Student cookie sales help Third World kids

Sweet treats for Valentine's Day — cookies baked by local students — will be sold in Ganges and Fulford Friday to raise money for school supplies in developing countries.

Project Love, sponsored by the Canadian Organization for Development through Education, encourages Canadian students to raise money and purchase school supplies which are sent to students in a developing country.

Six classes of Salt Spring students have been making Valentine's Day cookies over the past week. Included are Georgette Pauker's Grade 8 class and Robin Rudolph's

Grade 6 class, both at Salt Spring Island Middle School (SIMS).

SIMS students will be selling their cookies in Ganges Valentine's Day. Last year their fundraising provided school supplies for students in Ghana.

At Fulford Elementary School, Stella Weinert's Grade 1-2 class, Arlene Sadler's Grade 1-2 class, Richard Magnusson's Grade 2-3 class along with Pat Beitel and Robyn Huntley-Smith's Grade 4-5 class have all made cookies which will be sold at Patterson's Store.

Last year, Fulford students were able to buy \$178 worth of school supplies.

Embodiment workshop

Letting go of obstacles and habit patterns that keep people from experiencing who they truly are is part of an embodiment training workshop offered this weekend on Salt Spring.

Entering into the Embodied State — an Introductory Evening and Weekend Workshop on the Theme of Love will be led by Will Johnson.

The introduction runs from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. on Friday, while the workshop takes place from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday.

"By embracing again the experience of our body as the most basic component of our life, we are led to a renewed understanding of our identity and our relationship to the world. Fear and alienation gradually give way to a greater presence of contentment, love and bodily vibrancy," states Johnson's brochure. "The process of healing begins automatically as we learn to

open to the truth of our present experience and accept ourselves as we truly are, not as how we wish we were or think we should be."

Embodiment training is "a form of development work that combines the techniques and orientation of Western somatic psychotherapy with the goals and lineage of Eastern meditative practices."

Johnson is the founder and program director of The Institute for Embodiment Training. He has been a Buddhist practitioner since 1972 and received Rolfing training at the Rolf Institute. He is the author of *Balance of Body*, *Balance of Mind* and *The Posture of Meditation*.

Scholarship book ready

Parents should encourage senior students to examine this book closely, prepare their applications and submit them to the counselling centre by Friday, February 28.

- Grade 12 students who did not complete their Career and Personal Planning course last year should ensure that they attend the classes offered by Scott Bergstrom today and tomorrow. He and Maggie Allison will focus on teaching students to prepare applications for jobs and scholarships. This will include proper preparation of resumes and covering letters.

- Similar classes for Grade 11 students will start next week and continue every Wednesday and Thursday until April 1. Students who apply to the University of British Columbia have to write a separate exam to demonstrate proficiency in English before they will be accepted into any programs. Only students who earn an "A" in English 12 are exempt from writing this test.

Students who intend to write this test need to make themselves known to me quickly. I will be submitting a list of students who intend to write this exam to the university

next week. If we have about 10 students writing, they will send the test to us and we can administer it here. Otherwise, students will have to go to a larger centre to write. The university charges a fee of \$37 to each student who applies to write this exam regardless of where it is written.

- Starting Monday, March 3, Dave Spencer will again be offering free mathematics assistance on Monday evenings from 7 to 9 at GISS. 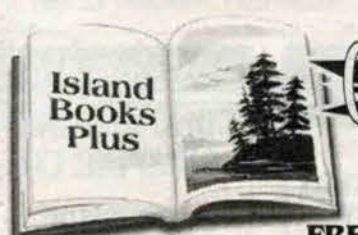

