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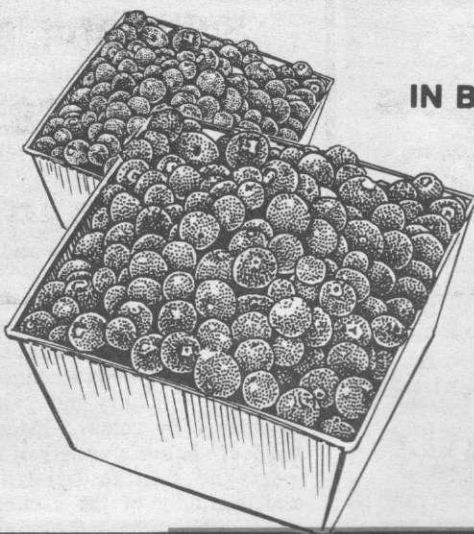

## Island artist takes part in Chemainus festival

Salt Spring artist Colin Williams has been selected to complete the latest in a series of murals for the town of Chemainus.

Williams — an accomplished artist and teacher whose works can be found in the National Collection of Australia and various corporate collections in Canada — is completing a painting of early Chemainus on the exterior wall of Allied Hardware. The painting, an aerial view of the town as it looked in 1910, will measure 37 feet by approximately seven feet when completed.

The painter started his work on Saturday morning, and expects to be finished in about three weeks.

"It's quite interesting, actually," said Williams in a telephone interview from Chemainus.

"I'm using acrylics, which I think should last a long time. It's good quality paint."

Williams said the decision to paint the mural was made only recently. "It came together rather suddenly," he noted. "At first, they (Chemainus organizers) weren't going to have one painted this year. But then a wall became available, and it all came together."

The Chemainus mural society supplies Williams with accommodations and the materials he needs for the mural. Although he is paid a fee for his work, the 52-year-old artist feels the exposure given painters who create murals in Chemainus is more valuable.

"It's good for the artist," he said. "The fee isn't that great, but it is good public relations. Tons of tourists have already stopped to talk with me."

Chemainus has received worldwide attention for its murals. Some of the West Coast's best painters have already created incredible works on the walls of the town's major buildings.

The murals were started several years ago as part of a downtown revitalization project.

## Knowledge Network, Emily Carr offering credit course in colours

A course designed to showcase the potential that colour holds for communication, expression and personal enrichment will be offered on Salt Spring Island this fall.

The course is a home study program created by the Emily Carr College of Art and Design and offered through the Open Learning Institute (OLI). It consists of eight half-hour Knowledge Network TV programs hosted by art educator Tom Hudson, supplemented with printed instructional materials, oil paints, pastels and other supplies delivered to participants by post.

The Knowledge Network is available to Salt Spring Island cablevision subscribers and carried on Channel 19.

Emily Carr College said the course, called *Colour: An Introduction*, will be of interest to painters, designers, teachers, fashion co-ordinators and "anyone fascinated by colour." Students will learn to mix a variety of hues, tones and tints to "gain a full understanding of the excitement and subtlety of colour," it adds.

Course topics include basic colour theory, mixing and colour schemes. Individual segments will also deal with an analysis of colour in the man-made world, colour in nature, and chromatic greys, black and white. Practical demonstrations are to be combined with an examination of how masters like van Gogh, Matisse and Picasso used colour techniques to produce some of the world's most significant paintings, the college said.

Instructor Hudson, former dean at the college and a recognized authority on art and design education, has exhibited his

works in London, New York and other cities in Europe and North America. He has also taught and designed courses in Canada, Britain, the U.S., Turkey, Japan and Brazil.

"This isn't a course in fine-art making," Hudson said in a prepared statement. "We work with pigments and basic colour theory to reveal how effective combinations can be used in design, film, architecture, food presentation, advertising, fashion and many other aspects of our lives. People with many different skills will find the course interesting and useful."

*Colour: An Introduction* may be taken for credit through Emily Carr or OLI. Students will complete studio assignments and receive tutorial assistance by telephone. TV programs will appear on two occasions every

second week, from September through December.

Deadline for enrolling in the course is August 22. Telephone registration is available through Emily Carr (687-2345) or OLI (toll-free, 1-800-972-8452). Cost is \$215 for credit students and others wishing tutorial support.

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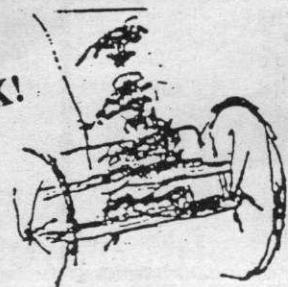


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## Confessions of a critic

# Reviewer's lot never an easy one

I have a bone to pick with all of you out there. I'm going to cry the blues.

Life is tough when you're known as the "art critic". Rooms become hushed when you walk in; there are nervous glances and tentative inquiries.

When I do attend events, I am always aware that my full attention must be on the performance. No idle drifting to the mysterious woman in the front row; no people watching for me.

At intermission I have to stay tight-lipped while others are raving or rolling their eyes. When my column finally comes out, I am loathe to read it for fear of what I've committed myself to. Three days, a week or longer go by before I drum up the courage.

