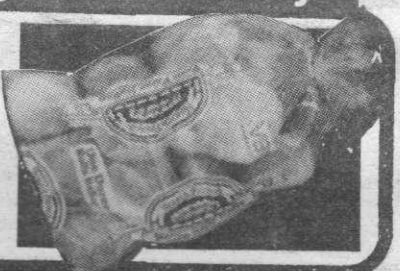

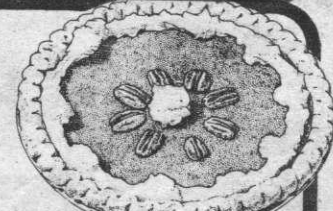

MP Jim Manly

Manly to speak about Nicaragua

Nicaragua is a country so poor that "cornflakes are sold in duty-free shops," according to Cowichan-Malahat-the Island MP Jim Manly.

Manly, scheduled to speak October 8 at a potluck supper meeting sponsored by Tools for Peace in the lower hall of Ganges United Church, toured Nicaragua in mid-September as part of a delegation sponsored by international aid groups. While there, he was briefed by government officials in Managua, met with opposition leaders, foreign diplomats and aid workers, and toured a village ravaged by contra raids.

Manly's experiences have convinced him the Nicaraguan government is serious about honouring a regional peace accord. He also firmly believes that Canada can play a key role in promoting

the new Central American peace plan.

"There is a real opportunity now to bring some peace, some social justice, to the region," says Manly. "The timing is crucial."

At the upcoming potluck — which starts at 5 pm — the local MP plans to explain how island residents can help bring peace to Nicaragua.

Tools for Peace members urge island residents to attend the meeting.

"Salt Spring Islanders have been amazingly generous in their material and financial support of Nicaragua through Tools for Peace," said one of the group's members. "Now our political support, as Canadians, can make a crucial difference in finally bringing peace to a war-torn region. Come and find out how."

Victoria's United Way preparing for island fund-raising campaign

Salt Spring Island residents will receive a red United Way brochure in their mailboxes this Thursday.

The brochure marks the first time the United Way of Greater Victoria — a non-profit organization with decades of community service work to its credit — conducts a fund-raising campaign on Salt Spring. Islanders are being asked to give generously to the group.

Donations to the United Way will allow local organizations like the Red Cross and the Salt Spring Island Community Society to provide a variety of services on the island. As community centre director Barbara Jordan-Knox pointed out last Friday, the society has been accepted into the United Way, and will likely receive approximately \$20,000 in funding during the coming year.

In future, the United Way will handle all direct fund-raising for the community society and the Red Cross. Other fund-raising activities — such as the annual Christmas craft faire — will continue, however.

The United Way has pledged to provide the community society with a secure source of core funding — money that can be put to good use on Salt Spring. As Jordan-Knox noted, the society's membership in the United Way will not alter any of the community centre's existing programs.

The Salt Spring Community Society's objectives on the island are:

- to promote, plan and develop comprehensive, quality community services;
- to foster community planning and control of social services in the community;
- to provide service to those in need;
- to provide appropriate information and referral; and
- to aid individuals, local groups and organizations in gaining in-

formation and access to resources, personnel and/or government funding for citizens' groups.

The community centre offers a variety of programs to local residents. Trained community workers provide counselling services on many matters.

The Gulf Island Program Serving Youth (GIPSY), which also operates out of the community centre, provides an alternative to regular high school classes for students between 15 and 19. The Achievement Centre, meanwhile, provides an activity program for handicapped adults and mental

health clients. The Life Skills program provides a one-to-one worker for developmentally-handicapped adults.

The centre also runs a recycling program and a clothing store. Teen services are also available.

Jordan-Knox noted that the centre will continue to offer these services and others in the future. Community society officials, she added, are pleased to be part of the United Way — and hope Salt Spring Islanders will give as generously to the Greater Victoria group as they have to the community centre.

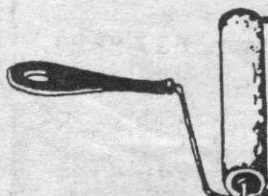

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Votes proceed despite lack of quorum

The extraordinary general meeting of the Galiano Club, postponed for the lack of a quorum and re-scheduled for September 30, drew even fewer members than a week earlier. Nevertheless three important motions were debated.

The first motion discussed was a proposal to renovate the hall foundations and insulate the floor. When tenders were called, the low-bid exceeded the funds available as the contractor sought to cover himself against unforeseen problems by including a substantial margin in his bid. He suggested that a cost plus deal would considerably reduce the cost. However, the executive still felt that they needed authority to spend up to \$4,000 of club money to supplement the grant and sought approval for this expenditure.

