When an emergency strikes, the last thing
you want to do is fiddle through a drawer
full of dead batteries or search high and
low for a Band-Aid.

When things take a turn for the worse, an
emergency kit, at the very least, gives you the
confidence to sit things out in relative comfort
until help arrives. At other times, being prepared
can mean the difference between life and death.

"When a disaster happens, you are going to be

miserable if you don't have a kit," said Marguerite
Lee, the volunteer coordinator for Salt Spring's
Emergency Social Services program.

Lee has not one but two emergency kits at her
disposal. The first is a "grab-and-go bag" she leaves
in her car. The small backpack contains everything
she needs if she were forced to leave her home in
the event of a natural disaster.

A change of clothes, toiletries, important
medications, water, some non-perishable
nutritious foods (energy bars and nuts work well)
and a flashlight should be in everybody's bag.

Keeping items in labelled Ziploc bags helps locate and identify what you need when times get tough. Regular inspection to ensure materials are still usable is also recommended.

In her home, Lee keeps a larger kit equipped with all the essentials needed to wait out a disaster until help arrives.

A comprehensive list of items that should be in everybody's home kit is provided in the accompanying table and on page 80 of the 2008-09 Salt Spring Lions Club Directory.

In addition to the standard classics such as a first aid kit, clothing and flashlight, items range from pet food, spare eye glasses, a cordless radio, important documents and emergency flares.

To ensure everything stays dry and can be moved around easily, the items can be stored in a large Rubbermaid-type container or a large dry sack, similar to the ones kayakers use to keep their gear dry when out on the water.

According to information provided on the Health Canada website, people stranded by a natural disaster should be prepared to support themselves for 72 hours before help arrives.

"All levels of government in Canada have emergency response plans in place, but it may take several days for first responders to reach you," reads information on the website. "It is impossible to predict everything that might happen during an emergency, but you can minimize the potential impact on your family by preparing ahead."

Salt Spring Search and Rescue's Chuck Hamilton said he believes there are two groups of people in an emergency, those who can help themselves and those who

need help. The more people with emergency plans and equipment in place frees up more emergency resources for those who need them.

"If you can stay warm and dry, you are way ahead of the curve," Hamilton said. "You become part of your own solution instead of somebody else's problem."

Hamilton said it's important to go through one's emergency kit every six months to select contents for the specific time of year, since the types on potential emergencies vary depending on the season.

Going over your family's emergency plan and supplies on occasion also helps keep people alert to potential dangers posed by wildfires or winter storms.

Hamilton chalks up people's reluctance to get prepared to apathy. When times are good, getting an emergency kit together is often the last thing on people's minds. By the time an emergency strikes, it's too late.

"You're playing the odds," he said. "We are not a bedroom community. One of the downsides of that is that we are on our own. Nobody is coming over on a rowboat with a cup of hot tea."

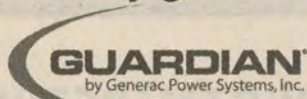

Booster seats uplifting for car safety statistics

New regulations in effect since July 1

Changes to child safety regulations announced by B.C.'s Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General took effect on July 1, making booster seats mandatory for all children until they reach age nine or 1.45 metres (4'9") in height.

While some parents feel the government is being overly cautious or that the car seat industry is to blame, representatives say the legislation should prevent many child injuries and deaths.

Previous car seat regulations in B.C. affected children out of infancy who were 20-40 kilograms in weight; the booster seat is an additional step in ensuring seat belts fit children properly in order to work.

Statistics provided by the ministry say booster seats "reduce the risk of fatality by 71 per cent and the risk of serious injury by 67 per cent."

Sgt. Danny Willis, the Salt Spring RCMP detachment commander, said that although the legislation hasn't yet had much impact locally, the new laws are timely and a further

step in the direction of improving vehicle safety.

"Obviously anything that ensures more public safety is something we're in favour of," Willis said.

Salt Spring officers may have more interaction with the booster seat law with the visit of the South Island Traffic Unit later this year; the local division only has enough staff to do vehicle inspections with the extra presence.

Willis does not foresee many problems with enforcing the legislation, however, even with off-island visitors coming from other provinces or states where booster seats are not yet mandatory.

"Part of the process is to educate people. When we stop people we discuss the issues, help them understand the point of the legislation. We might give them a warning but we won't be laying charges."

