

The Saturna Island Fire Department is undergoing a transformation — a phoenix arising from the ashes, so to speak.

The dedicated members of the fire department are deeply concerned about the discrepancy between what protection the department appears capable of providing, and what it can actually do. Those big, red trucks need functioning equipment, operated by well-trained, adequately protected firefighters.

The fire department has functioned for years on very little money — essentially on what could be raised at the twice-annual pig barbecues, and on some donations. Not only is the operating budget strained by the small cash flow (the money just covers licensing of vehicles, taxes and insurance), but so is the people reserve. The fire department needs someone in a paid part-time position as fire chief. All of the people who have devoted so much time to the fire department are already employed and cannot take the job on in the manner that it needs doing.

The year's start has thankfully been a quiet one for Pender RCMP. About half of Constable Brian Brown's 39 files for 1987 concern miscellaneous assistance calls.

The purpose would be to gather information about how other communities, our size numerically, have funded fire departments; to what level of fire protection we can reasonably aspire; what insurance coverage would that particular level of fire protection translate into.

Should we be successful, and the study is completed, it will provide a lot of information so we can decide what form of fire protection we will support on Saturna Island.

On February 21, at 10 am at the fire department, bring your fire extinguisher for re-charging and for practice on small, artificially-induced fires.

The fire department is offering this service at the steady support and insistence of the Women's Club — so we can thank both groups. Take advantage of this opportunity. One of the most crucial factors in a fire is time. If you can extinguish the fire before the fire department gets there, they'll thank you. Fire extinguishers are an excellent fire protection device.

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# Parlee monitors meeting of Galiano firemen

The South Galiano VFD is both a 'function' of the Capital Regional District and a non-profit society. The annual general meeting of the latter took place on Saturday, January 31 at 2 pm in the South Community Hall under the baton of Steve Parlee.

Steve holds the record for the shortest AGM ever held on Galiano but at 43 minutes, 25 seconds, he was unable to improve on his previous best time. His railroading skills give the impression that he worked for the CN or CPR, but in fact he is a highly regarded retired physician from Edmonton. This was his last meeting as president and Mike Hoebel expressed the thanks of the members for the sterling work Dr. Parlee has done for the society over the past several years.

The treasurer's report showed operating revenue of \$24,821 and expenditure of \$23,150. This financial statement was supported by the CRD financial statement for the fire department as of December 31, 1986. The society keeps its funds (erroneously described as *slush*) separate from the CRD operating account. The balance of the society's account at year end was \$6,504. During the year the society lent the fire department \$7,000 to assist in the purchase of the new communications system.

The Women's Auxiliary report was given by Dora Darling. The 27 members of the auxiliary are represented on the board of the society, man the fire hall and communications system in the event of fire, and raise money for the fire department society. In 1986, by means of various sales, \$4,320 was raised — of which \$3,129 has already been donated to the department for the purchase of

uniforms, equipment and to assist with the purchase of the communications system. The officers of the auxiliary are Marion Michaelson, Dora Darling, Helen Neale and Mimi Wishart.

It is required that the fire chief be re-appointed annually, and Chester Williams was nominated by Bill Sashaw and approved by and with acclamation.

The president's report replicated that of the fire chief, but in addition Dr. Parlee commended the work of Chester and his crew, which consists of captains Bill Stevens, Pip Finnis and Fred Stevens, plus volunteers Mike Hoebel, Jim Macdonald, Don Anderson, Fred King, Bill Ripley, Linda Simpson (now training for RCMP), Dave Gerlach, Enzo von Resori, Michael Sharp, Fred Wilson and Jim Watkins. The board members were complimented, particularly long-serving Marion Williams and Dorothy Hansom (now Baker). The new board was elected by acclamation and consists of Bill Sashaw as president, continuing members Marion Williams and Dorothy Baker as treasurer and secretary, Vic Zala, Norman Park, Gordon Hodson, Steve Gaylor and Marion Michaelson and Dora Darling for the WA. The auditing of the books will continue to be done by Edith Wishart.

## Playground

The Parents Group of Galiano School, having obtained a grant from the Lottery Fund, has set up a playground committee with representatives from the Activity Centre Society and the school staff. Chairman Rosemary Walker has the valuable assistance of Frank Sutherland from the school board.