I must confess, though, that I do like to spout off. However, what is most important is not the critical side of the coin but the appreciation side. It's never much fun to tell somebody that they are off the mark, or that their work needs more consideration. Doing this is only gratifying if it points them in new directions or confirms what they already suspect — and gee, it's just my honest opinion.

For the audience I can only hope that me speaking my mind helps others to be honest with their perceptions and to inquire more thoroughly. Enough said.

This last week has been an active one — the big event being the Donovan concert. No one can dispute the polish this seasoned performer brings to the stage. The 'Hurdy Gurdy' man took the enthusiastic, middle-aged audience back on a magical mystery tour of the flower-power revolution. *Mellow Yellow* was a real smoothie, with such baffling lightweight lines as *First there is a mountain, then there is no mountain, then there is ...* — a philosophy to which he still adheres, and was able to elucidate to our astonishment.

We were all very polite when asked to respond to his latest compositions — why ruin a delightful nostalgic evening? — and even I clapped and sang along.

I think the crux of the whole evening was that we've all moved along in life and it's fun to look back to where we've been. It looks like Donovan is trying to move along, too, but is trapped by his past success. I think we all wish him luck as he climbs his next mountain.

Opening the evening was guitarist extraordinaire Ken Hamm, accompanied by Bruce Everett. Hamm has one and a half feet planted solidly in the southern country blues guitar styles of Blind Lemon Jefferson, Blind Willie McTell and Big Bill Broonzy. This

is gutsy stuff but who were the black performers who fast made the music popular?

Lemon Jefferson was born in 1897 near Couchman, Texas. The youngest of seven children and blind from birth, he acquired musical skills as much for survival as for the love of it. As a young man he played at all-night parties and dances in the gritty world of lumber camps and Dallas brothels. Travelling extensively, he picked

up a diversity of techniques and emerged as one of the most innovative guitar stylists of his era.

It is indeed a treat to hear some of this music live on Salt Spring. Ken Hamm's excellent singing and guitar playing were in low-key contrast to Donovan and he was ably accompanied by Bruce Everett (harmonica, flutes and harmonies), who surprised us with his delightful pan pipes.

The real event for me this week was Dorothy Livesay's poetry reading. She shared with us some of the wisdom gained from 78 years on this planet as poet, journalist, teacher and social

worker. Her work is happy, angry, sexy and honest. We all wish we had a mom like that.

Sharing the evening with Livesay was *Heart on the Run*, played by four women poets. The evening was an amalgam of works orchestrated around the theme of the romantic adventures of the heart. This was an invigorating, activated performance where one work dovetailed and enhanced the other, within the theatrical playing out of images. Superbly handled, there was not a slack moment from start to finish. The poets were Patricia Young, Jill Swartz, Linda Rodgers and Gail Harris. With any luck, they will return to the island.

## Stage Company getting ready for Salt Spring visit

Tickets have gone on sale for the Caravan Stage Company's presentation of *The Good Baby* on Salt Spring Island.

The play, an original Canadian effort, will be presented on August 8 and 9 as part of the company's 10-week tour of Vancouver Island and the Gulf Islands.

Advance tickets are \$6 for adults and \$3 for seniors and students, and available at *et cetera* and Patterson's Store. Tickets sold at the door will be priced at \$7 and \$4, respectively.

## Artcraft '87 painting solid financial picture

Artcraft '87 appears well on its way to enjoying another healthy financial season.

The show and sale of arts and crafts by island residents registered gross sales of \$90,000 to July 14, an average take of about \$2,500 a day.

That pace puts it at least on a par with last year's, when *Artcraft* grossed over \$200,000.

*Artcraft* is sponsored by the Community Arts Council, which

receives a percentage of sales and uses those proceeds to financially support local arts projects and artisans.

Demonstrations by five local artists will be staged at *Artcraft* on August 2.

Brien Foerster, Terry Warbey, Donna Vanderwekken, Mark Meredith and Gillian Mouat will demonstrate their artistic expertise outside Mahon Hall on that date.

## Interpretive talks continue at Ruckle, Montague parks

A summer-long series of interpretive talks continues this week in local parks.

The sessions — held at Ruckle Provincial Park on Salt Spring Island and at Montague Harbour Marine Park on Galiano Island — are free and open to the public.

This week's presentations are as follows:

• *Owls 'n Bats of the Gulf Islands*. An illustrated talk designed to help people recognize owls by the way they sound. Friday, July 24, at 9 pm in Ruckle Park.

• *No, They're Not All Dickey Birds*. A morning bird walk. Saturday, July 23, at 8 am in Ruckle Park.

• *Anatomy of a Seabird Colony*. A naturalist paints a picture of a

seabird colony and describes the ecology of the islands. Sunday, July 26, at 2 pm in Montague Harbour Park.

• *The Salmon People*. A talk and film presentation on the importance of salmon to coastal Indian peoples. Sunday, July 26, at 9:30 pm in Montague Harbour Park.

