Locals aim for better awareness

A local group hoping to increase public awareness about adoption has written Premier Bill Vander Zalm asking that November 19 through 25 be declared National Adoption Week.

Judy Webb, who heads Society of Special Needs Adoptive Parents (SNAP) in Nanaimo, says adoption

support groups from across Canada have requested their provinces do the same.

Webb says the purpose of a National Adoption Week would be twofold: to make the public more aware of some of the issues faced by adoptive families and to draw those families together.

She noted that last year in British Columbia alone, more than 400 children were adopted, and this does not include children adopted through private agencies.

She said the government's policy of keeping the names of

Canadian Scottish ready for the Fray

The Canadian Scottish Regiment has played an important role in the history of Salt Spring Island.

To honour the regiment and the men of Salt Spring who have served in it, the SSI Historical Society on Tuesday November 14, beginning at 2 p.m., will make a special presentation at the Legion on the regiment's history.

Second of five parts.

On June 2, 1944 the Canadian Scottish were in Southampton boarding the ships to carry them to France.

Lt. Col. Cabeldu described the scene later as follows: "There was a wonderful feeling of optimism everywhere and I must say I felt very proud of all the tanned and bronze-faced lads going into the assault with me."

Dr. Roy explains the assault plan in broad terms as follows:

"The 3rd Canadian Infantry Division would be in the centre of the British Second Army's three division assault from the sea. The Canadians were to land along a six-mile front astride the River Seulles ... The 7th Brigade would assault with the Winnipeg on the right and the Regina on the left ... "C" Company of the Canadian Scottish, commanded by Major D.G. Crofton, was to land under the Winnipeg's command with the intention of capturing Vaux and the enemy positions on the right ..."

Dr. Roy then notes the other companies of the Canadian Scottish would follow along later to clean up enemy posts and to seize certain bridges essential to the armoured vehicles which had the task of sweeping inland to capture more bridges that could be used for a German counterattack.

Helping us to Remember

Part of Ivan Mouat's job as president of the Royal Canadian Legion is to help people remember the past.

As the number of Canadians involved in either world war or any of the other wars of which this country played a part continues to decline, Mouat's job is getting harder to do.

That is one of the reasons why last year, he invited a representative from the high school to lay a wreath

during the Remembrance Day service in honour of one of 10 local servicemen who died in the Second World War.

This year, that will be done by Tara Martin, president of the student council, in honour of Chief Petty Officer Samuel Beddis who served in the navy for three years before he went missing in September, 1942.

"One of our big jobs is to look after the dependents and to perpetuate the idea of remembrance," said Mouat adding that the job is becoming harder every year.

Beddis, who was a student on the island himself, enlisted at the age of 25 and had been working as an engineer aboard the HMCS *Ottawa*. That ship was lost following a five-day battle in the North Atlantic.

Waist-high wheat complicates assault as Canadian Scottish thrusts forward

Soon after 6 a.m. on June 6, "C" Company boarded its landing craft from the HMS *Ulster Monarch*.

About two hours later, after a rough and wet ride with the element of surprise on their side, they landed on the beaches and proceeded towards Vaux. After capturing Vaux, fighting hard for every yard they gained, "C" Company proceeded to Ste. Croix. A platoon sergeant with "C" Company was Sgt. Bobby Atkins of Ganges.

Meanwhile, the remaining companies of the Scottish were landing on the beaches amidst stranded landing craft, barbed wire, mines, machine gun fire and exploding mortar and artillery shells.

The wounded were protected by sand dunes and moving among them was Padre Seaborn and medical personnel.

The landing craft carrying "B" company's Number Ten platoon was hit on its ramp by two mortar bombs just as the platoon disembarked. One private was killed and the commander, Lieut. Russell, with several others, was seriously wounded.

Sgt. Ken Byron promptly assumed command of the platoon. Although badly wounded, he carried on until late that afternoon when he was ordered back and a corporal took over.

Endangering the advance of armoured vehicles was an 88-mm gun emplacement hidden in an innocent looking haystack near "A" Company. The Company Commander, Major Plows, spotted it and ordered Lieut. Clarke take it out. Clarke's classic reply was "Who? Me?"