The executive also sought authority to spend up to \$4,000 to purchase a used baler to deal with the estimated 15 tons of cardboard that has accumulated in the recycling shed at the SWDA. Baled cardboard sells for about \$60 a ton but unbaled cardboard is worthless. Jim Scoones has a line on a used baler which he will fit with a gasoline engine. Tridel Equipment of Richmond will effect changes to the hydraulics. The baler will be mobile and interest in renting the machine has already been expressed. This expenditure was also approved.

The third motion proposed the formation of a separate society to operate the 'dump'. Public liability is a concern of most municipalities across Canada and the Galiano Club, when it operates as a public utility, is not immune. One director also considers that operating the SWDA takes too much of the directors' time and energy. However, this motion received no support and was defeated.

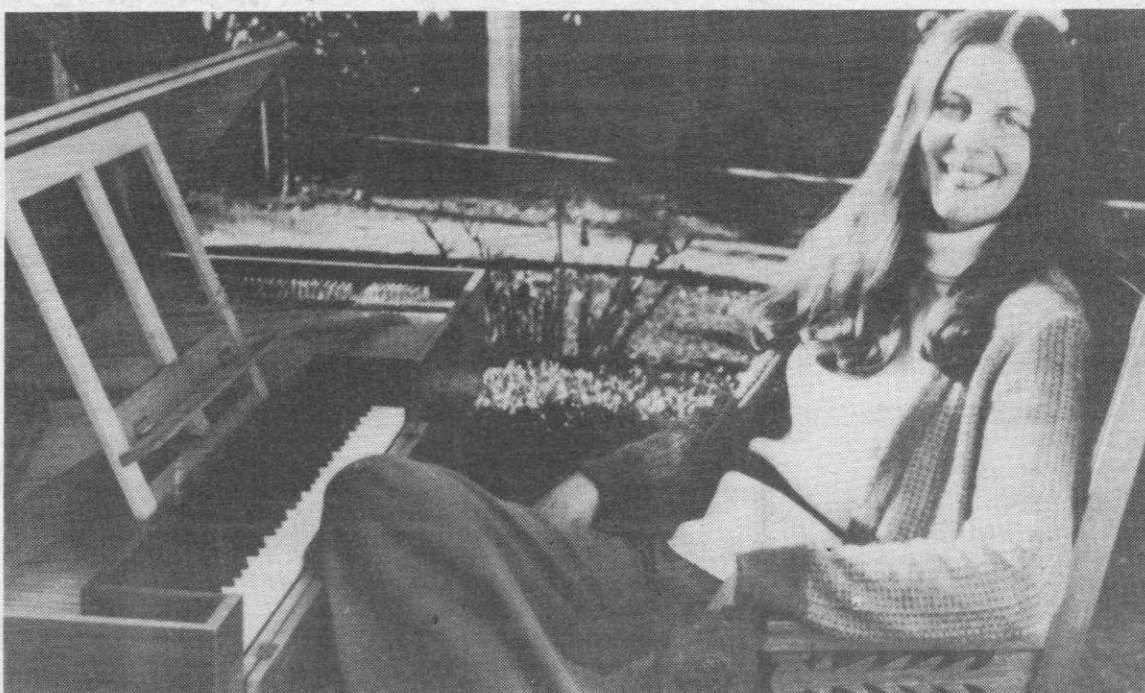
Activity Centre Society

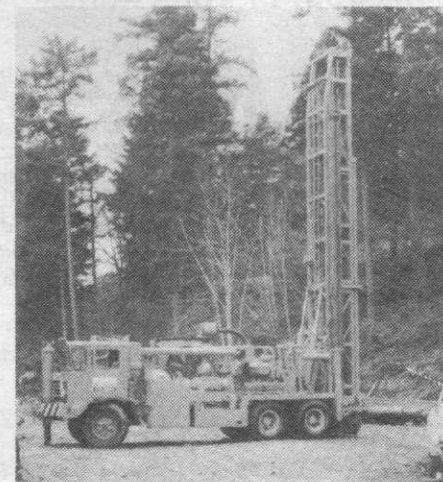

Influenza vaccine clinics scheduled

Dates, places and times have been arranged for influenza vaccination clinics in the Outer Gulf Islands.

The schedule is as follows:

- **PENDER ISLAND** — Vaccinations will take place at the Pender Island Clinic on October 14 (Wednesday), October 20 (Tuesday) and October 21 (Wednesday). Times are from 1:15 pm to 2:15 pm each day.
- **MAYNE ISLAND** — Vaccinations will take place at the Mayne Island Clinic on October 13 (Tuesday) and November 2 (Monday). Times are from 1:30 pm to 3:30 pm each day.
- **SATURNA ISLAND** — Vaccinations will take place at the Saturna Island Fire Hall on November 9 (Monday), between 1:30 pm and 2 pm.