• *No Backbone, Eh?* An introduction to invertebrates, designed to introduce audiences to the major groups of invertebrate animals on the seashore, with an emphasis on how they feed and reproduce. Monday, July 27, at 9 am in Montague Harbour Park.

• *The Salmon People*. See above. Monday, July 27, at 9:30 pm in Ruckle Park.

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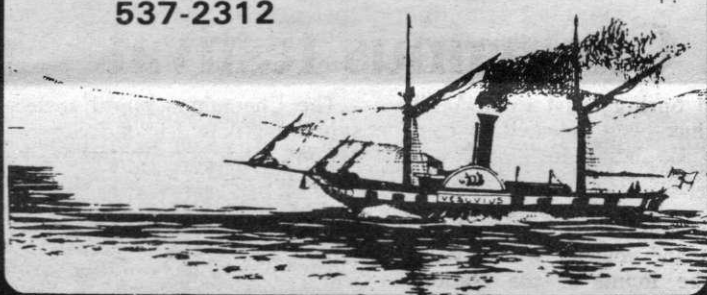

## Week of concerts presents wide range of musical acts

A diversity of music, ranging from Latin and African sounds to jazz and reggae, highlights the third week of Salt Spring Island's *Summer Festival of the Arts*.

Five concerts are on tap this week, beginning tonight (Wednesday) with the appearance of Tony Bird at Off Centre Stage, beginning at 8:30 pm. Tickets are \$7.

Bird, featured at last weekend's Vancouver Folk Festival, is a singer-songwriter who presents audiences with rhythms from his native South Africa.

Other concerts in the next week are:

• Julio Cabrera and Brazil, Thursday, July 23 at the Activity Centre, beginning at 8:30 pm. Tickets are \$6.

Cabrera, a native of Mexico who now lives in Victoria, presents music rooted in the traditions of the Indians of his native land. Blinded in his youth by an accident, Cabrera developed talents for composing, singing and playing music.

With his band, Cabrera will present an evening of Latin sounds, featuring the styles of Colombia, Puerto Rico, Venezuela, Brazil and other countries.

The evening's first set will be in a concert format but organizers expect dancing before the night is through.

• Mango Dub, Saturday, July 25 at the Activity Centre, with doors opening at 8:30 pm. Tickets are \$7.

One of Vancouver's best 'rock and roll reggae bands,' Mango Dub is an eight-piece group which includes: Gordon Durity, trombone and keyboards; Vegari Cendar, bass; Russell DeVert, drums; Brian Black, lead vocals, key-

boards and guitar; Bob Walker, saxophones, keyboards and flute; Jamir Black, lead guitar, vocals and percussion; Tony Fernandes, guitar, vocals, songwriter, arrangements; and Tom Kalpatoo, percussion, timbales, bongos, djembe chimes, shakers, bells, whistles and electronic percussion.

• Rare Aire, Sunday, July 26 at the Activity Centre, beginning at 8:30 pm. Tickets are \$7.

This band categorizes itself as a bagpipe-jazz-fusion-funk ensemble. Its members employ 12 instruments, many of them exotic or unusual, to create a sound unlike anything audiences are apt to have heard before.

Rare Aire has released four albums — two under its original name, *Na Caberfeidh* (Gaelic for *stag's head*, part of a Highland chieftan's regalia), and two under its current name.

• Spirit of the West, Wednesday, July 29 at the Activity Centre, at 8:30 pm. Tickets are \$8.

J. Knutson, John Mann, Geoffrey Kelly and Hugh McMillan combine a dynamic stage presence with a unique musical style they call 'Celtic folk and roll.' Founded on Canada's west coast, the band's original songs capture the essence of the region while combining the tradition of Celtic sounds with the message of folk and the energy of rock.

## *Festival features comedy*

Comedy Night, an Off Centre Stage event born a few months ago but already proving popular with local audiences, will be part of this year's Salt Spring Island *Summer Festival of the Arts*.

The festival will present "the best of Comedy Night" this Friday, July 24, at 8:30 pm at Off Centre Stage. Tickets are \$5.

Expected to take to the stage are regular comedians like Sid Filkow, Arvid Chalmers, Mike Hayes and Shilo Zylbergold. Organizers say some past favourites about 'life on the rock' — i.e., mid-life crises, the vasectomy — will be presented, along with some material prepared especially for the festival event.

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## Island history on stage

*Islomania: The Saga of the Settlers*, a multi-media production chronicling the history of Salt Spring, will play here for five days later this month as part of the island's summer festival of the arts.

*Islomania*, written by Salt Spring resident Diana Hayes, was first mounted in 1984. It played at Fernwood Elementary School to sold-out crowds, and there were requests to hold it over.

Now, the show is back with a new cast member and new material. Yvonne Adalian, who directed the first production of *Islomania*, has returned from Toronto for the show. Dawn Luker, Janis Suess and Gordon Wales — members of the original cast, will again appear in the production, but Richard Savill has been replaced by well-known Salt Spring Players actor Alan Wyatt.

New material and new photographs will also be part of this year's production.

"I've revised the script, and there are new scenes," Hayes noted in an interview last week. "It was first performed in the summer of '84, so this is its first return. It's sponsored by the festival and the Community Arts Council, which provided a grant."