He then immediately crawled with several of his men to a position

behind the haystack from where they ran up to it, uncovered the concrete emplacement, opened a door leading into it and threw in a grenade which destroyed it.

As soon as they had done this they found themselves surrounded by about 50 German soldiers — all with their hands up wanting to surrender.

Meanwhile, "C" Company was inland on the outskirts of Ste. Croix where a violent and critical battle raged. Major Crofton, Company commander, could see the Winnipeg Rifles were being pushed back, so heavy was the opposition.

He later wrote "I realized that this area of the beachhead was in danger of being overrun by the enemy." Complicating the situation was a field of waist-high wheat which gave the Germans excellent concealment. However, "C" Company's leading platoon under Lieut. Roger Schejelderup charged through the wheat field and attacked the enemy positions with much hand-to-hand fighting.

In so doing, they contained the enemy in the village as ordered by Major Crofton.

Enemy resistance finally broke when "A" Company reinforced "C" Company, and Canadian tanks and artillery concentrated their fire power on the enemy positions.

As soon as the crisis at Ste. Croix stabilized, "A" and "C" Companies swept forward towards Cumbiers leaving the Winniegs behind to stamp out the remaining resistance.

By 4:30 p.m. on D-day, after nearly eight hours of intensive fighting and suffering many casualties, the Canadian Scottish battalion had penetrated more than four miles inland from the beaches and was spearheading the brigade attack.

By the end of the day the battalion had advanced six miles.

Nurses to be saluted

The nearly 70 legion members who will participate in this year's Remembrance Day March will salute the Nursing Sisters Association as part of their memorial day service Saturday morning.

The association consists of a group of eight nurses and dieticians from the island who served both in Canada and overseas during the second World War.

It will be the first time legion members have honoured this particular group and according to Ivan Mouat, president of the local legion and the organizer of this year's Remembrance Day service, the nurses were selected because of the role they played in caring for the wounded.

"Some of them were right up front in the invasion of Normandy," said Mouat adding that after the war, many continued their work with veterans. "We feel it is a group that should be honoured."

After the ceremony, the eight-member association will lay a wreath at the base of the cenotaph in downtown Ganges along with close to 20 other groups and individuals in honour of those who gave their lives during all of the wars in which Canada has been involved.

Altogether more than 75 people will participate in this year's march which will be lead by the RCMP and will follow a path extending from the post office to the cenotaph. The service, which begins at 10:45 a.m., will include a bible reading, prayer, and the playing of the last post.

Her "Majesty" was Queen Anne who, at that time, occupied the throne of England, and in her honour the name was changed from Fort Royal to Annapolis Royal.

As a parent of two school age children, I am appalled by the frequency of lice infestations.

My sons attend Salt Spring Elementary school and my eldest son and his class were checked for lice on a Friday and he was cleared. Two other children in his class were found to have lice and sent home. Six days later my son had live, crawling lice on his head. I was extremely upset and treated our entire family. It took many hours to sterilize our home.

Then I discover that while one class was checked on the Friday before others were not. What is the point of checking one class and not the entire school?

My experience at Fernwood was a whole school check with the assistance of parents all in one day. This should be done the first week of school and at least every two months thereafter.

I do not want to go through this again and find it upsetting to think that the chance of an updated incident is probable.

Parents need to be more aware and institute continual home checks. Our school needs to develop a policy of prevention of spread by continuing whole school checks including both staff and students.

Let's push our school system to implement these continuous checks and be not blase, it could be your home next!

We are a small, somewhat isolated island and should be able to eradicate this epidemic completely.

More equitable

The following letter, filed with the Driftwood for publication, is being sent to Hon. Terry Huberts, MLA, Hon. Lynne Hunter, MP, and the BC Telephone Company, Regulator Matters, att: Customer Services.

To the Editor,
In a letter dated October 2, 1989 to Ganges telephone customers, the B.C. Telephone Company announced a referendum to

be held in October/November, 1989 on two proposals: Proposal A which would have one way EAS (Extended Area Service) to certain exchange numbers in Victoria. Proposal B which would retain the present rate structure.