Several areas in North America already have booster seat laws in place.

B.C.'s regulations will come into line with those practiced in Ontario, Québec, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and numerous U.S. states.

The good news for parents is that because of these existing laws, many new car seats are convertible into booster seats by changing the seatbelt arrange-

ment, meaning no additional expense.

Parents who are concerned about the requirements and if their existing car seats meet them can contact the Salt Spring Fire Department, which provides a free inspection service.

Travis Guedes initiated the program two years ago, checking car seats to see if models meet current safety standards and that they are installed correctly.

"Accidents happen, but we want to be as safe as possible, and we don't want to see anything happen that could have been pre-

vented," Guedes said.

"The idea behind the new law is to position the seatbelt — which was designed for an adult — correctly on the hips and collar bone. Without a booster seat, car accidents can lead to spinal injuries and internal injuries."

More than 40 families have used the service over the past two years, receiving certificates stating their seats are properly installed.

Guedes said there have not been many calls so far about booster seats, but he hopes with the new legislation he'll be getting them soon.

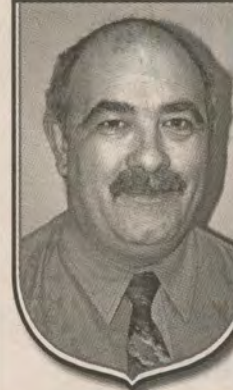

THEATRE REVIEW

Shirley Valentine show: effusive praise

Grace Jordan play runs again this weekend

If they gave out medals for bravery on a stage, the one-person play would surely get the Purple Heart.

You're up there on stage alone, few props, very little music. It's just you and the audience. If you screw up, there is nowhere to hide. If you fail to be completely captivating you will feel it in the stifled yawns and the shuffling of the feet of disenchanted audience members who are seated only a few metres away. That's insane pressure. Grace Jordan deserves a Purple Heart for her performance in "Shirley Valentine."

Shirley Valentine is one of those "coming of age" (or in this case, coming of middle age) stories that springs forth every generation. The female version usually features a downtrodden woman freeing herself from a taciturn, controlling male, or a male-dominated society. This incarnation playing at ArtSpring was originally a London stage production brought to the silver screen in 1989. Actress Pauline Collins garnered an Academy Award for her performance in the movie version.

The plot line in a nutshell goes something like this: 42-year-old lower middle class English woman is married to a gruff, sullen pit miner. She

has quietly raised her children, worked and looked after her husband hand and foot for 20 years. A girlfriend offers her a two-week vacation in Greece. The opportunity rekindles the adventurous, vibrant woman she was before the drudgery of everyday life beat the soul out of her. She must decide on either the road to Greece or the road to the local fish and chip shop for the rest of her days.

Seems like an easy choice. In these times where it is de rigueur to have three career paths over a lifetime, and just as many partners, a trip to Greece with a girlfriend comes as easy as a trip to Victoria to shop at Costco. In the '80s, when Shirley Valentine first hit the stage, things were different. No cell phones, no Oprah, no Facebook to bleed on. Isolated and alone, Shirley turns to the wall for conversation.

Oftentimes these bygone generation stories have trouble holding up. Witness the current Get Smart debacle just released in theatres. Tellingly, Shirley Valentine holds up very nicely. Judging by the number of "domestic dispute" incidents in court, we still have our fair share of "domestic blitz" out there. And if truth be told, I think we have more Shirley Valentines per square mile ("fok the metric system," as Shirley might say) than anywhere else on the planet. To our credit.

So here we are nearly 20 years later in the friendly confines of ArtSpring wit-

nessing our own Grace Jordan reprise the role of Shirley Valentine. And she does it with verve and panache, and an astonishing comfort level, taking the audience through a two-hour roller coaster of emotions from heart-wrenching childhood stories to bawdy tales on the Aegean with Costas, the Greek taverna owner.

Three cheers to the actor for bringing in this light-hearted summer alternative to the usual Twelfth Night, Merchant of Venice fare. And a bouquet of farmer's market roses to Grace Jordan.

