



# Sekoya's Passion

*Burgoyne Bay painter thrives in millionaire's paradise*

I'm sitting in the wood-panelled dining area of artist Sekoya Dawn, who is around the corner in the kitchen pouring water for tea. Out the window directly in front of me, sunlight floods the mountains across Sansum Narrows to the west, then disappears under a gauzy white sky.

It's then I notice the gentle rocking of the float-house, the sound of water lapping against the nearby shore.

A moment later this reverie is broken as Dawn slips back into the chair across from me, her flowing hair and intense eyes filling the frame of the window as she tells me how her family came to live in this idyllic spot along the north shore of Burgoyne Bay.

"Back in 2000 when everybody had to move since the bay was becoming a park, we were having little renters meetings and all our neighbours said, 'What are we going to do?' We just kept saying 'We're not leaving, we're staying in Burgoyne Bay. We don't know how, we'll buy a boat, we'll do whatever.'"

One month before the eviction deadline, a friend mentioned that the owner of a two-story float-house he'd been working on for eight years, then docked at Fulford Harbour, might be willing to sell it. He was, and after the 45-year-old artist petitioned her parents for the \$50,000 to buy it, she and her husband Kim had the house towed to a spot off the point where the family had lived for several years.

That first week a violent storm had the couple questioning their sanity.

"It was so wild, one of the windows blew in upstairs," she tells me, her voice quickening. "A 10-foot strip of water was flowing at us off the waves."

For the next two years, storms continued to pummel the float-house. Meanwhile, Dawn had scouted a more protected spot farther west, but the shoreline was owned by a couple from Chicago. After repeated

conversations with the two, she convinced them to let the family move the float-house offshore, where it's now securely anchored with two 2,000-pound weights.

This location, a short row away from the shores of the bay, has been perfect for Dawn's long, solitary walks in the area's forests. Here she wanders for days at a time studying trees, rocks and other elements of the landscape, which she records in digital photographs.

Back at the float-house late at night "when the world is asleep and the air seems clearer of thoughts," or during the day when her husband is at work and her two children at school, she works for up to 250 hours on each image that moves her. Many of these paintings are of trees, her "greatest inspiration." (Her name comes from the sequoia tree.)

Water is another dominant theme. "I love the fluidity of it, yet it's one of my biggest

challenges. I had a list of things I wouldn't paint and that was feet and mouths, then water. Now fire is the only one I haven't done yet."

Dawn grew up in Victoria, then Port Coquitlam. At 15, her family moved east to Winnipeg, where she felt ungrounded in the suburbs, longing for the lushness of the forests. After Grade 12, she entered a commercial art course at a local community college, but this was ill-suited to her creative inclinations.

She fled back to Victoria, then a chance meeting led her to a caretaking position on a 160-acre property in East Sooke, where she stayed for 10 years, building a small house on the beach and teaching herself to paint, first in oils, then acrylics.

Desiring a style of her own, she decided not to study the work of other artists. Then a line in a book on art by painter Maxfield Parrish led her at age 23 to the technique she

uses to this day.

"He said something about over painting in layers and all of a sudden I'm thinking, 'Layers, oh my God, I'll just start painting as far back as I can see and work my way up — do the sky, the trees, then whatever comes to me.'"

The painting that emerged nine months later, that of a tree enfolded in hands of light, set her on a course she's passionately embraced for the last 22 years: the blending of realistic nature painting with elements of fantasy.

"I'm a big believer in the spirit realm, things behind things . . . that little bit of magic, getting the faces hidden in the rocks and that kind of thing."

This fascination with what is beneath the surface led her to paint the reflection of a puddle on the road to her house, a piece purchased by a couple visiting Salt Spring in 1999. They also commissioned her to paint 11 more reflections and paid for transparencies of the work as well as a series of cards.

Two original reflection paintings, portraits of her son, Injah, 14, and Farrell, 10, hang on the wall over the table where we're sitting. Both show the children looking out a window. Overlaid across their faces are silhouetted tree boughs. The effect is startling, for the children seem blended into the natural environment, yet a part of the magical world their mother has created.