Unstated, but implied, was that if a majority voted for proposition A, then proposition B, the present rates, would be discontinued. (The above was confirmed in a phone call to the B.C. Telephone residence liaison telephone number given at the bottom of their October 2 letter). Such a situation would be bad news for fixed budget retirees.

This means that those who do not vote for proposition B, or fail to vote at all, may wake up one morning and find that their rates have been increased, which, in their innocent belief, they had thought the old rates would still be continued for them.

The telephone company should state the preceding two paragraphs in unequivocal language.

The telephone company also said that this referendum was being carried out the way the CRTC (Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission) had directed them to so do.

A more equitable arrangement would be for those who wish to have the EAS to pay for it and for those who wish to pay for local service only, to pay the lower rates. I understand this is what is done in Ontario for extended dialling in Ottawa. (Also under the jurisdiction of the CRTC.)

adopted children confidential makes it hard to find and connect people who adopt.

The result, Webb said, is that many families operate in isolation and without the support they need.

"Research shows that families that have the most success are those that have a good support system. Until families can connect with other families and find out what the child has been through, it is hard for them to move forward."

If connection is so important, she said, it is because many of the difficulties faced by families are particular to that group. She added that only a handful of professionals are familiar with their often unique problems.

"Some of the children have emotional damage, the children may have had parents with drug problems or in other cases, the adopted children go through difficulties when they become teenagers."

Connecting these families is one of the things SNAP set out to do when it formed in British Columbia two years ago.

Since that time, seven other branches have formed here and the Nanaimo group has close to 500 people on its mailing list alone.

Said Webb: "We don't have magic answers or solutions, but it is just a relief to know you are not alone out there."

She added that she hopes to hear within the next week whether B.C. will approve the request.

New Fees for Processing Timber Mark Applications

Transporting Timber from Private Land
(Forest Act, Section 158-1-i)
Timber marks authorize the transport of timber from private land.

Commencing November 1, 1989, the British Columbia Forest Service will charge a processing fee to issue private **Timber Mark Certificates** and **Letters of Marking Authority** — commonly known as timber marks.

The cost of obtaining a timber mark will be:

- \$100 for processing application and issuing a **Timber Mark Certificate** for private land;
- \$50 for processing an application for and issuing a **Letter of Marking Authority** for private land; and
- \$25 for amending a **Timber Mark Certificate**.

Timber Mark Certificates and Letters of Marking Authority are required by law. **Timber transported in contravention of these requirements is subject to seizure and sale.**
(Forest Act, Section 143.)

Applications for timber marks can be obtained from any Forest Service office.

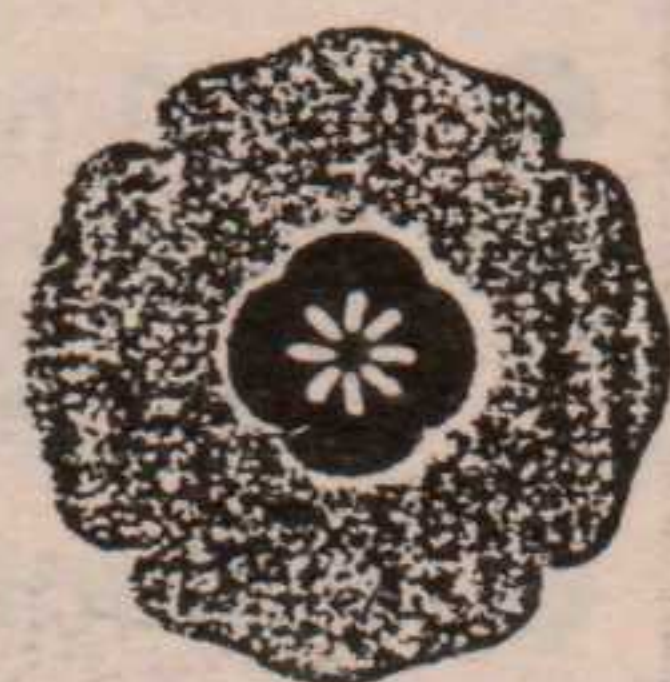
Doug Harker is chairing the committee responsible for the companion volume.