• **GALIANO ISLAND** — Vaccinations will take place at the Page Drive Lounge on October 15 (Thursday), from 5 pm to 7 pm.

Influenza vaccinations are provided by the Capital Regional District (CRD). They are offered free of charge to eligible people considered at increased risk. They include:

- adults and children with certain chronic medical disorders such as chronic lung or heart disease, immune deficiencies, chronic renal or metabolic diseases;
- residents or nursing homes and other chronic care facilities; and
- healthy persons over 65 years of age.

Persons ineligible for free vaccinations should contact their physicians, the CRD says.

Recipient surprised

Wager loser pays off —but it takes 37 years

Thirty-seven years ago, Jack Lloyd-Walters lost a bet with Galiano Ollie Garner.

This summer, he paid the betting debt in full.

In 1950, Garner operated a logging camp. Most of his employees were happy-go-lucky single men like Lloyd-Walter.

New model Trust bylaw to be tried out on Pender

A model land-use bylaw drawn up by the Islands Trust will be given a trial run on three Gulf Islands.

The model bylaw was endorsed by the Trust Council at its last meeting, held on Denman Island in early September. It will now be put in place on South Pender, Gabriola and Hornby islands for trial runs before being used by other individual Trust committees.

Islands Trust chairman Nick Gilbert said that as the South Pender, Gabriola and Hornby Trust committees use the bylaw, he expects they will make changes and improvements to the model.

The bylaw includes an information guide introducing readers to

the Trust and the various elements (i.e., development permits, public hearings, setbacks) of the zoning and rezoning processes. It also covers bylaw administration and enforcement, definitions of terms used, explanations of various land-use zones, parking requirements and sign regulations.

One particularly helpful section of the bylaw is a six-page outline of various land-use zones laid out in table form and listing permitted uses and conditions attached to those uses.

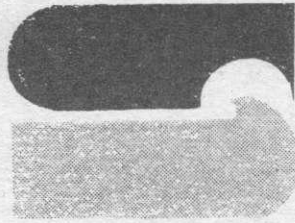
Gilbert said the model bylaw is designed as a complete information package. It should make land-use information more accessible to the public, he said, and lead to greater uniformity by Trust committees.

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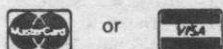

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
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Salt Spring FC earns 1-1 tie despite poor field conditions

As the member of Salt Spring F.C. responsible for supplying weekly write-ups of our games, I have periodically employed various methods to make these reports more palatable to the casual reader.

I find it likely that few people outside the soccer community peruse these passages, but for those who do, a soccer article can hardly be cause for heart-stopping excitement.

I've found that the straight-forward relating of goal scorers and highlights to be as humdrum to write as it surely must be to read. To relieve the banality (I hope), I have in the past used some gimmicks to alleviate some of the repetition. Not so today. This is no gimmick, although neither is it solely a recounting of this week's match.

The biggest issue raised Sunday (if something as trivial as a soccer match can be said to raise issues) is the utter disrepair of Portlock Park.

In the past, Portlock Park has been, for the various representatives of Salt Spring soccer, initially a source of pride, then embarrassment, then pride at its resurfacing, and now bemusement coupled with a sense of disgrace and fear. By using the term fear, I think I hardly overstate the case. On Saturday F. C. held a special practice session to acclimatize themselves to the rocks, coarse sand and assorted peaks, valleys and potholes.

Even veterans of Portlock Park were astonished to see the once lush carpet of sod reduced, in large part, to a seeming archipelago of small green tufts awash in a sea of sand and gravel.

In places, there are cavernous holes dug out of the rock-hard surface lying in wait for unsuspecting ankles, knees, and (wince!) backs. In short, Portlock Park is no longer merely an embarrassment or a source of amusement; it is dangerous.

If there is anyone out there who would doubt the word of men who must return to work on Monday after suffering unnecessary injuries in a bit of weekend recreation, then that person must also doubt the word of children.

The youngsters playing juvenile soccer on Portlock Park may sustain injuries in even the most routine plays that may affect them for the rest of their lives.

On the men's team I can think of several players who are hampered with ankle, knee, and back problems as a direct result of injuries sustained while playing

years ago on the original Portlock Park. The field as it is today is many times worse.

Whew! Now that I've got that out of my system let me relate the goal scorers and highlights of F.C.'s most recent match.

