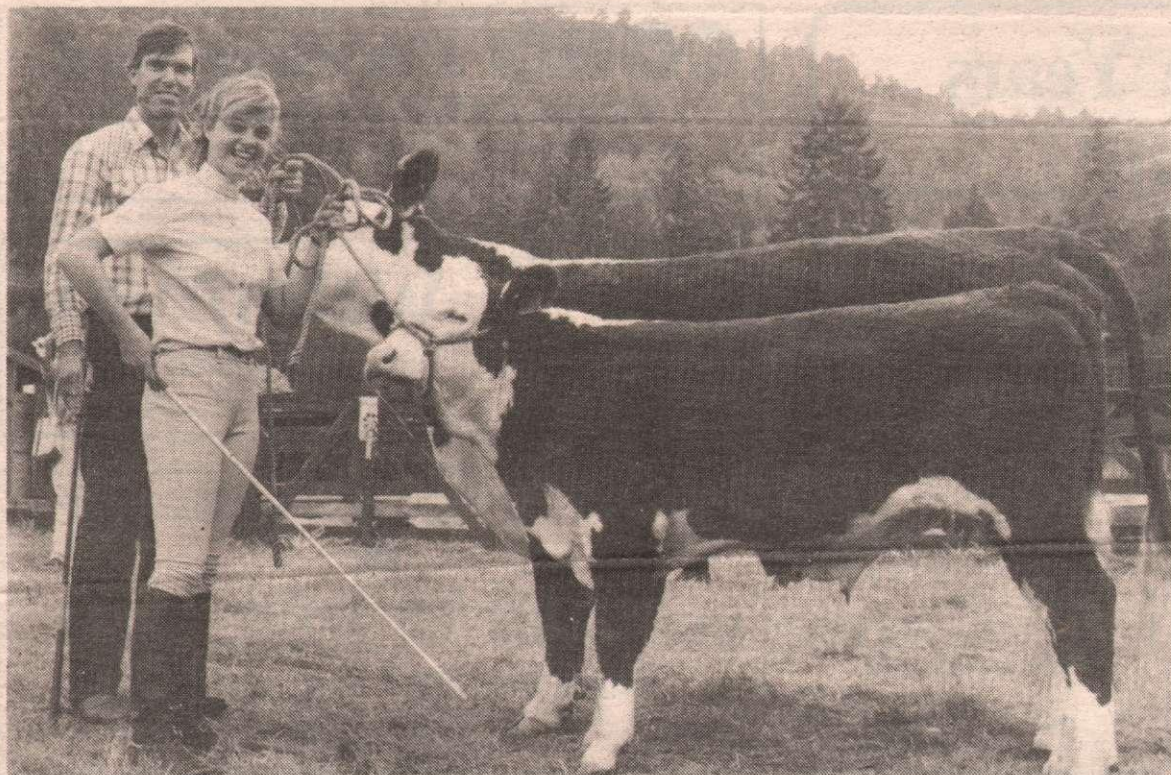

Park lease assigned to region

The lease for Centennial Park in Ganges has been assigned to the Capital Region.

Pat Grove, land administrator for the ministry of lands, parks and housing, sent the lease along to the CRD at the end of August.

The lease is essentially the same as the one which the Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce had held before the park was turned over to the Parks and Recreation Commission.

The main change allows for "a Saturday Farmers' Market in addition to recreational purposes in the public interest."

The lease does not mention mid-week vending.

The Chamber of Commerce has expressed interest in taking a sub-lease for the park from the CRD. A spokesman for the chamber said that group will be meeting with CRD officials.

The Parks and Recreation Commission had come under criticism for the market and the presence of the vendors. The commissioners decided to step aside from the issue and limit their involvement to maintaining the park.

Foxglove Farm wins four at PNE

When the judges finished looking at the cattle at the 1984 Pacific National Exhibition in Vancouver, Foxglove Farm of Salt Spring won four awards.