Despite Dawn's deepening skill, her challenge has been to blend her artistic vision with sustainable financial rewards. For many years she's been selling her work at the Saturday market in Ganges. She's also had shows at Moby's, Barb's Buns and, for the last two years, ArtSpring. Her goal now is to find a local gallery to take her paintings, as well as an agent to sell pieces in cities such as Toronto and New York. While working towards this, Dawn remains committed to her mission of helping others feel the deep rhythms of Burgoyne Bay's unspoiled shores and forests.

"I may not have the money of a millionaire's career," she says, smiling, "but I'm looked after in as far as I'm in a millionaire's paradise."

# Songbird Allison Crowe delivers tidings to SPCA and islanders

On Friday, December 1, Canadian vocalist/pianist Allison Crowe completes her annual migration and alights at ArtSpring theatre with a collection of songs for the season and all time.

The internationally acclaimed songbird launches her Tidings concert series as a fundraiser for the Salt Spring SPCA. (Special concert packs of tickets and CDs will be up for bid at the SPCA auction at Meaden Hall on Saturday, November 25.)

"Treat yourself to one of the mightiest talents on the singer-songwriter scene today," says Bob Muller, long-time administrator of cover songs on the official Joni Mitchell Discussion List (JMDL). Crowe's just-hatched album, *This Little Bird*, contains her take on

Joni's *A Case of You*.

Muller, in reviewing

Crowe's new album, says: "Allison really comes into her own on this CD — her wonderful songs, supported by her emotive vocals, strong and confident, navigates them with feeling and strength. I mean, it takes a lot of self-confidence to tackle Aretha's version of *I Never Loved a Man*, but Allison does and nails it just as good as the Queen of Soul herself. Her piano playing is equally exquisite."

Special guest artist for this Tidings benefit concert is Salt Spring's own globe-trotting musician and photographer, Billie Woods. Woods has just returned home after touring England, Ireland and Scotland with Allison Crowe.

At ArtSpring, the evening's concert repertoire

will bring together some traditional Christmas carols and holiday favourites with an equal measure of Allison Crowe's uniquely original blend of rock, jazz, folk, gospel and soul. It's a passionate and joyous sound that one music critic describes as "Elton John meets Edith Piaf."

Crowe's band on the bill features a pair of top-flight rhythm-makers also heard on her *This Little Bird* album: Dave Baird on acoustic and electric bass, and percussionist Laurent Boucher, renowned for his playing with Salt Spring's Sunyata and other combos.

## Nice guy Frye shares musical passions in CD release concert

Chris Frye is the kind of guy we'd all love to have as a neighbour.

From his friendly manner at his Friday night ArtSpring concert, and the upbeat songs he's written over the years, it seems certain he would jump-start your dead car battery in a snowstorm, dole out cuttings from his prize hydrangeas and send wisps of sweet music over the fence on summer days, all delivered with a cherubic smile to boot.

He's already immortalized his real-life neighbours in Esquimalt with a bluesy song called *The Ascension of Dunsmuir Road*, one of 13 cuts on his freshly released CD called *Raised on Rhythm & Rhyme*. Frye hauled to ArtSpring some of the "analog ghosts" contributing to the album and gave us a luscious taste of what it's all about.

Frye pointed out how his

community is known for its criminal elements, but his own Esquimalt earns poetic tributes.

"You've got the injured and the able/All around the kitchen table/Arms to help and hold/The young the tired and the old/The good water tumbles to the bay/its path cannot be slowed/It's the Ascension of Dunsmuir Road."

As lead singer and songwriter for The Bills (formerly the Bill Hilly Band), Frye has crafted some memorable songs with historical and cultural significance to our region. There's the story of Victoria architect Francis Rattenbury, the city's "old blue bridge" and Bamfield fisherman John Vanden, for example.

At the November 17 concert he continued that trend, singing the praises of rare ecosystems in *Under the Garry Oak Meadow*, the Takata Japanese gardens in Esquimalt and with a vastly different interpretation of the John Vanden song. I prefer its a cappella Bills version — but Frye's new take demonstrated his musical versatility. That trait also came through as he used his all-powerful voice to the max in *Holler*. He pretty much blows the roof off when singing the word "holler" and drifts to near-tears uttering, "It makes me want to cry."