Despite the field conditions, F.C. and Orcas managed to provide spectators with an exciting, fast-paced match. Salt Spring rounds itself more into form with each succeeding game.

The local defense usually finds its stride earlier than the forwards, as the team is basically a defensive one. However, the mid-field and the front-runners are showing signs of cohesion.

Arnie Hengstler and Trevor Tamboline initiated F.C.'s improved build-ups with some fine, short, on-the-ground passes. These plays inspired mid-fielders

Lyle Brown, Mike Brown, and Jack Braak to become more adventurous which resulted in some excellent chances for Salt Spring.

Up front, Ken Duke, Bruce Coulter, and Jonathan Oldroyd gave Orca's defense fits with their tireless pursuit.

Lance Lomax provided the Salt Spring goal with a brilliant, left-footed volley from 20 yards.

Orcas showed some skill as well, missing a penalty, heading a corner kick off the cross bar, and scoring the tying goal on a long pass to an extremely fleet winger. Orcas appear to be one of F.C.'s main challengers this year, although Salt Spring was clearly the better team on Sunday.

Next week, Salt Spring meets Victoria Vantreights at Portlock Park at 2:15 pm.

The Parsons Cup, for match play competition, was won by Bob Morgan, who bested Jack Fraser on the 17th hole.

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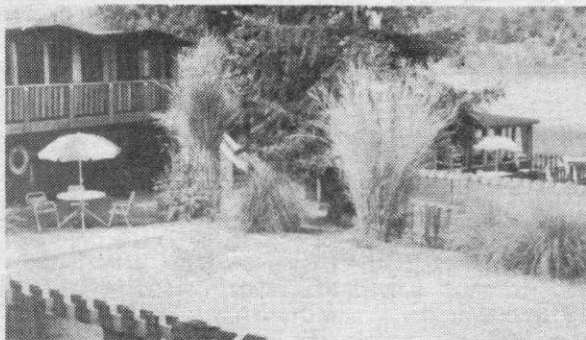
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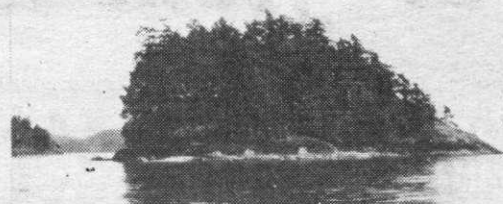

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Time to start harvesting in orchards

It comes as no surprise, but my-oh-my does the countryside ever look parched. This year, autumn has landed, not as a result of Jumping Jack Frost's efforts but rather as a side-effect of the bewildering ruinous drought. The oaks, maples, cherries, viburnums, barberries and burning bushes that haven't received regular watering are all a blaze of colour.

This is, of course a rather stressful event, and gardeners concerned about the welfare of their plants are still racing around with the hose and watering can, hoping to keep things going until the rains or the fall frosts arrive.

Well, even if the weather isn't normal, the calendar doesn't lie, and sooner or later we are going to get what's coming to us, namely autumn. If you have a large garden or lots of plants, you can't really afford to be complacent, for there is plenty of work to do in October.

The vegetable garden has taken on a somewhat used and depleted appearance as we all continue with the harvesting, but all too often, it's a hit and run affair, with the stripped stalks and unusable plant parts strewn all over the place. First and foremost, clean up and compost the undiseased vegetation. Next, you should consider liming if it is needed, as bringing the pH up will help your winter covercrop to grow and maximize the production of organic matter.

If you haven't applied lime for three years or more, then it is time, as irrigating frequently leaches the calcium down below the root zone of most garden plants and vegetables. If you plan to let this sowing of cover crop carry right on through to next spring, it might be a good idea to apply and turn under any seaweed, manure or organic matter that still needs to be broken down, so that over the course of the winter, those little microbes and soil creatures can do your composting job for you.

Save compost and rotted, aged manures for a late winter or early spring top dressing (after the rains). As soon as the soil is turned, throw down a green manure-cover crop so that it can get started right away and get ahead of the weeds. Fall rye or winter wheat make a good dense cover when applied at the rate of one pound per 125 square feet of bed area.

The tops of your asparagus plants should be cut down when they fade and yellow. The Jerusalem artichokes will also finish soon and they should be cut back to just above soil level, but don't dig them until you need them for the kitchen, as they shrivel and dry very rapidly when removed from the soil. For the other artichokes, the globe type, this month is prime for lifting the plants and dividing off the crown suckers for a revitalized new planting. Choose a location that is in full sun and has a sandy soil to which some rotted manure has been added.

There is still time to plant out some broccoli, spring cauliflowers and cabbages, and don't forget the handful of lime and some bonemeal mixed into each planting hole. This month sow out some corn salad, radishes, spinach, mustard greens, and for the earliest of crops next year, sow out some early peas later this month.