Hayes describes *Islomania* — which takes its name from a passage in Lawrence Durrell's *Reflections on a Marine Venus* — as a "collage of island history." It contains a soundtrack, and graphics (produced by LeRoy Jensen) are projected behind the performers for added impact.

play more than 20 characters out of the island's history, people such as the "squire of Salt Spring," Henry Bullock. *Islomania* starts with 'slices' of history dating from as far back as the days of Haida raids and Cowichan war parties.

Material for the production was obtained from a variety of sources. The diaries of early settlers afforded Hayes with a first-hand look into the island's early histories, and interviews with island old-timers added plenty of spice to the production. A collection of oral history tapes in the provincial

archives also proved useful.

For those new to the area, *Islomania* provides a good overview of Salt Spring history. Hayes noted that blacks from the United States and a group of Hawaiians were among the island's first settlers.

"There were so many different groups that settled here," she pointed out.

*Islomania* will be performed July 30 through August 1 — and July 3-4 — at Off Centre Stage in Ganges. Showtime is 8:30 pm. Tickets are available at *et cetera* and at the door.

## Henry Woolf

### Noted director holds reading, workshops

Henry Woolf — the internationally-renowned actor, director and supporter of Canadian theatre — will visit Off Centre Stage August 7, 8 and 9.

Woolf currently teaches drama at the University of Saskatoon. He was previously involved in productions like the Royal Shakespeare Company's version of *Marat-Sade*, under the direction of Peter Brooks, and *The Rocky Horror Picture Show*.

On August 7, Woolf will direct a staged reading of the Michael Curtis play, *The Corporal and the Gangster*, beginning at 8 pm at Off Centre Stage. Woolf will also perform the role of Adolph Hitler in the play, with Curtis appearing as Churchill, Janis Suess as Clementine Churchill and Joan Deere as Eva Braun.

The play has been described by CBC executive producer John Juliani as "well-written, very engrossing and theatrical without being self-indulgent."

Toronto-based actor George Werner wrote that "these two men (Hitler and Churchill), in juxtaposition, present a marvelous picture of similarities and contrasts" which form the basis of the play.

A two-day workshop with Woolf will taken place on Saturday and Sunday, August 8 and 9, at Off Centre Stage. The workshop Woolf led recently at the

Salt Spring Centre is remembered by participants as an invigorating and inspiring event that allowed people to hone their acting skills and develop new approaches to their art, Off Centre Stage says.

Pre-registration for the workshop is necessary. Cost is \$40.

Also on August 8 and 9, Woolf will present *Juvenalia*, an adaptation from the writings of Roman citizen Juvenal, at Off Centre Stage, beginning each night at 8 pm.

The play enjoyed a successful run in London, England. Its presentation on Salt Spring will mark the second time it has been seen in Canada.

Woolf describes the play as "a contemporary satire written 2,000 years ago."

Tickets for the play are \$5.

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## Program set for children

The third installment in the *Summer Festival of the Arts* program for children will feature Gumboot Lollipop this Saturday at the Salt Spring Elementary School Activity Centre.

The July 25 show begins at 1 pm. Tickets are \$3.

Gumboot Lollipop is Dolly Hopkins, a performer who has taken her "little girl" character to audiences throughout Canada and halfway around the world.

Wearing red gumboots and a tutu, Gumboot Lollipop presents a show rich in animation and improvisation. "Her problems are insightful versions of the kinds of situations that young people face in real life, and her solutions (are) just as humorous as they are real," the *Festival* program notes.

This year, Gumboot Lollipop presents a new show, "What I did on my summer vacation."

## Horse 'rumour' versions conflict

Rumours of a remarkable horse trade have been circulating on Galiano, particularly in that source of gossip, Burrill Brothers. There are several conflicting versions.

Horses have played such an important role in the history and social life of the West, so it is not surprising that our language is enriched with many horsey figures of speech. *Never look a gift horse in the mouth* is a sound piece of advice that one of the principals in the story could have taken with advantage. *Putting the cart (or horse box) before the horse* was also damaging to the horse box and to the equilibrium of one of the witnesses. Shakespeare, in this context, would have attributed to the plaintiff: "A horse, a horse, a lawyer for my horse."

Since the judge was presented with such conflicting testimony, equivocal evidence and affidavits and the like, he may have had to use horse sense in coming to his decision. He might, however, have tried to get the real story from the horse's mouth. Surely a spirited, intelligent little quarter horse would have been able to tell the judge a thing or two — if only Dr. Doolittle had been available as a court interpreter.

### Absit Invidia

The warmth of support given to Celia Challoner's play, *Willful Deceit*, by both her cast and her audiences, is a measure of their strong approval of her and her play. Every detail of the production contributed to its success, so producer Fran Hillier must also be congratulated. Houses are sold out and audiences laugh themselves silly. It is a common diversion for a summer evening.

The characters are from another world and time. We cannot empathize with them except perhaps John Hales' well-thought-out portrayal of Gerald. Murder and attempted murder do not cause revulsion or horror — only

laughter. The denouement doesn't surprise us because by that time we are conditioned to incredulity and merriment. So Celia and her co-director Marianne Bennetts were wise to have it played as melodrama in which characters are caricatures and the story incredible.