He's also part of the gypsy

jazz Marc Atkinson Trio, but his *Rhythm and Rhyme* sound veers more towards a "mainstream" roots-rock sound.

Friday's ArtSpring crowd was on the small side, but vociferous applause and a standing ovation showed clearly they appreciated Frye's songs, warm rapport and the evening of impressive musicianship, including some Duke Ellington jazz.

It was only the second time these musicians had played the material live — and violinist Richard Moody was even just called in to replace his ailing Bills cohort Adrian Dolan — so things might have been tighter musically if this had been their 17th concert.

But as individual musicians it's hard to get more top drawer than vocalist Mae Moore, her partner Lester Quitau, trumpet and flugelhorn player Alfons Fear, Brooke Maxwell on tenor sax, Joey Smith on electric and stand-up bass, and CD co-producer Joby Baker on drums. Frye's CD includes an even larger troupe of "analog ghosts," musicians contributing on one or a handful of cuts as the album came together. And since he's such a nice guy, who wouldn't want to play with him?

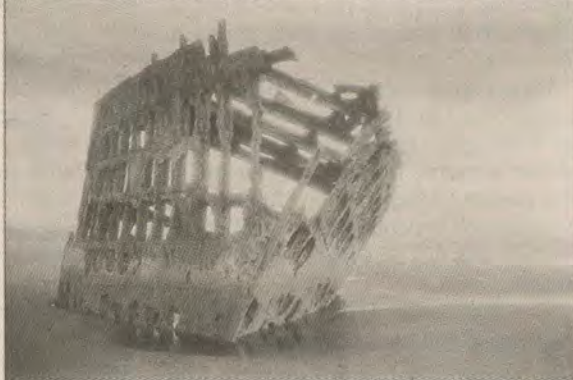

## Haida history topic of inspiring documentary

An award-winning documentary and film festival favourite is on the bill for the November 30 Film Festival Café at Barb's Buns.

Hosted by the Our Island, Our World film festival group, The Stolen Spirits of Haida Gwaii will be shown at 7 p.m., with the evening beginning at 5:30 for those who wish to enjoy good food, drinks and conversation with friends.

"The inspiring and powerful documentary tells how the present-day Haida from the Queen Charlotte

Islands pulled together in their community to repatriate the bones of their ancestors that had gone missing over 100 years ago," explains a film festival press release.

"It's the story of taking a very dark and difficult chapter of Haida history and making it right."

In the late 1800s and early 1900s, a man named Dorsie travelled to the Queen Charlotte Islands and excavated the burial grounds of various villages and took the remains of 150 Haida


back to the Field Museum in Chicago for anthropological study.

"The Haida took the initiative and approached the Field Museum in Chicago and for the first time ever, these two groups worked together on this significant repatriation project – indeed, a very sensitive can of worms has now been opened, which will likely have ramifications for several international museums today."


Special guest Christine Hunt, from the Kwakiutl band in Alert Bay, will be at the film for questions and discussion following the film.



## Emerging wood furniture genre at Salt Spring Woodworks show

Salt Spring Woodworks presents a must-see curated show of fine and studio furniture featuring a "hot new generation" of artisans.

The show of the best wood furniture makers in B.C. runs at the Out Of Hand Craft Fair in Victoria from Thurs-

day-Sunday, November 23 to 26.

This is the first time that the show has been curated and hosted by Salt Spring Woodworks, said Celia Duthie, owner of the local gallery.

"We exhibited three years ago when we first launched our bookcases and this

year the organizer asked if I would actually curate a show," she said.

"They wanted a display of only fine furniture — studio and art furniture — which is an emerging genre that is really exciting."

"Furniture making has finally moved from 'knock offs' to wildly imaginative designs and original work. This is a very exciting time for the industry."

Salt Spring Woodworks represents about 50 artists and will be taking the best of their collection to the show.

The local gallery is one of the few outlets for these artists to show and sell their work and they're now "coming out of the woodwork" in great numbers.

