

Spiritual understanding infuses colourful Rohana Laing artwork

Rohana Laing invites Salt Springers and visitors to view her collection of paintings, prints, batik hangings and photographs in an ArtSpring exhibition opening Saturday, October 1.

The reception follows on Sunday from 2 to 4 p.m.

Now based in Nanaimo but well known on Salt Spring as the minister of the United Church from 1998 to 2003, Laing is a woman with a style all her own.

"In fact," said Laing, "my being an artist influenced my style of ministry. I was known on Salt Spring as 'colourful,' not just because of my clothes, but because I was unconventional."

"[Laing's] inimitable style is everywhere evident in her exhilarating art, which in this exhibition includes many works inspired by her travels in Indonesia, South America and the Caribbean," states a press release.

"Vibrant with movement

and colour, they bring the lush world of the tropics to exuberant life."

Salt Spring, too, will be well represented in images created both during and since the years of Laing's ministerial tenure on the island.

A graduate of the Vancouver School of Art (now

the Emily Carr College of Art and Design), Laing taught design, textile arts and drawing for 10 years at Kwantlen College and supported herself as an artist. When the call came to enter the church, she obtained her masters degree in theology and additional training in psychological and spiritual

counselling, and served in two Vancouver congregations before moving to Salt Spring.

Since retirement, she's returned to her artistic calling, but with new insights born of her spiritual understanding.

Laing's exhibit runs through October 7.

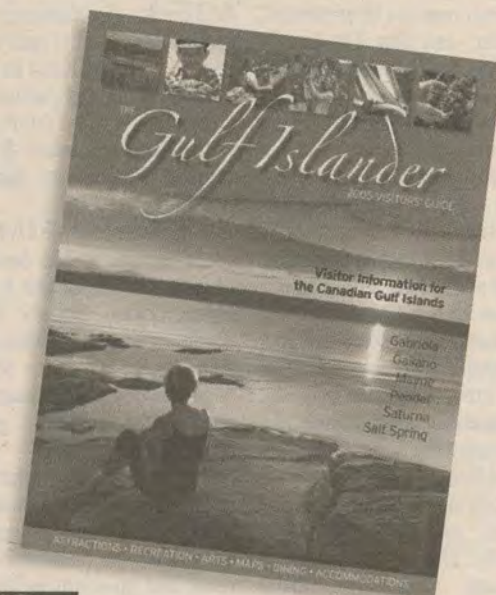

Rare Pied Pumkin gig at ArtSpring

When musician Shari Ulrich moved to Salt Spring Island in 1978, it had already been five years since the meteoric rise of Pied Pumkin as a cult folk favourite in B.C. and Canada, and a year after her reign with Valdy and the Hometown Band.

In fact, it coincided with Ulrich's life as a songwriter. Shari reluctantly left the island in 1988 when her rented cabin was sold.

"Those 10 years on Salt Spring were by far the most prolific of my life creatively," Ulrich said.

Pied Pumkin began their trail-blazing antics back in 1973. Dulcimer player Rick Scott teamed up with multi-instrumentalist Ulrich and Vancouver's mercurial guitarist Joe Mock, to inspire a generation of folkies.

"Their stage shows were renowned for off-the cuff craziness, gorgeous harmonies, and intricate, rhythmic tunes that filled the dance floor with happy gyrating fans," states a press release.

All three performers pursued separate entertainment careers, but "the magic was clearly still there" when the Pumkin rekindled to tour and record in 1998.

On Monday, October 3, Pied Pumkin performs a rare Salt Spring Island concert at ArtSpring.

The show will be early (7 p.m.) to allow for those who have to rise early or want to bring their children.

Last but not least, tenor Don Fisher will make a cameo appearance. With so many favourites in his repertoire, it will be a challenge to pin down just the right ones for this occasion. Free music begins at 12:10 at All Saints church followed by an optional lunch for \$5.50.

Family Guy movie a hit for fans of the crass TV show

Once upon a time, The Simpsons was the funniest animated show on T.V.

Fifteen years is a lot of material, however, and now The Family Guy has that honour. Not only are there three years of episodes of Family Guy on DVD, there is a spanking new DVD movie called Stewie: the Untold Story.