The project of preparing the

playing area for use by the school and the public will probably be undertaken this spring in conjunction with the addition to the school. The playing field area is about 50 by 100 meters and this has been graded but will need much additional work and a great deal of topsoil before it is ready for turf. Fill is required to consolidate the rather steep slope on the school side. Donations of fill will be gratefully received and for further details contact Ed Andrusiak of the parents group. Volunteer help may be needed for tasks such as raking. This playing area when complete will be large enough for a regulation-size soccer pitch, softball in summer, field hockey and two junior soccer pitches. Rosemary expects to announce shortly a public information meeting regarding the playground.

## School

School enrollment is still rising and for next September is expected to be 82. This will necessitate the use of four classrooms and enable the school board to convince the education ministry to release funds for the completion of the expansion begun four years ago. An existing classroom will be converted to a library, the portable classroom will be removed so two new classrooms will have to be constructed. Also in the plans are new washrooms, which will also be available to the public using the Activity Centre.

An addition to the staff for two hours a week of supervision is Ben Miltner. The change to male

supervision is prompted by the number of children from single parent (mother) families and the need for a male role model. It is psychologically accepted that young boys learn appropriate male behaviour consciously, or subconsciously from their fathers.

If there is no 'father figure' in the home, this can present problems. What the board might consider in future years is to insist on having at least one male teacher instead of the present situation where each of the four classroom teachers and the principal's relief are all female.

Mrs. Brinson, the school principal, is just about to embark on the next of her musical productions, *Oliver*. This well-known and loved musical based on Dickens' *Oliver Twist* is a joint school-community project. Audition for adult parts will take place next Saturday, February 7.

## Darts

John Silvey reports that on Saturday, January 24, the Rod and Gun Club held a successful darts tournament. A contingent from Surrey augmented by four competitors from Ladner came to Galiano and showed the locals some of the finer points, very appropriately, of the game. The invaders from the mainland took three of the first four prizes, although Gladys Wilson and son Fred Jr. placed third. Bud Baines won a prize for the highest score (156). The tournament was so much enjoyed that plans are already being made for a return match.

The rising popularity of darts as a sport has generated the idea of a Galiano Challenge Cup for teams of eight. The competition will be restricted to Galiano residents and the cup will be held by the

sponsoring organization of the winning team.

On Saturday, January 31, three teams played in the inaugural match of this competition at the Rod and Gun Club. In addition to the players, about 50 spectators turned out to watch the event. The final team standings were: Rod and Gun Club, 20 wins; the Pub, 16.5 wins; and the Golf Club, 11.5 wins. Highest score for three darts was won by Scott Harrold with 125. After a lapse of one month, any Galiano team may challenge the Rod and Gun Club for the trophy.

## Coming Events

Saturday, February 7 will be a busy one on Galiano. The Burns Night supper at the North End is sold out but Dorothy Ross at 2294 has a waiting list for cancellations. At the South Community Hall, tickets will be available at the door for a musical evening by Brad Prevedorsos, guitar, and Mary Reher on flute. Details were published in *Driftwood* on January 28, page 23. Tickets are \$4 adults and \$2 for children from 6 to 12.

In future, all morning services at St. Margaret's Church will begin at 11 am to fit in with the arrival times of ferries. Next Sunday, Father Malins of Victoria will conduct an Anglican service. Parishioners are urged to attend the Annual Vestry Meeting at 2 pm the same day, to hear reports of the past year and to elect officials for the coming year.

The second Monday of the month is Ladies Service Club day. On Monday, February 8, the ladies will hold their annual general meeting and formulate plans for the new season at the home of Fern Stewart at the end of Highland Road.

# Arts school offers instruction

Galiano School of Arts (GSA) is a non-profit society which was created to provide enrichment and extra-curricular activities for children and families on Galiano Island. Last summer, in July and August, we ran our pilot project, *Summer Adventures*, offering a choice of 13 course in visual and performing arts, athletics, and outdoor skills and nature studies. Enrollment was 300, 26 classes were held, 13 instructors hired and five volunteers worked long hours to produce a successful six weeks of activities.

*Winter Adventures* now in progress offers ongoing classes in Kodaly music, ballet and soccer.

The school is now in the progress of becoming a registered non-profit society, and donations to the bursary fund will soon be tax-deductible. We thank the community for its support; the church, ladies service club, Thrift Shop and many individuals for their generous donations during our first year.

In January 1987, the school embarked on a development project which will enable us to research programming, develop marketing skills and learn administration for arts organizations through a format of training and work experience. GSA has made presentations to various community associations outlining project goals and would be pleased to communicate with those groups

who have not been in contact with us yet and would like to know of our future plans. Please contact Rosemary Walker and Akasha Forest at 539-2788.