Lest my praise be too effusive, I'll point out a few little quibbles. During a number of the more tense moments, random burps and wheezes emanating from a backstage air conditioning plant tended to burst the dramatic bubble. I would recommend a seat in the centre, close to the stage. Also, some of the stage lighting was directed toward the audience. I was in one of the unfortunate seats where the glare in my eyes was so bad that by the end of the second act I was ready to confess to anything. Little annoyances to be sure, easily remedied by a little tweaking by the stage hands.

Salt Springers still have an opportunity to see the play this Friday-Saturday, Aug. 15-16 — and to enjoy some Salt Spring Vineyards wine with it — before Ms. Jordan takes Shirley Valentine on the road. I recommend you seize the opportunity.

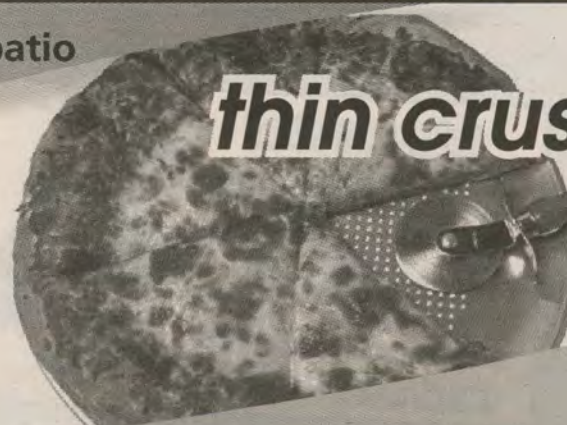

Simple, confident approach comes through in Morley Myers' artwork

New sculptures on display at Morley Myers' studio at Merchant Mews reveal the constant progression of an artist pushing deeper into his work.

Applying a direct, confident approach to his sculptures, Myers is currently exploring different emotions and meanings caused by the interplay of texture and light.

Emerging is a good example of just how simple Myers can go with form and yet have volumes to say. A form suggestive of a head and shoulders askew is made with the smooth planes of an angular pedestal, topped with a rough surfaced, boulder-like cap.

In bronze finished with a black patina, Myers has rubbed off the black on the rough areas to allow a textured bronze to dully shine through. In this piece, Myers says, posture and gesture are created and change depending on the stance of the viewer; the solid object becomes fluid in its interpretation.

"It's probably the simplest thing I've done and probably the best thing that I've done," said Myers.

The interplay between

light and shadow is given more attention in Linear Thinking. This female form is engraved from the face down to thighs with deep parallel lines, alternating palest and dark grey in the chlorite stone. As Myers notes, this decoration makes the figure look almost psychedelic, and is also reminiscent of a wood block print in 3-D.

Located on the back side of Linear Thinking is another face and torso, with the head lying sideways across the body. In pieces like this, Myers said the shape of the raw material can influence his design.

"As I'm working the stone, it does reveal itself . . . I see the figure there and I can't help but go there."

Nurturer's Dilemma is part of the Nurturers Series that Myers has been working on throughout his career. He remarked that there is always a danger of a nurturer giving out much more than is received, and that his pieces reflect a struggle to find the balance between both.

Nurturer's Dilemma addresses this question through the situation of the female form, which is twisted and angled, one breast turned inward.

"Aspects of the original stone are incorporated into the narrative of the sculpture," Myers said. "There is a lot going on with different textures, posture, planes."

Also currently on exhibit at Myers' studio are photographs by Kevin Steinke. Like Myers, Steinke is experimenting with his medium to address deeper philosophical questions.

Steinke's photographs are premised on exploring the contradiction between what

the eye sees and the brain knows. His Claire de Lune series, for example, appears to be of landscapes taken during a sunny day; however, they were actually shot by the light of the full moon, with 15-minute exposures. The result is an "ethereal" look, where the images have a slightly out-of-focus feeling, or as if they are from a similar but in fact different plane of existence.

Steinke's Shipwreck Coast series is more in keeping with his familiar work, in two black and white triptychs of waves breaking on the rocks. The images are dynamic, with the feeling of the water rushing in towards the viewer in the foreground. Foaming water, contrasted with seaweed encrusted rocks and misty horizon, implies texture and movement.

A recent collaboration between Myers and Steinke is a catalogue of the sculptor's work, which is being reprinted after the first run vanished into collectors' hands. Another book project will involve Steinke's photographs and his critical writing on Myers' work, placing it in context with contemporary and historical art movements.