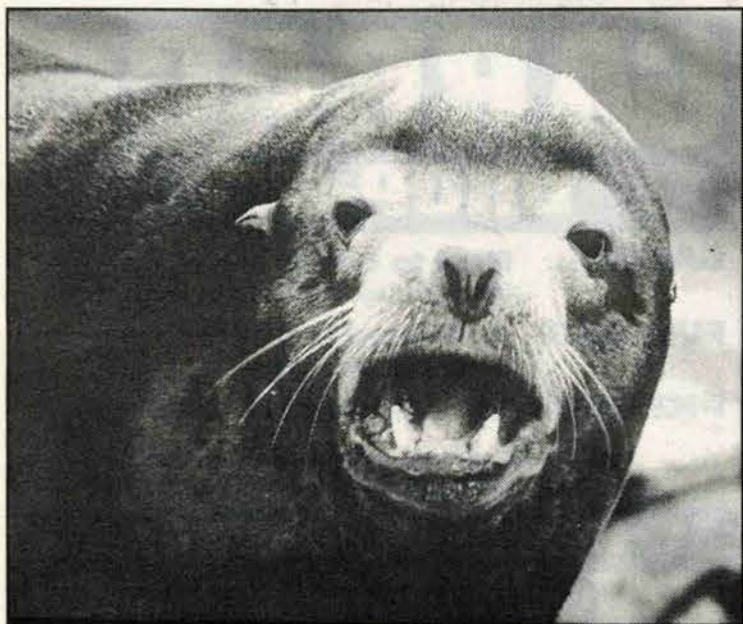

California sea lions acrobatic, playful

How can you tell the difference between a Steller and California sea lion? Stellers are much larger, paler in colour, and lack the high forehead bump (called a sagittal crest) seen on adult male California sea lions.

California sea lions are also more excitable, curious and noisy, making loud, honking barks, whereas Stellers utter deep bellows and are more likely to keep to themselves.

It's much easier to identify which is which when they're hauled out of the water, posing offshore or lounging on beaches and docks. When seen in the ocean, they're often gone in a flash, leaving the observer to say, "What was that?"

If you've ever visited an aquarium or zoo with a sea lion "act", it's almost certainly California sea lions that entertained you. These are the crowd-pleasing, trumpet-blowing circus stars preferred by aquarium trainers.

Wild California sea lions wouldn't be caught dead in a clown hat, but they are acrobatic and remarkably playful. They

blow and catch bubbles, play tag, toss kelp, turn somersaults and body surf.

Gregarious and intelligent, they seem to enjoy each other's company, crowding together on land. In the ocean, they travel alone or in groups, using their supple foreflippers to "porpoise" through the water up to 32 kilometres (20 miles) per hour.

Unlike Stellers, California sea lions don't breed in British Columbia, and by spring will migrate south to California and Mexico to meet the girls. Then, in fall, adult males and some juveniles will go north again, travelling up the Pacific coast. In the last 20 years or so, more and more are migrating as far as Vancouver Island.

No one is certain why more California sea lions are migrating this far north, but it's thought decreasing Steller sea lion populations might have an influence. On the other hand, perhaps Californians just know a good thing when they see it.

Some more eggless cakes, anyone? High interest spurs two more recipes

Never before have I devoted three consecutive columns to the same subject, but there's been a surprising amount of interest in eggless cakes. The first cake is an old family recipe that I forgot about, and also forgot how good it is. Eggless mayonnaise can be used by purists, since it only provides the fat and not the leavening.

AUNT TERRA'S MAYONNAISE CAKE

1 cup mayonnaise
1 cup sugar
1 tsp. cinnamon and 1/4 tsp. cloves or 3 Tbs. cocoa
1 tsp. salt
1 3/4 cups flour
1 tsp. soda

WHAT'S COOKING

1 cup boiling water
1 cup chopped dates
1 cup chopped nuts
1 tsp. vanilla
Dissolve soda in water, pour over dates and nuts and let stand. Mix sugar, cocoa or spices and mayonnaise together. Add flour and salt and mix well. Finally, pour in the dates and nuts and add vanilla. Bake in a nine-inch cake pan at 350 degrees F for 1 1/2 hours. It looks like it's going to overflow the pan but it won't. This doesn't need frosting.

The second recipe I remember from the '50s-'60's when it was

the "in thing." A cream cheese frosting is nice with this.