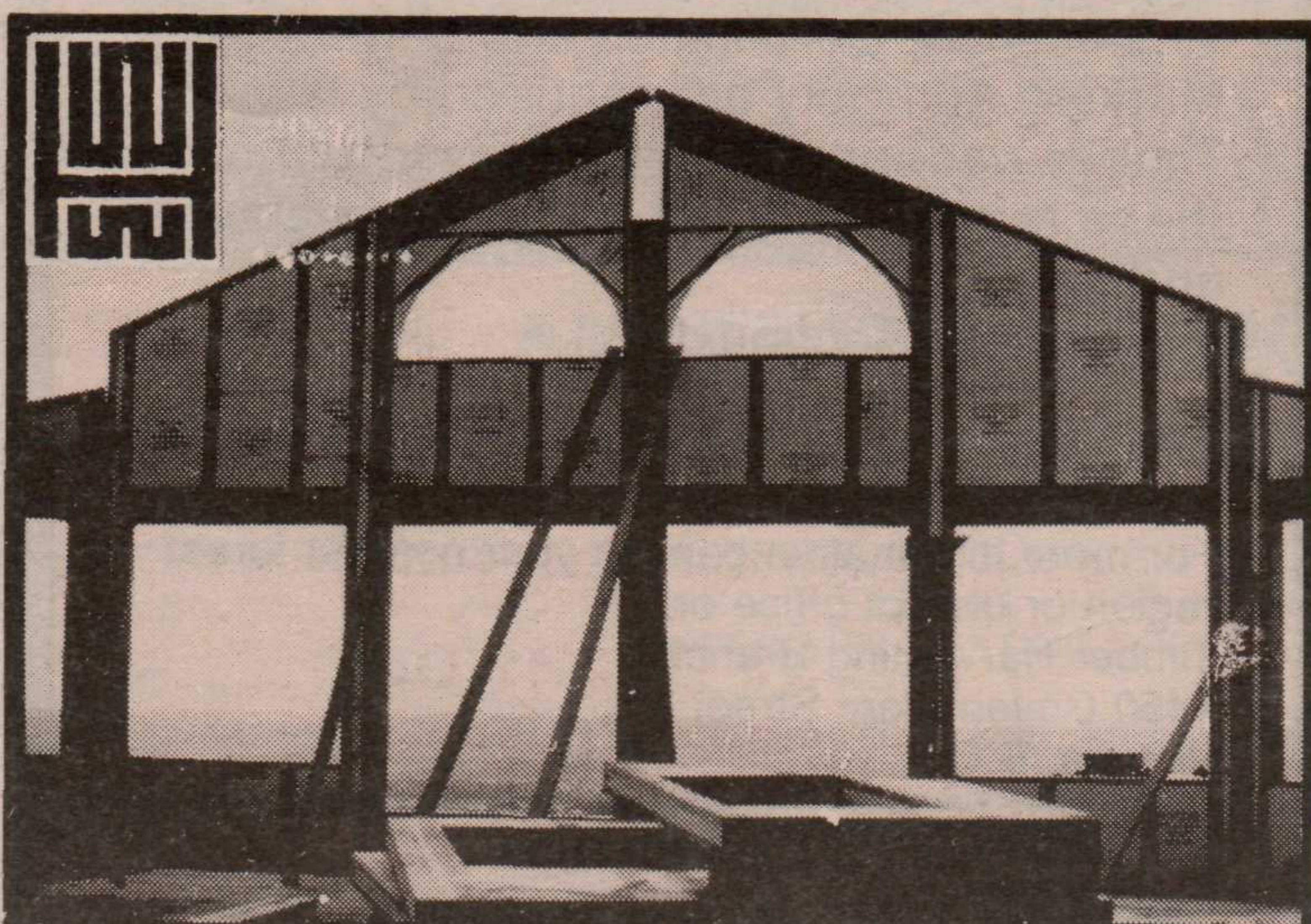

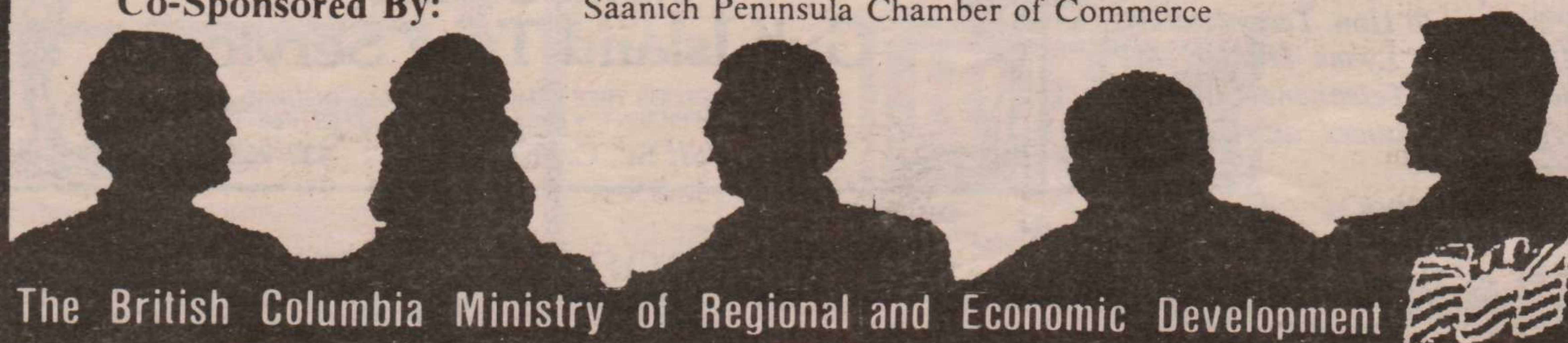

Crumblehulme says the narrow stretch of road on village Bay Road at the corner of Fernhill is much narrower than specifications called for back in 1923 when the road was built, but since Highways did not have an aesthetic department they will now rely on local residents to bring forth their proposals before action is taken.

"If they didn't you can be sure there would be a local hue and cry if the Highways department cut down trees along the route which

some residents felt should be saved," Crumblehulme says.

Since the Miner's Bay area surrounding this congested roadway is one of the most picturesque on the island, Chamber members feel every care should be taken to retain the area's natural beauty as well as providing safer thoroughfares.

Members are mailing to local householders a request for them to participate in the input regarding this matter.