Work by Myers and Steinke can be found Monday to Saturday at the Morley Myers Studio in Merchant Mews.

Furies to whip up Moby's Pub

Punk hits the rock at Saturday show

The world of punk rock music never ceases to amaze.

When he's not practising the chords that once set the stage for the great Vancouver punk revolution of the late 1970s, the Furies' frontman Chris Arnett can be found researching his upcoming book on Salt Spring's early French settlers or volunteering at the Salt Spring Archives.

Surprised? You shouldn't be.

Not only is this punk music, it's punk music on Salt Spring.

"Punk started out as a rejection of the indulgent rock music of the day," Arnett said, ahead of the band's Saturday night show at Moby's Pub.

"It's a revival of the real rock and roll. We're not dead yet."

The Furies are often hailed by those in the know as Vancouver's first punk band, kicking off a tradition that included D.O.A., the K-Tels, the Pointed Sticks and Subhumans.

As more fans became disillusioned with the overly stylized sounds produced by Vancouver rock bands like Trooper and Loverboy, the punk army's ranks swelled.

High-energy performances, fuelled with overt political messages regarding the war in Vietnam, racism and

political corruption ensured fans got equal parts information and entertainment — or at least as close to it as is possible in a beer-soaked nightclub.

The Furies, including John Werner on bass and Taylor Little on drums, will play songs from their recently released self-titled album and classics from the band's early days.

Arnett said he is confident the band will attract a wide range of music fans.

"I don't think a punk act has ever played this island," he said. "Our shows can be pretty incendiary."

The Saturday, Aug. 16 show is expected to start between 9 and 10 p.m.

Cover charge is \$5.

Annual potters guild window show full of surprises

Tea bags dropped in final three days

The annual event that sees Mark's Work Wearhouse in Ganges empty its window of outer wear and fill it with ceramic art pieces has brought in just as many fresh looks as next season's fashion.

Members of Salt Spring's Pottery Guild have filled the display with objects both traditional and unusual, giving us a taste of what's

new from the artists' kilns.

Judy Weeden always wows with her marriage of functionality and design; this time around showing she's willing to take some risks with two pieces in the unusual lilac glaze she's recently been working with. For A Slim Lady stretches the idea of teapot to its limit — imagine a square, modernist tube which twists and turns in a fantastical shape, topped by a tiny spigot and handle.

High Tea also uses the lilac glaze, but resembles an art deco bird, with a narrow crested head on delicate neck, and flattened, stylized wings.

Kathleen Horsdal's sculpture, Virgin, is a nude woman in terra cotta wearing a bikini of unused tea bags. Her eyes are somewhat disturbing, having been hollowed out to add depth. Horsdal has promised the tea bags will come off today (Wednesday) at 1 p.m.

Two decorative plaques by Florence Roberge use imagery from Alice in Wonderland. Her portraits of the Mad Hatter and the white rabbit are in dark brown clay, with the relief detail highlighted in white slip. The figures are cartoonish but vaguely menacing, as the

dream world tends to be.

Alexandra Hasenfratz had some pieces that go outside the norm on display, with very vivid glazes in egg yolk orange and bright aqua. A pyramid shaped teapot combines these shades with cedar bough spatters.

Hasenfratz's Lily tea set, with teapot and two cups shaped like calla lilies, is perhaps a better example of her craftsmanship. Here the yolk orange replicates the lily's stamen, and coats the inside of the teacups as well as the spigot of the pot.

Pat Webber showed two tea sets

combining traditional style with whimsical flair. Green Tea, in leaf green stoneware, has a playful frog climbing up the teapot and the creamer, while the sugar dish has an upright frog cradling a bird in its arms. Her Golden Labrador set is done in a burnished orangey-brown, with a dog's head just on the teapot lid. This makes the motif pleasing rather than gimmicky.

In the more traditional realm, both Meg Buckley and Merle Box showed several pleasing sets of the sort you want to have tea in, just so you can hold them in your hands.

CPR skills invaluable to learn

Knowing what to do in the event of a heart attack or cardiac arrest, and having the skills to perform CPR, can greatly increase the chance of saving a life. The BC Ambulance Service attends approximately 3,000 cardiac arrest calls each year and provides the following advice.