The limitations of the community hall as a theatre are obvious. The stage is much too small and the acoustics poor. It is impossible to make the stage look like a withdrawing room in an ancestral mansion, but a good attempt was made. Diction and voice projection became very important and audibility was not always achieved. On a small stage, movement needs to be reduced to a minimum or the actors will be

PENDER ISLANDS — Up-to-date maps of the islands have been prepared by the newly-reorganized Pender Islands Chamber of Commerce.

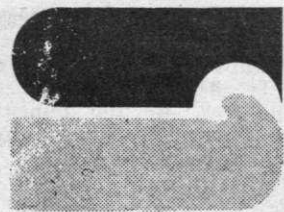
The maps, drawn by Pender architect Bill Robson, are avail-

dodging and colliding like football players.

It was obvious that the cast were a happy team helping each other out and following the coach's directions. The casting of Jim Ripley as the villain and John Hales as the 'not so dumb as he seemed' leading man was inspired. Kathy Sharp did a good job with the part of Angelique, although she had the handicap of being known to have such a pleasant personality but being called upon to play the part of an evil, scheming and completely callous character. Jim Ripley, on the other hand, had all the advantages of voice, appearance and occupation. The minor characters were played by Margaret Howell, Tona von Rezori, Ian Hooley and Bill Callaway, who stood out as a quite unbelievable British 'bobby' confessing to the crime.

If the Galiano Players insist on doing British comedies, it is certainly better to do one written by one of their members. However, although these productions seem to please a Galiano audience, they insufficiently challenge the abilities of the actors and the intellects of the people who turn up to support local talent.

We hope Celia feels encouraged to write another play. She might try somewhere nearer home for a setting, with characters we can recognize from our own experience. Certainly it should be a comedy, for that is where her talent lies — but Canadian, not British.

### Public Hearings

Galiano Island Trust Committee met last Friday to conduct public hearings on two rezoning

applications. It was the first such Trust meeting at which only the two local trustees were present. The three general trustees were at a meeting on Salt Spring but will receive a report of the hearings compiled by Doug Ross, Trust official. Regarding the absence of the general trustees we might echo the lyric of W.S. Gilbert in *The Mikado*, "They never will be missed."

The Robsons in 1977 donated a strip of land adjacent to the park gate at Montague to the provincial government for addition to the park. The application to rezone this parcel from Rural Residential to Public Recreation raised no objection from either the appropriate ministries or the public.

The Trust officials were, however, surprised at the large turnout and great interest in the second application to come before the meeting. Nearly 100 people jammed the community hall on a sunny summer afternoon to object almost unanimously to Allan Buttery's proposal to have the four acre parcel he owns at the junction of Gulf Drive with Sturdies Bay Road rezoned from Village Residential to CS (Commercial use).

Every speaker spoke with determination against the proposal. The common ground was the danger and inconvenience of increased traffic congestion the risk to water supply, the loss of peace and quiet and the threat to property values. The most damning factor was the absence of the applicant and especially of any plan or proposal for development of the parcel. It was feared that rezoning four acres in that vicinity would be like giving a blank

cheque and the thin edge of the wedge for future development.

It is true that the original community plan did envisage some commercial development in this area, but the designation of the area as a 'controlled access highway' by the ministry of transportation and highways has almost ruled out any chance of a small commercial centre developing at this location.

Any kind of numerical expression of public opinion by vote is anathema to island trustees at a public hearing. However, none of the 30-odd speakers could be construed as favouring the proposal, and it would be a travesty of democracy if the Trust Committee proceeded with this bylaw, even in an amended form.

The police official said stolen scales of this type are often used to weigh marijuana.

Fund-raising efforts included the sale of books and home-baked goods, and the rental of tables to people who wanted to sell attic and basement treasures.

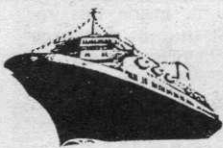
The event, held in the school gymnasium, drew a large crowd which surged around a number of tables of books, presided over by the librarians. At times, the customers were lined up three or four people deep.

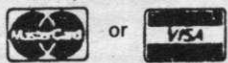

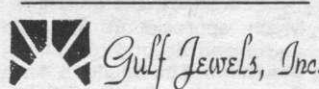

# Fuchsia deserves moment of garden glory

With the arrival of some legitimate summer heat, the presence of a bit of shade in the garden is most appreciated. However, along with the welcome shade comes special problems gardeners have to deal with. Dry, nutrient-deficient soils and a severe shortage of summer-blooming plant materials can really challenge those who attempt to make a shady corner into a place of beauty.

Impatiens, begonias, browallia, nicotiana and tender fuchsias do an admirable job in the annuals, as do foxgloves, hostas and lamium in the perennials group. There is, however, usually a problem with volume and scale, for which we have to turn to the shrubs. For variegated or coloured foliage one can choose from the *Aucubas*, *Leucothoe fontanesiana* 'Rainbow' and variegated *Pieris*, but for floral colour in the heat of the summer, the field of selection is narrow, with hydrangeas, the occasional second blooming on some of the evergreen azaleas, and last but not least, the graceful, colourful, long-blooming hardy fuchsias.