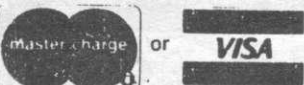

# Commission okays tennis court

The Salt Spring Island parks and recreation commission is proceeding with plans to construct a fourth tennis court at Portlock Park.

At its annual general meeting January 19, the commission adopted a proposal outlined by member Jocelyn Holmes.

Holmes suggested that the fourth court be constructed along the east side of Portlock Park's existing tennis facility. Placement of the new court in the location suggested will necessitate relocation of the practice area, but Holmes pointed out that it will also reduce the new court's paving and construction costs.

If constructed adjacent to the existing courts, she said, the new court will be able to share existing fencing.

In approving construction of the fourth tennis court, the commission stipulated that its cost not exceed \$33,000. Financing for the

court will come from four sources: an \$11,000 grant from Dr. Jack Fisher; an \$11,000 grant from the B.C. Lotteries Branch (already approved); \$5,500 from the Salt

Spring Tennis Association; and \$5,500 from the parks and recreation commission.

The new court is expected to be completed this summer.

Pursuant to Section 769 of the Municipal Act, the following By-law No. 1508, cited as "Outer Gulf Islands Magic Lake Estates Sewerage System Compulsory Connection By-law, 1987," is hereby published as at third reading and prior to final adoption.

### A BY-LAW TO REGULATE COMPULSORY CONNECTIONS TO THE MAGIC LAKE ESTATES SEWERAGE SYSTEM ON NORTH PENDER ISLAND IN THE OUTER GULF ISLANDS ELECTORAL AREA

**WHEREAS** the Capital Regional District did by Supplementary Letters Patent made the 14th day of July, 1982, obtain within a part of North Pender Island in the Outer Gulf Islands Electoral Area defined by By-law No. 768, "Outer Gulf Islands Magic Lake Estates Sewerage System Specified Area Establishment and Loan Authorization By-law 1980", and pursuant to Section 2 of Division XXX of its Letters Patent the powers contained in Section 611(5)(b) of the Municipal Act;

**AND WHEREAS** the Capital Regional District has found it necessary to require the owners of real property in the specified area to connect their buildings and structures to the sewer provided;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Board of the Capital Regional District in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

1. (i) Owners of real property shall connect their buildings and structures to the appropriate sewer connections in accordance with this By-law and the other applicable By-laws of the Capital Regional District.

(ii) Notice to connect shall be served by registered mail or personal service upon any owner of any property to which a sewer connection has been installed and whose buildings and structures have not been connected to that sewer connection. The notice shall require the owner to connect or cause to be connected the buildings and structures in which plumbing is installed to the sanitary sewer connection within the period stated in the notice to connect. The period stated shall be not more than two months.

(iii) In the event that any owner fails or neglects to connect his buildings or structures that contain plumbing installations to the public sanitary sewer in the manner prescribed in this By-law within the period permitted by the notice, the Capital Regional District may provide for having the work done at the expense of the owner and the Capital Regional District may recover the expense, with interest at the rate of six per cent a year, with costs in the same manner as municipal taxes.

(iv) In order to facilitate the carrying out of the connection the Capital Regional District by its employees, servants or contractors may enter upon the owner's property and cause the connection to be made.

hat for most effective serving.

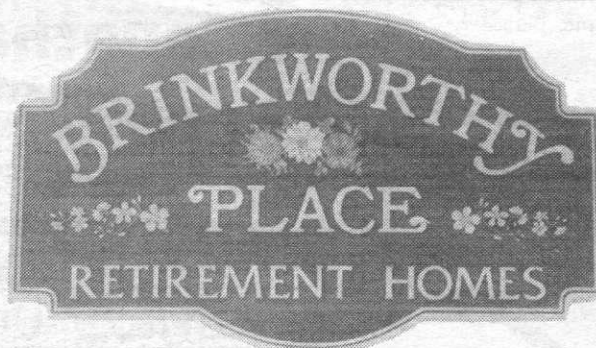

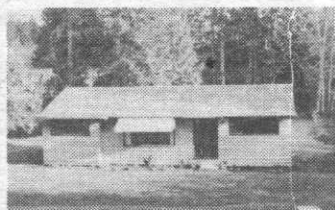

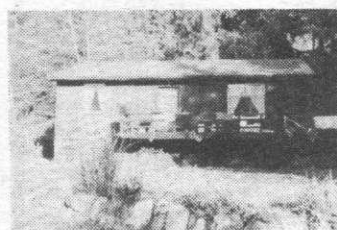