In the junior heifer class, Cathy Gossett displayed KRR Annie and took in a first place and won the Junior Champion Female in

competition with other first and second-place winners.

The junior heifer class featured 19 entrants from western Canada.

Annie's sire was Goldrush, a bull from the United States, and its mother was Kilmorlie Annie.

In the two-year-old cow class, Annsdale Nolene and her calf Beau

Jake were picked as the Senior Champion Female and in a run-off the pair were chosen as Grand Champions.

In the PNE competition last year, Nolene was selected as Reserve Junior Champion.

"We have long sought the honour of having a grand champion at a national show," said Foxglove owner Tom Gossett.

Nolene is offspring of Foxglove's noted bull Rebel. She was born on the Cowichan Bay farm of Noel Dinsdale who was a partner with Gossett in the bull.

When the cow was born Dinsdale told Gossett that she would be a grand champion. He did not live to see his prediction come true. He died in 1982.

The bull calf Beau Jake is from Jake, the current herd bull at Foxglove.

Ferry service threatened

Ferry service from the Gulf Islands to the mainland will be inadequate at times when the cuts in personnel go into effect after October 10.

The warning came from ferry workers on the *Queen of Tsawwassen* which plies the route.

Driftwood was told that the boat will be running on a D licence on at least four days each week. Confirmation of that came from an official with B.C. Ferry Corporation.

The D licence calls for a crew of 18 and limits passenger capacity to 300 people. The 120-vehicle limit is not affected.

The reduction to a D licence goes into effect after the Thanksgiving weekend when traffic between the islands and Tsawwassen normally drops off for the winter months.

One worker said cutting 25 personnel from the Long Harbour staff would mean "a hell of a cut in

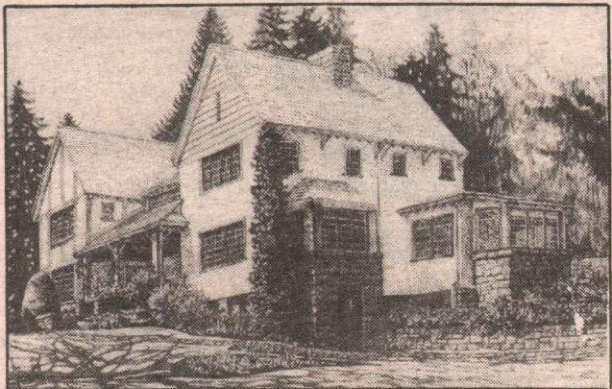
service." The lost jobs would have a major impact on the island with as much as \$1 million in wages being lost.

The cashiers in the cafeteria of the ferry have been declared redundant and they face layoffs. The stewards will man the cash registers.

The *Queen of Tsawwassen* can also run on an F licence which is called a minor waters 2 licence. That licence allows for a crew of 16 with passenger capacity set at 793. The licence is only good when the boat operates between the Gulf Islands and Swartz Bay.

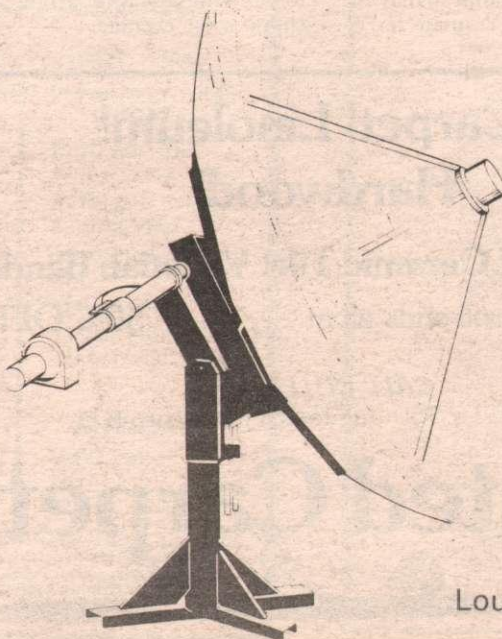