BC AMBULANCE SERVICE ADVICE

- **LEARN CPR** — It's important to learn CPR or take a refresher course in order to be equipped with the skills to save a life. With most cardiac arrests occurring in the home, it could be a friend or family member that needs your help.
- **EARLY WARNING SIGNS** — Common warning signs of a heart attack include: mild or severe pain in the chest which may spread to the neck, jaw, shoulders, arms and back; shortness of breath; paleness, sweating or weakness; nausea, vomiting, and/or indigestion; fear, anxiety and denial. Symptoms vary from person to person.
- **CALL 911** — If you suspect someone is having a heart attack, call 911. Early dispatch of paramedics and trained first responders will increase the patient's chance of survival.
- **BEPREPARED** — Be prepared to answer questions from the BC Ambulance Service dispatcher about your location (city, street, building number) and the patient's condition (conscious/unconscious, breathing/not breathing).

- **STAY ON THE LINE** — It is important not to hang up as BC Ambulance Service dispatchers are experienced "question askers" and their questions are based on a need to provide accurate and specific information to the attending emergency responders. BC Ambulance Service dispatchers can also provide CPR instruction over the phone.
- **START CPR** — If the patient is not breathing and has no pulse, CPR must be started immediately. CPR provides oxygenated blood through the vital organs including the brain and heart. A cardiac arrest victim is four times more likely to survive if they receive bystander CPR. You do not have to be a doctor, nurse or paramedic to save a life. Knowing how to perform CPR will give you the skills to help someone in cardiac arrest survive until paramedics or first responders arrive. Just knowing what to do in an emergency until paramedics arrive goes a long way in helping a person survive. For every minute that passes without help, a person's chance of surviving a cardiac arrest drops by about 10 per cent.