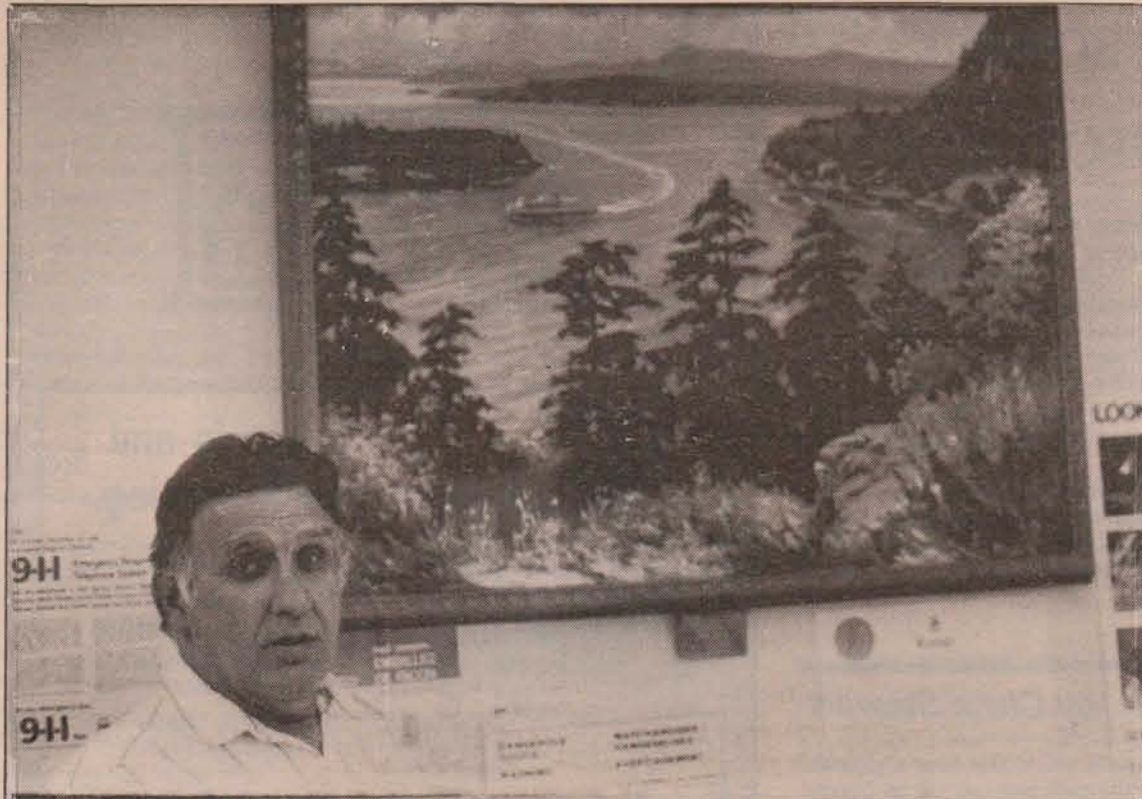

Galiano postmaster retires from counter

Galiano's postmaster Jim Ripley retired on October 31 after 13 years behind the counter.

Jim took over responsibility for Her Majesty's Royal Canadian Mail in August 1976 after going through a series of bureaucratic applications and interviews. He replaced this island's Ken Fraser in the job.

Couriers at the time were Sally Riddell in North Galiano and on the retirement of Don New in the South. Jim's son Jaimie. Later Tom Rogers did deliveries for a short time. He was followed by Jim's daughter Isobel Stevens, the present courier. In North Galiano Terry Wishart followed Mrs. Riddell and was himself replaced by Jim's younger son Bill.

Jim and Sheila Ripley and family first came to Galiano in 1957 to help Sheila's mother and grandmother establish themselves in their newly purchased home. In 1970 Jim retired from an army career and the family purchased property on Montague Harbour Road and took up residence on the island.

In his 13 years as postmaster, there have been many changes in post office service. Letter rates have gone from eight cents for a first class letter to the present 38 cents during those years for example.

Retirement looks good to Jim. He likes to work with wood and hopes to spend much time in his workshop. Another interest for him is military history.

Replacing Jim at the post office is Terry Bell, an employee of Canada Post from Saanich. She is here on a temporary basis and will commute daily from her home.

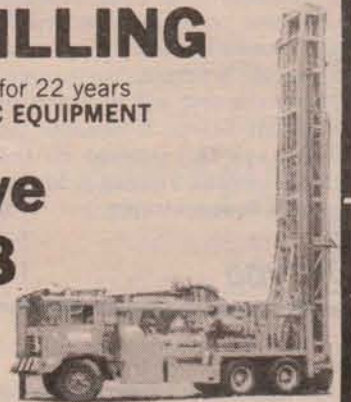

Fourteen countries are expected to participate, each one is permitted to enter 12 men and 12 women in this new event.

Dean Fisher and Sea Lions

Dr. Dean Fisher of Alcala Drive gave a lecture on sea lions and seals at a recent Elder Hostel event held in the North Hall.

Fisher, a retired professor of Zoology from the University of British Columbia (UBC), headed a federally funded study of the Stellar sea lions on the Kerouard Islands (south of Cape St. James off the southern tip of the Queen Charlottes) several years ago. The object of the study was to learn as much as possible about these massive and war-like creatures.

Spending most of their life at sea and ranging the coast from southern Alaska to mid-Vancouver Island, the Stellars return to their breeding islets (there are now only areas) each summer. There the males land and defend their territory to the death while awaiting the females to arrive.