The hardy fuchsia, *Fuchsia magellanica*, originally from Chile and Peru, is the only species which will withstand our winters, but fortunately, breeding efforts have yielded several other freeze-tolerant varieties which are also prolific bloomers.

In older gardens, fuchsias were utilized in shrub borders and as hedges in shady areas, while the modern-day gardener also uses them as accent plants, focal summer-blooming shrubs, mass plantings and as an all-summer bloomer used to attract hummingbirds. The numerous slender stems arise from the crown and arch over in a fountain of growth, giving a splendid show when spilling over a rock wall, log or stump. Depending on the variety, ultimate sizes vary from the one-foot-tall "Papoose" and "Santa Claus" to the 20-foot-tall *F.m. Riccartonii* (when grown in mild protected locales). Where winters are severe, the stems freeze back to the ground level and will resprout from the

crown in early spring to reach five or six feet in height.

The stems usually have a reddish colouration with clusters of one- to two-inch oval leaves, and from virtually every node, clusters of buds form to open successively over the course of the summer. As the new growth develops, so do more buds, and as they open they reveal two or more of various colours, including red, blue, purple, magenta, white and what else but fuchsia. The one- to three-inch blooms are borne in profusion from late June right on through until the first hard frosts kill the buds and succulent shoot tips.

Hardy fuchsias grow best in partial shade or a broken sun situation where the hottest sun is intercepted or scattered. A deeply shaded location will see fewer blooms produced and somewhat leggier growth. For soil conditions, a moist, rich, well-drained loam is ideal. For best results, lots of organic matter or compost will make the soil both moisture-retentive and rich. If peat moss is used, remember to add a couple of tablespoons of dolomite lime, as a pH of 6.0 to 6.5 is preferred. A light summer mulching is recommended to keep the soil cool and help conserve moisture.

For fertilizers, a balanced feeding will do just fine, but to encourage the maximum bloom production, choose a higher phosphorus and potassium-containing plant food. Initial spring feedings with fish fertilizer, compost, seaweed, manure and/or blood meal will look after the nitrogen needs, and for the rest of the season alternate with feedings of 20-20-20 and Mor-Bloom (0-10-10).

Another good option is to use a

time release fertilizer such as Osmocote or Nutricote for a full season's feeding in one application. Be careful to stop feeding any nitrogen after the end of July, as the plant should have time to slow down its growth and harden off for the winter. At the end of August, a shot of potassium will help the plants to develop frost tolerance.

While the hardy fuchsias are entirely capable of surviving our coldest winters, one-year-old wood is often killed back to ground level, so after the winter you should wait for the buds to flush, and then prune out all weak, diseased or dead wood. Thin the crown if there are too many stems surviving, and prune back the two year or older stems, reducing them by one-third. Do all of this corrective cleanup pruning by the end of April.

This is the approach to pruning if you are managing for a shrub, or a trained standard form, but if you wish to encourage that balanced, symmetrical fountain of growth, new each year, then merely cut all of the stems off at two inches above the ground in the early spring, as the buds are flushing into growth. This second approach treats the plant almost like a perennial, and by giving a protective heavy winter mulching, the care is almost trouble-free. This is the only way to grow hardy fuchsias where the climate is colder but here we have the choice.

Propagation is achieved by taking late summer cuttings and rearing them in a cold frame or, alternatively, using a propagating box with bottom heat.

For choices of varieties there are several good ones available. The species *F. magellanica* reaches three feet in height and produces red with violet blooms all summer long. The variety "Riccartonii" can reach 15 or more feet and gives small, brilliant red and blue/violet flowers in profusion. It can be trained or developed into a standard in sheltered, protected areas and is suitable for seaside plantings. The dwarf form *F.m. Papoose* may be used in rockeries, planter boxes or even hanging

baskets if in a sheltered location. The same holds true for the red and white "Santa Claus". The "Double Otto" variety has fully double, huge blooms in a pink and purple combination that looks every bit as good as any tender hanging basket variety can. *F.m. gracilis* is a delicate, slender, tall growing

variety which will also help to brighten up any shady corners of the garden.

For all of its blooming assets and ease of care, it is easy to see that the hardy fuchsia is a vastly underused and under-rated shrub whose moment of glory in the garden is long overdue.

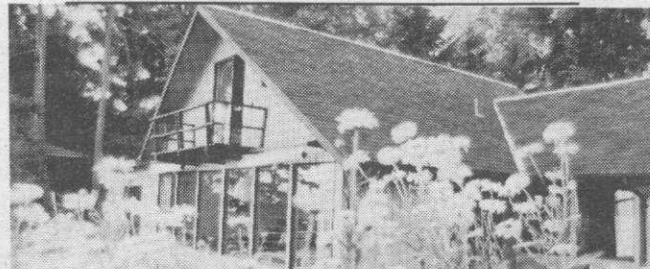
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# Symbol of Canada welcome to leave Argentina

Argentina's east, south and west boundaries are dictated mostly by geography, but those on the north were defined by wars of a century or so ago.