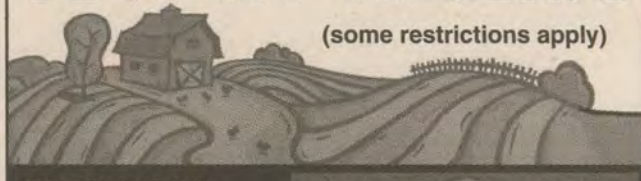



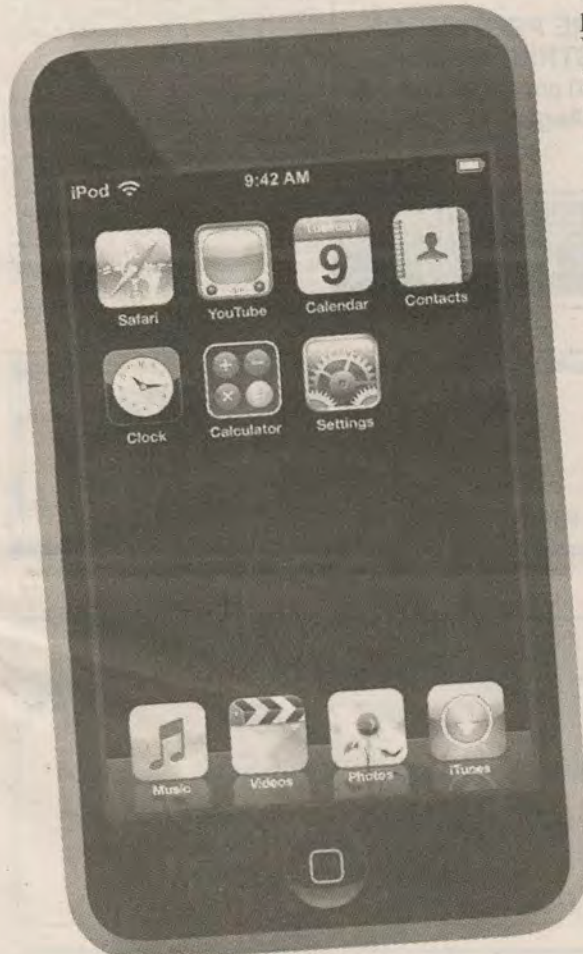

The world in your pocket

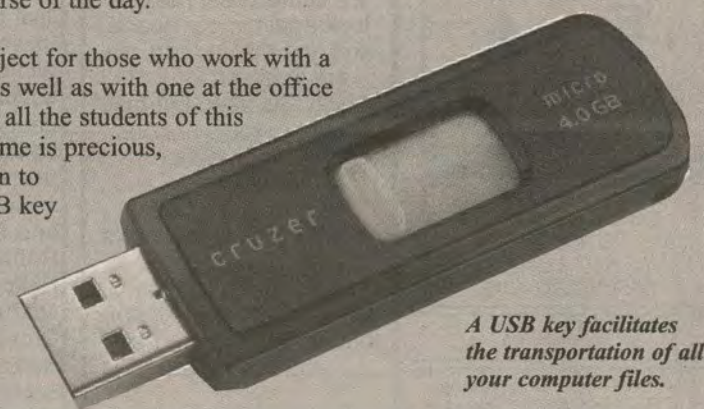

The USB key to success!

Pink 'papayachtzzi' visits

Marine
photographer
gives insight into
profession

Aboard her Pepto-Bismol-pink SeaSnaps vessel, renowned marine photographer Maria Steernberg fixes herself some tea. Valentina the terrier, her first mate, sits on a bed in the cockpit and watches from behind a pair of tiny, pink plastic sunglasses.

It is a Friday afternoon in July at the Kanaka Wharf and due to an overcast sky, Steernberg takes a break from photographing Salt Spring's vessels, boats and kayaks.

Custom-built to suit her small frame and with a roof chair that doubles as a monopod for her camera, her vessel is as specialized as her profession.

"You need to be a good boater and understand both power and sail," she explains.

Well-versed in marine terminology, the middle-aged woman with curly hair tamed into tight French braids is clearly a woman who has mastered the sea.

During her 23 years chasing boats, often on her own, she has photographed pleasure crafts, oil spills, regattas and boat fires around the world. Her photos have been printed in close to 1,000 publications and have made covers of magazines like Boat Journal and Pacific Yachting. She was one of a few photographers chosen from around the world to work at the 2007 America's Cup sailboat race in Valen-

cia, Spain.

When asked what it takes to succeed as a marine photographer, she says, "You have to be a sharp-shooter — fast and quick."

Steadiness on a boat and determination to get the shot are also key, she says. She often climbs into the chair on her vessel's roof to take bird's-eye-view shots and has been known to climb up onto sail masts with her camera during regattas.

While her work has given her much joy and acclaim, it has also brought her chillingly close to danger.

As the sole passenger in a May 2004 plane crash that hit shallow water in Preedy Harbour, Steernberg was taken to Chemainus Hospital in critical condition. She survived without long-term injury, but the pilot, Gene Bellavance who was flying her over the Ladysmith Regatta so she could take photographs, did not survive.

Still affected by the tragedy, it is difficult for her to speak about it.

But Salt Spring remains her "favourite island on the planet" and one she frequents because it is a prime location for photogenic vessels.

During this visit to Salt Spring, she spotted two boats she had previously photographed for popular marine magazine covers.

She was also quick to take shots of a Trincomali Channel boat fire while in the area, one of which was published in the July 30 Driftwood.

To supplement her work for professional clients, Steernberg has sold thousands of photos through her SeaSnaps.com operation that caters to pleasure craft

owners and recreational boaters.

"They call me the 'Papayachtzzi,'" she says, noting that her boat is painted bright pink because she wants people to know she is coming.

She photographs boaters while on the water, they see the www.seasnaps.com written on her vessel, they contact her and she sends them the proofs. People will often radio her as she is approaching and request she take photos.

Most people rarely have photos of themselves out on the water and will buy copies from her most of the time, she says.

Though she is based at a Granville Island studio in Vancouver, she estimates she spends 1,000 hours per year on the water.

"I've gone through three paint jobs and six sets of engines," she says about the SeaSnaps vessel, a 22-foot Stokraft that has been whizzing her around North America's west coast for over 21 years.

On the Kanaka Wharf that Friday, every person who walked by knew her by name. Many, like Bill and Betty McNutt, were former clients who have SeaSnaps photos stowed away in their photo albums at home.

"I've had a good kick at the can," Steernberg admits, "But you do sacrifice a lot to do this. My personal life is as boring as it comes."

Valentina helps keep her company during her days on the water and is her inspiration for her current project — a photo series of marine vessel pets.

"You love this, don't you," Steernberg says to Valentina as she adjusts her companion's pink sunglasses.