TOMATO SOUP CAKE

3/4 cup Crisco
1 cup sugar
1 can tomato soup
1 cup raisins
2 cups flour
1 tsp. cinnamon
1/4 tsp. cloves
1 tsp. soda
Cream sugar and Crisco. Sift the dry ingredients together and add flour mixture alternately with soup. Beat well. Add raisins which have been dusted with a bit of flour. Bake at 350 degrees F for one hour.

I was never able to develop a "fluffy" eggless cake, but both of these are good in their own right.

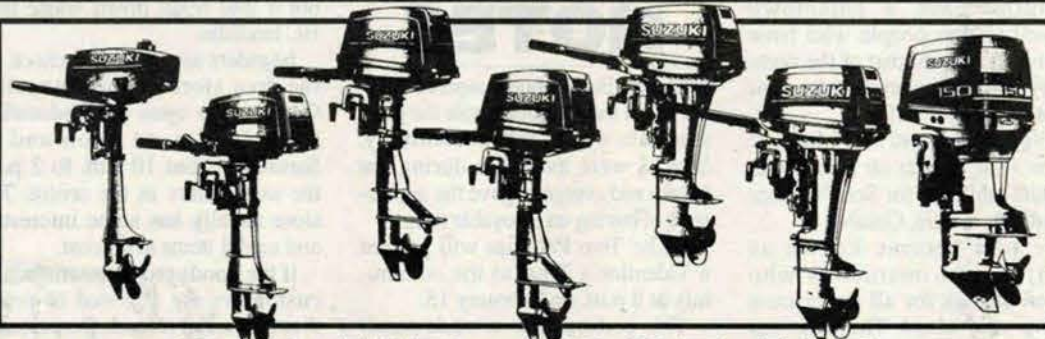

Thirty-five years ago

Two sides of a charming story were brought independently to Salt Spring by two retirees and reported by the Driftwood.

Mining engineer L.I. Lorentsen suffered a ruptured appendix on December 12, 1937 while working at the Wingdam Mine north of Quesnel. Rushed by car to hospital — and suffering further injury when the speeding car rammed another on the icy roads, flinging the patient from the back seat into the windshield — the man was almost dead when he reached the hospital.

The doctor operated at once. A few days later, he asked the recovering engineer what he most wanted.

Recalling the food of his youth, the man asked for two Norwegian specialties: Lutefisk and sweet barley soup flavoured with low-land blueberries. Miraculously, the doctor arrived with the requested dishes the next day.

After 10 weeks in hospital the man was released. He learned the doctor's wife had made the soup and Lutefisk and wanted to thank her in person but she was away.

Retiring to Salt Spring he struck up a conversation in January 1962 with Helene Baker, who had retired to the island after her husband died — and discovered she had been married to the doctor in Quesnel. So, 24 years later, he was finally able to thank her.

Thirty years ago

How to spell Salt Spring Island, as Salt Spring or Saltspring, was being debated in the pages of the Driftwood. Oldtimers maintained it should be

spelled Salt Spring, while government documents favoured Saltspring.

Twenty-five years ago

A proposed airstrip in the Burgoyne Valley, parallel to Fulford-Ganges Road, could not be established without rezoning the property, according to Capital Regional District (CRD) board executive director Dennis Young. Although the owner of a private airstrip could get approval from Transport Canada based on safety requirements, that did not give approval for such a use of the property.

Twenty years ago

Landed immigrants living on Salt Spring were not eligible for the lower residents' ferry rates because they were not resident electors. Only Canadian citizens or British subjects could be on the voters' list and that list was the basis for obtaining a residents' card, which guaranteed the lower rates. The issue was being investigated by the Human Rights Commission and the Salt Spring Island Community Society.

Farmer Ted Akerman reported losing 63 sheep to a marauding dog pack over the previous three weeks. The sheep were range stock which had been raised by the family for generations. The value of each was estimated at \$80 — or double for those ewes in lamb — putting the total loss at

\$7,500 to \$10,000.