The other crop you should be planting out this month is garlic, so that it will sprout and set up a good root system for a jump start next spring. Select a site that has rich, well-drained soil, fairly high in organic matter, and is in full sun, then mix in some bonemeal or rock phosphate before setting out the individual cloves, one inch deep

and six inches apart. Water them in well, after planting, but then don't water them again this season. Pull up a couple more inches of soil around your leeks and celery, to blanch the stems. Leave the leeks, your parsnips and the rutabagas or yellow turnips out in the garden until you need them, as a hard frost improves flavour and lifting for storage is unnecessary.

In the orchard the harvesting is in full swing, and this week it's definitely time to gather the walnuts (at least a few crows tell me it's time). Generally, as the husks start to crack or begin to turn brown, you should commence tree shaking and climbing, but the crows are the surest markers of harvest time, for even if the nuts aren't quite ready,

you had better get them or else.

The same sort of ultimatum exists for grapes, as dictated by the birds or the raccoons. Figs will be ripening soon, if not already, and harvests of apples and pears will be determined by the ripeness and the variety.

The domestic (or wild, but soon to be managed) blackberry canes will have finished bearing by now, and should have all of the fruited canes cut back to the ground level. This year's canes can be tied off

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and topped at a manageable height. The same holds true for raspberries, as these guys all bear only on second year wood, so why bother to carry all of that unproductive dead wood.

There is still time this season to establish new strawberry beds, or revitalize old ones, but remember

to assure good soil drainage and add in some extra potassium and phosphorus, to promote strong, productive plants. Well we've ramblled our way through this article and we're not even out of the veggie garden so next week it behooves us to continue with October's chores.



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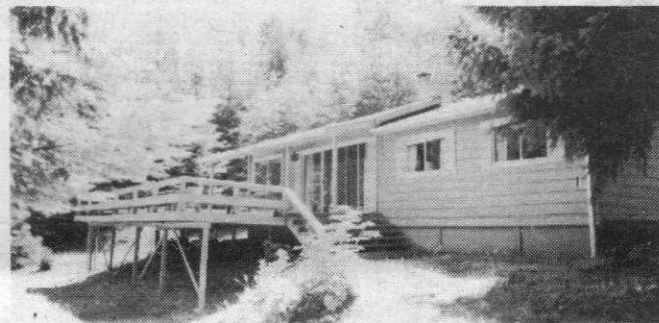

Comprehensive land zoning system proposed by professional foresters

B.C.'s professional foresters are asking the provincial government to adopt a new land-use zoning system which would group compatible users.

The proposal, put forward by the Association of B.C. Professional Foresters (ABCPF), advocates a zoning system based on "natural resource inventories, social values, economic trends, land capability and potential environmental impacts."

Present land-use allocation systems "tend to treat individual re-allocations and issues on an ad-hoc basis," the ABCPF says, making it "increasingly difficult to accommodate all the demands on natural resources within these systems."

"Gaps have resulted, like the failure to recognize some wilderness values, and the need for stronger protection of commercial forest values."

Adoption of its proposed system, the foresters say, would allow "responsible and objective" decisions to be made now on how much land is needed in future for timber, recreation, range, wilderness, wildlife, fisheries, parks, agriculture, transportation, mining, power and settlements.

The ABCPF-proposed system would define current land-use requirements and establish the future needs of all competing users of forest land.

It says the system may result in the creation of zones where protection of forest land is paramount, and zones where logging is permitted only under specific controls. In other zones, logging might be the prime use.

Development of each zone would be the subject of a detailed, integrated management plan, the foresters suggest. The association adds that each plan would be drawn up in co-operation with all government agencies having an

interest in Crown land.

In calling on the provincial ministry of forests and lands to assume responsibility for drafting the new system, the APFBC says

it is essential that the public be involved in the planning process, and that the system must include a mechanism to resolve land-reallocation conflicts.

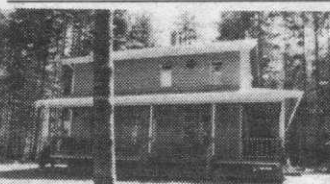

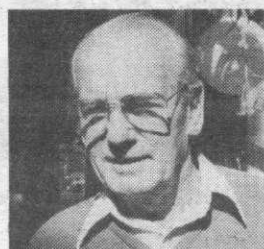

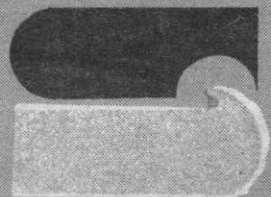