"We are like the bookstore for great woodworkers," she said.

"I used to promote local talent in the book world and now I'm doing it for woodworkers."

Salt Spring furniture makers will include Illyd Perkins, with bookcases and music stands, Jesse Fisher with his unique chairs and the cabinet suites of David Greig. In addition, works by Kurt Frost and Antonio Alonso will be displayed.

Talent from Vancouver

Island includes Darren Bertuccio, Michael Moore, Sandra Carr and Joseph Gelinas.

"We are also hoping to include some paintings by Diana Dean and Stephanie Denz, who also display works at our gallery," added Duthie.

In addition to talent from Salt Spring and Vancouver Island, young Vancouver designers will be well represented.

"The show will feature Peter Pierobon's fine art table 'Rip Tide'; Judd Beaumont, the Andy Warhol of furniture making, with his 'Bad Table'; Brent Comber's striking solid wood shapes, and Enrico Konig's suite of dyed bentwood tiger maple tables, all examples of the dynamism and versatility of these young furniture makers," noted the press release.

The Victoria Conference Centre is located behind the Empress Hotel at 720 Douglas Street.

# Show features confessions from recesses of Stewart Katz's mind

In another time dimension before I lived on Salt Spring, I took a theatre intensive with Nancy Drake, a well-respected Winnipeg-based stage actress.

"Who do you play when you are acting?" she asked.

Pause.

"You play yourself," she said, answering her own question.

Now even if I was not acquainted with Stewart Katz, I would have to say he is too talented (in Graffiti Theatre's Seven Stories on the ArtSpring stage, for example, he was superb) to not have drawn on at least a side of his own personality while performing at Barb's Bakery & Bistro last Saturday.

In Confessions of a New Age Neurotic, Katz, in curly wig and horn-rimmed glasses, began his one-man show coming across as quite the odd-ball, but an odd-ball that many of us in the audience probably recognized in ourselves and/or in those around us.

He talked about being "filled with light" and how all of us, "even Americans who eat three meals a day at KFC, are light."

He quipped about buying all the New Age books, but opted to display them instead of reading them.

They were for holding in his hands, he said, to absorb their energy.

Playing on words and ideas, Katz twisted "we are all whole" into "what an asshole." From there, the intelligent humour of this comedian unfolded with a liberal peppering of the salty language that is part of the

stand-up's domain.

Somewhere during the hour-long monologue, which was delivered in a well-attended restaurant setting (Katz is clearly developing a following), I realized that what he was doing was revealing how his mind works. This kind of vulnerability is what must make stand-up comedy one of the most difficult art forms.

Building to an ever more angry rant as the evening continued, Katz itemized everything his character did to be "healed."

He had his "aura cleaned and pressed." A New Age nutritionist told him to "get off sugar" so he got himself "a cake patch," which helped

him absorb "tiny doses of cake" throughout the day.

"I am what I eat, you are what you excrete," Katz waxed poetically and bawdily, referring to a "deja poo."

By mid-act, he had spun off in a Neil Young-style rendition of a Mad Cow ballad:

"I am a cow  
I don't know how  
Those human beings  
Thought to serve me sow"

Then, appealing to the local crowd, Katz poked fun at the last restaurant that occupied the Barb's space. Called "The Glass Onion," he said other likely names could be "Ceramic Garlic" or "Porcelain Leek."

Later, he took a jab at the psychotherapist's 50-minute

hour. He said he told her that he would have to pay her with the "80-cent dollar."

Speaking of therapists, there is a common acknowledgement among those in this field that anger is beneficial if it moves us into taking positive action.

Like maybe writing and performing a one-man show propelled by an angst-driven character.

Next time you stroll into Island Savings, look for the mild-mannered teller in the tie and dress shirt. He just could be related to a "New Age Neurotic."

Better yet: make sure to check out Katz's next show, whenever and wherever that may be.

six levels.