The Family Guy steals one Simpsons conceit — the dimwitted but lovable Dad at the end of a less-than-perfect family. Besides the wife and two troubled teens (neurotic, ignored daughter Meg and borderline-neanderthal son Chris), there's the maniacal mad-scientist infant Stewie and a sarcastic martini-swilling dog named Brian.

If you don't know your pop culture, just let Family Guy slide by. This is one reference-obsessed show. The DVD movie cranks up the references to a level of ridiculousness

heretofore unseen.

One trademark of the show is the "I remember when I" flashback. A character will remark about some past event, and the show will cut to some absurd scene in which the character's life intertwines with some sequence from a famous (or not so famous) pop culture event.

In the recent Stewie DVD, you get references to The Sound of Music, Star Wars, two Indiana Jones movies, Beverly Cleary novels, Ernest Hemingway, Angel Heart and so on. Myself, a professed pop culture nut, probably completely missed some 20 or so jokes.

Despite these references, neither the DVD or the show have much actual satirical purpose. Sometimes the humour is quite cruel, and especially in the case of this DVD, not appropriate for younger viewers. Take perhaps

Stewie's apparent murder of a very annoying cell phone user, or a sequence wherein Bugs Bunny gets quite graphically killed by Elmer Fudd.

At the same time, it isn't that mean-spirited of a show. For example, while Stewie is matricidal and bent on World Domination, he's still a baby and every once in a while he'll be shown falling dead asleep right in the middle of some Hitler-esque rant. The writers know when to balance out modern cynicism with a bit of humanist tenderness.

Family Guy is primarily loved by 30 and under types with years and years of television obsession under their belt. Adults generally find it too crass (and, more likely, too fast to keep up with). If you dare, check out a couple of episodes, and then maybe you can graduate to the recent DVD movie.

Tarris is a Salt Spring singer/songwriter who has recently had the pleasure of accompanying Valdy, Bill Henderson, Rodney Gage, Synergy, Jim Simis of Norfolk Connection and Maple Ridge's Tusket on his 1921 Weissenborn-style acoustic lap slide guitar.

Jaime RT is well known locally and across the country for her fiddle playing and the Salt Spring Fiddle Workshop that draws fiddle lovers from all over the globe.

The three performers plan on a true variety show, with some solo, some duets, and "some all out assaults."

Jazz great brings quartet to the stage

An unforgettable evening of jazz with Warner recording artist Mike Allen and his quartet is set for ArtSpring on Friday, September 30.

Saxophone great Allen, described as "one of Canada's top tenor-men" by Jim Little of the Montreal Mirror, will perform with Bruno Hubert on piano, Sean Cronin, bass, and Julian MacDonough on drums.

Well-known for his saxophone virtuosity, Allen's originality and artistic vision set him musically apart from others. The most recent CD under his belt is called *Fearless*.

"Vancouver-based saxophonist Mike Allen is a local treasure," declared Joseph Blake of the Times Colonist in reviewing *Fearless*.

"*Fearless* (Almus Jazz) is the latest recorded evidence

of his soulful genius."

The CD was also chosen one of the Best Pacific Northwest Jazz CDs of 2004 and *Dialectic*, released in 2003, earned his trio an Outstanding Jazz Recording honour at the Western Canadian Music Awards.

Allen, who hails from Montreal but now lives in Vancouver, has been documented in the Miller Companion to Jazz in Canada and has a Master's degree in Jazz from New York University.

He has performed and recorded with artists such as Cedar Walton, Kenny Wheeler, Gary Bartz, Don Friedman and Don Thompson, and is a member of Canadian guitar legend Sonny Greenwich's quintet.

Geezers fly into election race

Even though potential local election candidates have until mid-October to declare their candidacy for a November 19 vote, the Geezers are getting a jump on the political season.

Sid Filkow and Arvid Chalmers are putting on an election-themed comedy night at ArtSpring on Saturday, October 8, at 8 p.m. and putting the Geezers in the Islands Trust race.