If you look at a map, you will see that one province, at the north-east corner, is a long finger of land — this reflects the route of an Argentine army on a land-grabbing expedition. This is the province of Misiones, and it contains the falls of Iguaza, twelfth in the world in volume of water, (although higher and wider than Niagara) but surely first in beauty.

Iguazu lies at the junction of Brazil, Paraguay and Argentina, and so for a couple of taxi rides we could have claimed to have visited the two former countries, but that would have meant hours and hours of customs-immigration tedium, a process which in Latin America is even more frustrating than Canadians are accustomed to encountering. We stayed on the Argentine side.

The first European to see Iguazu was Nunez Cabeza de Vaca, the Spanish conquistador (his name only sounds romantic; it means *Cow's Head*) back in 1542. He was impressed, as has been every visitor since, because Iguazu is to other falls as a diamond necklace is to the uncut stones. The setting is magnificent — begonias, orchids and ferns compete for attention with flocks of birds just as bright and, for a backdrop, the rainbows formed in the mists of the cataracts.

We had only three days, and we could have spent weeks to see all of it, but in the 37-degree heat we didn't exactly whiz around the trails, nor up and down the steep slopes. We did see more than Cabeza de Vaca, however, because there is now a kilometre-long foot causeway built out over the water and the flowered islets to the very lip of the biggest falls of all — the Garganta del Diablo, or Devil's Throat. Every puff of the breeze brought a cloud of spray, while swifts wheeled and tumbled in its rainbow. It was hard to leave and face the walk back, with the sun almost vertically overhead.

We left Iguazu, spent a few searing hours in Buenos Aires, and then boarded the milk run to Ushuaia, at the tip of Cape Horn, and the world's most southern city. It is 3,550 kilometres south of Iguazu, as the crow flies, but Aerolineas Argentina doesn't fly like that bird, so we saw many thousands of kilometres of pampas and Patagonia. But hours of flight over anywhere isn't as revealing as 15 minutes on a bus down below, so, however bewitching that immense country is in fact, it revealed nothing of it from the air except its size.

Tierra del Fuego is a country of mountains, lakes and forests, perhaps a little like our Queen Charlottes, but less hospitable. We were there in midsummer, and at

sea level it was like our April, but there was snow down to 3,000 feet. If it never gets very warm, neither does it get very cold, because it is dominated by the great southern ocean — in fact, the Fuegian natives (now, alas, extinct) wore little, if any, clothing. But that was a tribute to their hardiness in what we would consider a harsh climate, so beset by the roaring forties gales that the trees look as if they are marching east.

Ushuaia is a frontier town, and the frontier it serves is Antarctica,

of which a large slice is claimed by Argentina. It also serves the Malvinas, or Falkland Islands, and the other South Atlantic Islands they still claim, and will always claim, until that time comes when national animosities are long gone, and geography takes over. The two words most used in Ushuaia are *Malvinas* and *Antartida*, as the Argentine Antarctic claim is called. The country is reaching south, trying to get away from its present seat in Buenos Aires, and both people and

business are materially encouraged to go to the southern frontiers. The inducements must be attractive, because there are new factories with such names as Sanyo, Sony and many others.

We spent a day out on the Beagle Channel with its seals and sea birds, one in Ushuaia itself, and one in the mountains where we attended an *asado*, or barbecue, together with people who spoke French, German, Dutch and Spanish — everything but English. But there was one link with

Canada, for our national animal, the beaver, is busy flooding the land there as it does here. It was introduced about 40 years ago, and has now made a thorough nuisance of itself. When we volunteered innocently that we came from the same place as the beavers, we were politely invited to repatriate all of them.

With only a week left in the country, and much still to see, we boarded the milk-run bound for Buenos Aires yet again.

## down through the years

### with Driftwood

#### Twenty-five years ago

•Good weather had promoted a lush growth of vegetation.

At Fernwood, a clump of orchard grass measured more than eight feet high. The grass had apparently been introduced on the island during the pioneer years. "It took old-timers 40 years to grow, and newcomers have been spending 15 years getting rid of it," said *Driftwood*. •Island Garage was offering residents a special deal on chainsaws.

The purchaser of any Remington chainsaw received a nylon Remington Model 66 .22 calibre rifle free.

•The Salt Spring Golf and Country Club's eight-member golf team added 11 points to its total to win the Bambrick Memorial Cup on Galiano.

The final score of the three rounds played at the Salt Spring, Pender and Galiano courses was: 31 for Salt Spring, 19 for the Pender team and 18 for Galiano. The Bambrick Memorial Cup was presented by Ed Bambrick to Salt Spring club president Hart Bradley.

•The Royal Canadian legion was slated to hold its annual fishing derby.

Fishermen were advised to boat their catches immediately, because in the prior year's event, "the biggest fish in the world, which surely would have won first prize, was towed back into the harbour. Thanks to the friendly seals, only the head reached the weigh scales.

#### Twenty years ago

•The 19th annual Fulford Salmon Derby got off to an early start. A brisk wind and choppy seas did not discourage the participants.