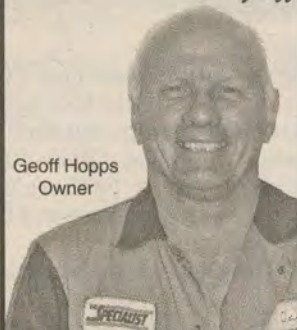
The five flat classes, judged by Joy Longley, included lead line and assisted walk trot for newer riders.

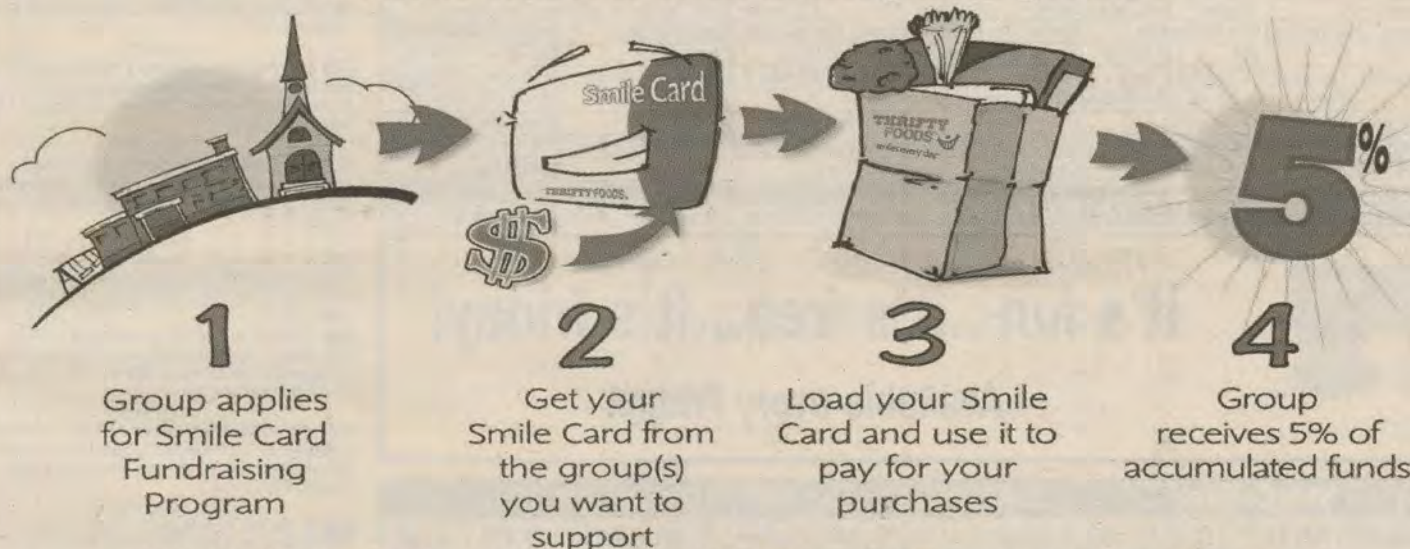

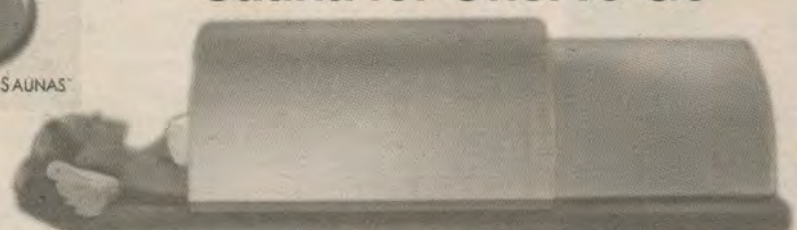

The Pool Design Task Force was struck after PARC found itself receiving offers of artistic time and materials, yet without a plan for how they could be applied.

Task force terms of reference determined that visual features:

- should be in good taste as determined by a general consensus of public opinion.

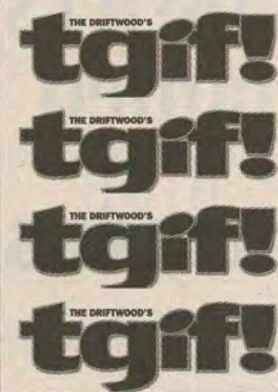
- fit the space available with reasonable attention to proportion.