"Milt [Bottomley], Maggie and Stumpy are participating in the show, either for or against, and some of them are contemplating running against the Geezers," the comedy pair said last week.

The Geezers will advocate for eliminating car ferries and electricity to make Salt Spring more like Lasqueti Island.

"No more car ferries — that would cut the bottom

out of all these other issues," said Filkow.

Seizing American-owned property in order to help defray the U.S. softwood lumber duty debt to Canada is another potential plank the duo is considering.

One option to building an indoor swimming pool may also be explored.

"It's cheaper to buy people wetsuits and throw them off the Swartz Bay ferry," said Chalmers.

The Geezers invite all authentic candidates to join them in the show, but cannot guarantee it will enhance their chances at the polls.

Audience, reviewer diverge on play

Having spent a week one February in Fort Simpson and Jean Marie River in the Northwest Territories teaching, I understand the world of Graffiti Theatre's latest outing, *The Occupation of Heather Rose*.

A young and naïve nurse, Heather Rose, journeys up to a reservation in Northern Ontario to fulfill her destiny, initiated by her grandmother and mother, who were nurses before her.

Four of playwright Wendy Lill's plays, including *The Occupation of Heather Rose* (1987), were nominated for Governor General's Literary Awards for Drama.

Produced in the ArtSpring multi-purpose room with the stage in the corner made for an intimate playing space, as provided by technician Vaughn Fulford.

As a one-woman show featuring Tangle Caron as Heather Rose and directed by Graffiti artistic director Yvonne Adalian, Heather Rose must tell the story of her evolution from idealistic do-gooder to cynical alco-

holic after a year's time.

The play opens with Heather Rose waiting to talk to her supervisor after she has been fired. We then shift to the beginning of the story in the reservation, at which point the set confused me.

Hanging by different pieces of fishing line at the back of the small stage was a chalkboard and glossy posters distributed through the office of Indian Affairs and Northern Development.

They were gorgeously designed and beautiful in their many colours, however, the nurse's station I saw up north contained anti-smoking, venereal disease prevention and pre-natal check-up posters.

The set should provide the reality of the play, but this one made me focus on the set to figure out why it didn't work, instead of on the play.

We all loved Caron's performance as Helena in Graffiti's production of *A Midsummer's Night Dream* directed by Scott Hylands this past summer.

Her high energy, sense of physical play and hard work at breathing life into Shake-

speare's words made for a totally engaging and charming performance.

Those same qualities don't always work in this play. As a one-woman show, Caron shouldn't have to work so hard. Gestures often read false and shtick was used to change tactics and characters, instead of organic transitions.

In a smaller space, telling a story about a young woman in a claustrophobic situation, the actor needed moments of stillness and vulnerability to make the change to alcoholic believable. All that extraneous stuff belied the honest emotion that she was showing us, instead of really living it.

That sense of "indicating" rather than "being" was actually inherent in the play. Lill writes for Heather Rose, "I was so angry . . ." We don't have to be told that she is angry; we can see that. We have to understand why.

Heather Rose is supposed to be 21. Caron is close to that age, but you almost want someone with more life experience playing the part.

Either that or the director must be diligent in tear-

ing away superficiality to get down to the essence of this young woman's unravelling in a hostile environment.

Her sense of physicality worked brilliantly during a very funny sequence where Heather Rose is working out to her fitness tape, and Caron also made Naomi's death credible while cradling her in her arms.

In two hours, Lill's play reduces a very complicated social and political situation down to four categories, which Heather Rose writes on the chalkboard: Indians, Whites, Culture and Alcohol.

Characters like the lesbian gym teacher, the distant mother — why didn't the mom ask her more relevant questions since she had been a nurse? — and the town bootlegger seemed one-dimensional, so by the end of the play, with the actor stating, "The Occupation of Heather Rose," I was not engaged.

A standing ovation from the sold-out crowd, with shouts of love towards the hometown favourite, indicated that I might have been alone in this estimation.

In Apple Heaven at Isabella Farm

Where else on earth can we find over 350 varieties of organic apples growing in one place? The richness and diversity of Salt Spring Island agriculture is nowhere more apparent than at the annual Salt Spring Apple Festival. This Sunday participants will tour 15 local orchards, and taste from among hundreds of unique apple varieties, including many historical and heritage varieties.