Shortly after the pups are born the females go back to sea returning nine days later for mating. As a part of the study a UBC student, quartered in a shack hanging precariously on a cliff above the colony, took slides of the three week event.

Dr. Fisher's description of the study, some excellent slides and his obvious enthusiasm for the other sea creatures along our coast made the evening an enjoyable and worthwhile event.

Fisher notes he was consulted last summer for a documentary made for TV by Oopik Films of Montreal. The program will be shown on television sometime in the spring, he understands.

In recent issues of the *Driftwood* we notified our customers about this upgrading project, and that the work should be completed in October.

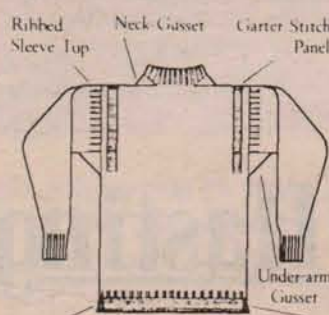
We have had problems getting some of the important equipment on schedule. This has caused the project to drag on into November.

Interest in Joan of Arc spurs Ford's latest book of poetry

Cathy Ford's admiration of French heroine, Joan of Arc's intelligence, strength and sense of commitment triggered her latest book *Saffron, Rose and Flame*, a collection of 100 poems.

Inspired by the attributes of this heroic French woman, martyred at the age of 19, and responsible for ending the siege of Orleans in France's 15th Century war against Britain, Cathy found she couldn't leave the subject alone.

Taking ten years and unlimited hours of research into the courageous events of Joan's colourful life, Cathy found the more material she unearthed the more involved she became.

"There was so much to learn about her on a world-wide scale. It simply wouldn't leave me alone. I would think I had completed my research and then I would find the subject of her challenging life just wouldn't leave me," Cathy said.

The result is a collection of 100 sensitive, thought-provoking poems influenced by her sacrificial life. Published by Cynergy Books of Prince Edward Island, copies of *Saffron, Rose and Flame* are available locally at the House of Taylor.

Cathy, who has the distinction of having published nine books of poetry, with a novel and another book of poems still in the making, began writing poetry as a very young girl in Vanderhoof, B.C., followed by a stint of writing for her school paper.

But her writing career officially emerged when a publisher asked her to submit some of her work. With his encouragement, she compiled a collection of what she believed to be her best work, under the title *Stray Zale*.

Faced with the choice of pursuing either a medical or writing career when she enrolled at the University of British Columbia, Cathy gradually yielded to the "power of the pen" and graduated with a Master's degree in Fine Arts. She has since worked as a publisher, typesetter and book designer, and acquired eight years experience as an author in Vancouver prior to moving to Mayne.

She claims Vancouver life was too cluttered to allow her time to write.

Cathy was a founding member of the League of Canadian Poets' Feminist Caucus. She served as president of the LCP, 1985-86. She was also a member of West Coast Women and Words and the Federa-

tion of B.C. Writers. Her earlier works include *Blood Littering*, *Tall Trees*, *Affairs of the Heart*, *By Violent Means* and *The Desiring Heart*. She has been the recipient of two Canada Council grants.

Now with a young son to raise, Cathy is determined to set aside time each day for writing and research. She prefers relegating her writing time to the evening hours, when she retires to her study to create with words the thoughts and descriptions which captivate her readers.

For Cathy's latest book of poems, local ecclesiastical embroiderer Leni Tausig used fine French silk brocade, the beautiful saffron-coloured cover, the publisher photographed the piece with such perfection, one can almost feel

the intricate stitchery used to create the beautiful jacket. Against the red background of hand-stitched panels and tulips, an inviting Gothic window opens to a radiant blue sky while overhead butterflies and birds flit lazily. In the foreground the saffron and red flames appear, symbolizing heroine Joan being burned at the stake.

The cover is an outstanding work of art by distinguished Tausig, a graduate of the Royal School of Needlework, London, who is widely commissioned as an embroiderer.

Designing Cathy's cover for *Saffron, Rose and Flame*, is believed by some to be among her finest work.