Captain Les Mollet served as weigh-in officer. Forty-one fish were caught, and the Langley Cup — donated by Ellery Langley in 1948 — was won by Floyd Christie. Christie's 11 pound, eight ounce salmon was the largest caught during the event. •Frank Westcott, a Salt Spring resident for 64 years, died at the age of 83.

Though he lost his sight in a blasting accident early in life, he remained "the exemplification of cheerfulness." Westcott was survived by his wife Margaret and two sons, John and William of Ganges.

•Seventeen-year-old Paul Kergin, son of Dr. Alan Kergin, was named winner of the Governor-General's Silver Medal as the top B.C. scholarship student in Grade 12.

Paul, who excelled at math and science, earned the award by scoring 97 per cent on his examinations.

•John Waterfall, better known for his work as Ganges postman, came out on the losing end of a battle with a seal.

Waterfall was fishing when he caught a fair-sized fish. As he reeled it in near the boat, a seal popped up and grabbed the fish. The seal pulled on the fish, and Waterfall — unwilling to give up his catch — hung fast on the other end.

#### Fifteen years ago

•Four individuals were competing for the right to represent Saanich and the Islands in the B.C. Legi-

slature.

The candidates were Malcolm Anderson (Liberal), Foster Isherwood (Social Credit), Eric Sherwood (New Democratic Party) and a young Conservative by the name of Hugh Curtis.

•The Ganges Pharmacy was hit by thieves for the second time in two weeks.

Entry was gained by forcing a window after the drugstore's door resisted attempts to break it open. Drugs, watches and cigarettes valued at \$400 were stolen.

•Updating of the Ganges sewer appraisal was undertaken by the Capital Regional District.

The first feasibility study was undertaken in 1965 by Kerr, Priestman, Heenan and Associates, and updated in 1969 when the Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce examined drainage problems at the head of Ganges Harbour. With the announcement that Gulf Islands Secondary School was in need of improved sewage disposal facilities, many local residents were again considering installation of a community sewer system.

#### Ten years ago

•A forest fire on Galiano island burned off approximately 1.5 hectares of timber on the bluff above Collinson Point near Georgeson bay.

Water tankers dropped 10 loads, or approximately 8,000 gallons, of retardant on the fire, and by 3 pm it was under control. It was believed that a careless visitor started the fire by discarding a burning cigarette.

•Island Asphalt Producers, a Victoria firm, was awarded a contract to supply and deliver 73,000 tons of crushed gravel and 14,300 tons of asphalt and cold mix for use throughout the Gulf Islands and Port Hardy.

The firm had agreed to supply the needed materials at a cost of \$650,980. Fifteen thousand tons of gravel and 3,000 tons of cold mix asphalt were needed by Port Hardy, while the remainder was to be used on 11 Gulf Islands.

•Changes in the assessments of some Ganges properties were approved by the board of appeal.

Assessments on all but one Ganges property had dropped, according to Gary Garras of the B.C. Assessment Authority.

•Bill Smith and Peggy Stacey were the tennis champions on Salt Spring when the mixed doubles adult and junior tournaments concluded.

Second place in the tourney went to the team of Ian Thomson and Terry Horrocks.

#### Five years ago

•Residents of the islands rallied during the week in an effort to save the Islands Trust.

A committee was formed at Ganges to prepare plans to fight the B.C. government's Land Use Act, which included a clause designed to abolish the Trust. Within less than a week, two signs were raised on the shores of Active Pass calling for retention of the Trust. More than 1,100 people also signed a petition asking the government to scrap its plans to do away with the islands' governing body.

•Public hearings were to be held on Galiano on three planning proposals.

Bylaw 23 called for an amendment to the boundaries of the Agricultural Land Reserve on Bluffs Road overlooking Active Pass. A second hearing was slated to consider 18 properties designated as development permit areas. The final hearing concerned a request to rezone property on Madrona Drive.

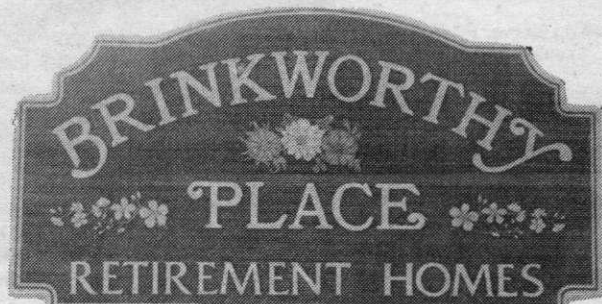

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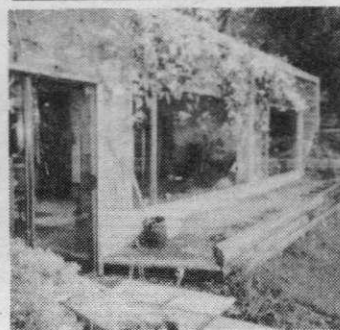

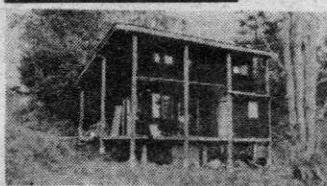