Basil and Margaret Franey's Isabella Farm will again be a favourite stop on the festival tour. The 52 acre property was purchased by the Franey's in 1985, after unrelenting opposition from south-end residents persuaded Sea Ranch to abandon a planned fish farm operation. The original orchard was planted in 1969 by Mark and Jean Holmes. Today, son Ian Franey manages the three acres of orchard, dividing his time between pruning, picking, marketing and delivering apples to his many on and off island customers.

Over 200 apple trees of various sizes, shapes and ages thrive in the perfect southern exposure, producing over 10,000 pounds of fruit per year between twenty different varieties, including Jonagolds, Spartans, Lodi, Mutsu and Tydemans among others. Seventy-five trees from four new scab-free varieties (Jonafree, Red Free, Prima, and Liberty) from Lasquiti Island were planted in 1993. Although the trees are still quite young, they are already producing a bountiful yield.

The farm has been certified organic through IOPA since 1998. Apart from a benign lime/sulfur oil application during dormant season to reduce mold and mildew, organic regulations prohibit use of any synthetic pesticides, or fungicides. Early in the season, Ian arduously removes aphids, caterpillar moths, and scab by hand and undertakes a healthy pruning and thinning to ensure a healthy crop.

Famed sitar player on stage

A man recognized internationally as one of the greatest sitar players of his generation performs at Salt Spring Centre on Monday night.

Irshad's Khan's style is followed and inspired by many formative and professional sitar players and his dedication to the subtleties of the raga is celebrated for bringing out its pure form of feelings and expressions.

"Whether he is performing pure classical, folk or world-beat/new-age, audiences are stunned by his supreme virtuosity and musicality," states a press release from Fat Planet World Music Promotions of Salt Spring. 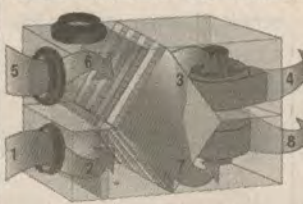

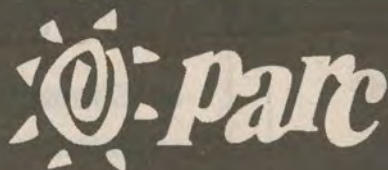

Sampling apple heaven with a foot grounded on island earth is easy at the 7th-Annual Salt Spring Island Apple Festival on Sunday, October 2.

"There are no other places I know in North America where over 350 varieties of apples are grown organically," said event organizer Harry Burton. "That's why we call Salt Spring, 'Apple heaven.'"

The upcoming fruit-lover's event includes a self-guided tour of island orchards and farms, plus a Fulford Hall display of over 220 varieties of local organic apples and an opportunity to taste more than 150 varieties.

"As an additional option, we are selling the collection to the highest bidder at the end of the day. What a great way to have an instant apple party," said Burton.

Fulford Hall will also display apple art paintings by Amarah Gabriel and banners by Susan Paynter, and a visit from Johnny Appleseed (set to attend the Apple Festival at 10:15 a.m.) is promised.

"This is his first appearance anywhere since his death in 1845. It is thought to be the magical power of all those organically grown apples which has drawn him back from the spirit world," Burton said.

Another superhero character named Captain Apple will also be visiting Fulford Hall to spread the message about the benefits of eating organic apples, Burton said.

And Salt Spring's Mary Mollet will attest to the benefits of eating apples without a cape or theme song. Now over 80, she is releasing a second volume of her cookbook called *An Apple A Day*.

After touring displays at the hall, people are recommended to nibble away on a self-guided tour of the 15 or so farms that are also part of the Apple Festival.

These farms each offer a variety of tours, apple tasting, historical facts and various apple products.

The Apple Festival runs from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday, October 2.

Tickets and farm tour maps will be available on the day of the festival at Fulford Hall and the Ganges Info Centre (\$10 adults, \$5 students and children under 12 free).

Proceeds go to the Organic Apple Network of Salt Spring Island to purchase apple-processing equipment.