Fifteen years ago

Finance Minister Hugh Curtis urged ratepayers to keep close tabs on mill rates so climbing property assessments wouldn't turn into a windfall year for taxes. CRD figures showed Salt Spring's taxable school and hospital assessments at \$48,212,891, up from \$31,936,875. Curtis said the higher assessments should have been balanced by a lower mill rate.

Ten years ago

Weekday ferry service between Vesuvius Bay and Crofton was interrupted between 10 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. so crews could work on upgrading both terminals. Work was to continue throughout February and March.

The Insurance Corporation of B.C. (ICBC) was warning motorists not to buy insurance licence plate decals without buying insurance from recognized Autoplan insurance agents. The warning was issued after decals were stolen in break-ins to Autoplan insurance agencies. ICBC warned it was illegal to operate an uninsured vehicle on B.C. roads and that the stolen decals were invalid.

Five years ago

Island residents turned out to support the Salt Spring Cinema from a rumoured threat to its Central Hall home. Co-owner/operator Gloria Nye said more than 500 people signed a petition supporting the theatre's place in the hall. A proposal to remove the movie screen from the hall stage had been made.

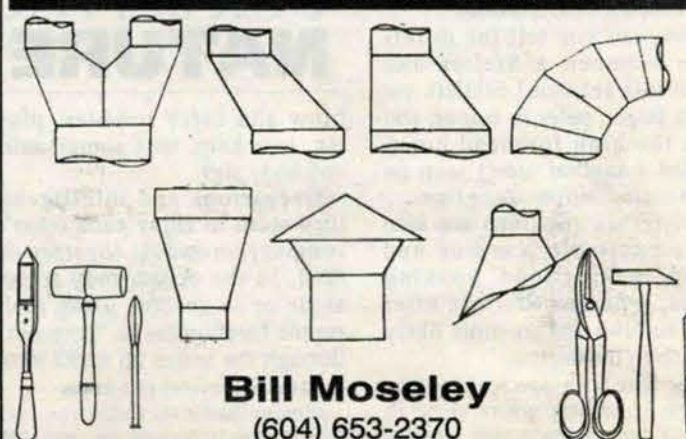

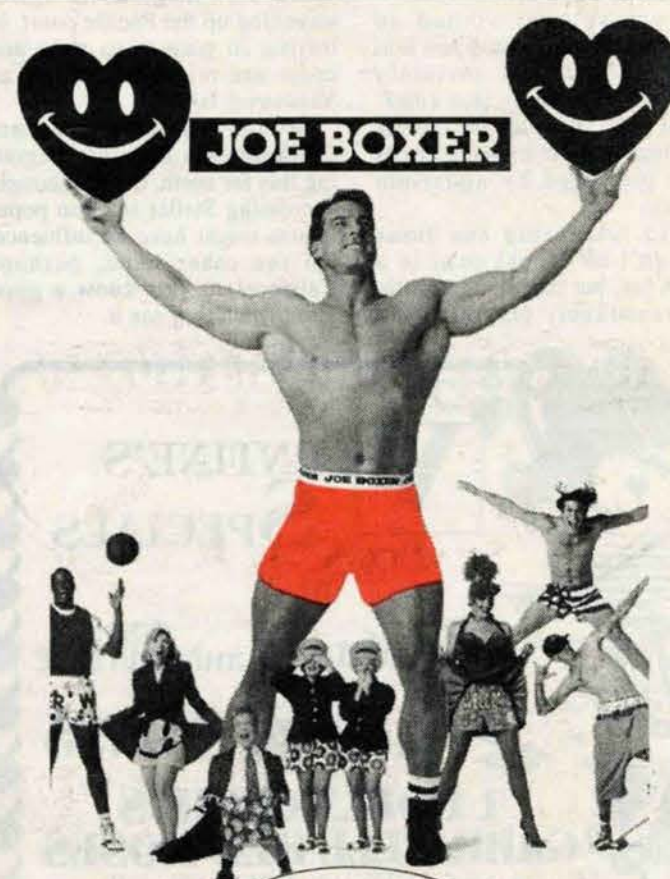
